Boaters in Wisconsin have long had to cut back on speed near docks, rafts, piers and restricted areas. Did you also know that the slow, no-wake rule also applies to the full lake shoreline on all lakes in the state?

The law prohibits boaters from operating their boats faster than slow, no-wake anywhere within 100 feet of shore.

Slow, no-wake means operating a boat at low speed but still able to maintain steering of the craft.

Lake areas of flowages, which are wide parts of rivers such as Lake Wisconsin, also are covered under the new rule.

The law makes it safer for people wading, swimming or fishing near shore and it should help reduce conflicts between near-shore recreationists and boaters.

The rule will also aid in erosion control, since boats operating in shallow waters near shore can churn sediments and chop vegetation, possibly spreading invasive species such as the Eurasian water milfoil.

With the high water we've been experiencing on all of our area lakes, it's especially important that boaters follow the No Wake law. Several area lakes have temporarily posted their lakes as No Wake lakes. If your lake is experiencing problems with wave erosion, you may want your lake association to consider temporarily classifying your smaller lake as a No Wake Zone Lake.

Another alternative is to mark areas that are prone to erosion with NO WAKE ZONE buoys and floats. If you are experiencing these problems, contact the Forest County Sheriff's Department's Recreation Officer or the DNR

# Sixty cases of Covid-19 confirmed in Forest County

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed an additional person has been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) for a total of 60 cases in Forest County. The individual is isolating at home. No further information will be released to protect the confidentiality of the individual. County health officials and local partners are contacting others with whom the individual who tested positive had close contact with. As of today, Forest County has 1,630 negative test results and 7 pending. There are currently 4 active cases, 52 released from isolation, and 4 deaths.

The Forest County Health Department encourages community members to minimize their contact with others by staying home when possible, practice physical distancing and good personal hygiene, wear a mask or cloth face covering, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are experiencing any symptoms or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please contact your health care provider and ask to be tested.

In an effort to keep our community members up to date on COVID-19, the Forest County Health Department will continue to update our Facebook page daily and local newspapers weekly with current COVID-19 case counts. This will include the number of negative and positive cases in Forest County. Please call our office at 715-478-3371 with any questions or concerns.

## Crandon School Board discuss reopening this fall

The Crandon School Board met for their regularly monthly meeting on Monday, August 10 in the high school auditorium.

There were two citizen comments. One comment was about the reopening of the school and bussing. The other comment was about Crandon not wanting to play sports in the fall. Superintendent Larry Palubicki stated that it was a rumor and that the Crandon School District is working with the WIAA and local health officials on the matter.

Kadie VanCleve resigned her position on the school board. There were second reads of handbooks,


in school or virtual

September 1. The school board approved our Return to School Plan at last night's meeting, with exception to the face covering expectations we originally had in place. The Governor's Order supersedes the expectations of our Back to School Plan at this time, so we will follow those expectations until the Order is lifted.

For students who will not be attending school face-to-face in the fall, we will provide synchronous and asynchronous lessons via our Google Classroom platform. This will not be a true virtual school format, because our students will be able to connect from home each period of the day. They will receive the same instruction as those attending face-to-face, and be able to interact via Google Meet. Our staff will record their face-to-face lessons each hour, so students who need to connect from home can log on at that time. If a student can not connect during the class period, the lesson will be stored in Google Classroom. This will allow the students to access the lesson at a later time. Attendance will be taken each day for students who are working from home.

Our plan is to return to school better than normal, for our students who will be attending face-to-face and virtually. It is our goal to return to school as safely as possible, keeping the safety of our students and staff at the forefront. We will continue to ensure that each student receives the best possible education during this uncertain time, allowing them to prepare for their future.

## Pickerel Fire Department receives WPS Foundation grant

Pickerel Volunteer Fire and Rescue received a 2019 grant from the Wisconsin Public Service Foundation for the purchase of an accountability system for tracking of personnel for both Fire Department and Rescue Squad on incidents as well as incident management for large incidents from fires to search and rescue to mass casualty incidents. The grant money was awarded to help bring the department into alignment with the same system being adopted statewide through the Mutual Aid Box Alarm System, also known as MABAS.

Langlade County departments adopted a similar system back in the 2000s however some changes and a more robust system was needed as evidenced by large incidents such as the July 2019 storms. The system when used increases the safety of our volunteers as well as the efficiency in tracking personnel, resources, and patients in large incidents.

This is the third time Pickerel has been awarded this grant from the Wisconsin Public Service Foundation, the first time in 2014 ago helped fund a major portion of the purchase of a thermal imaging camera and the second time in 2016 funded part of the purchase of new helmets and flashlights.

Pickerel Volunteer Fire and Rescue would like to extend its gratitude to the Wisconsin Public Service Foundation, its own personnel who assisted in finding and obtaining the grant, Ainsworth and Nashville townships, and most of all to the community which supports the department. This continued support and generosity allows the department as a whole to continue to improve and helps us as a department help you as a community.





My name is Kirk Bangstad and I'm running for State Assembly District 34 as a Democrat. I currently own the Minocqua Brewing Company, a large brewpub in Minocqua. I grew up in Portage County and worked my way through Stevens Point Area High School, waiting tables and mowing lawns before earning a scholarship to attend Harvard University. After graduation, I landed a job in the Silicon Valley of California, and worked primarily as a strategist for technology companies – both with early stage start-ups and corporate leaders like Microsoft, Oracle, Google, and Cisco.

Growing up in a family of musicians – my mother was a voice teacher and my father a choir director –I have had a life-long passion for singing. A second career in music took me from California to Chicago to New York, while I worked with technology companies by day and sang by night. I also pursued graduate studies in voice at Northwestern and sang on stage from New York to Japan and places in between.

After my late wife Elizabeth was diagnosed with cancer, I left New York City and moved to Minocqua thinking that a slower lifestyle in God's country would be a healthy way for Elizabeth to flourish in spite of her illness. Along the way, I purchased the Minocqua Brewing Company, learning the business of brewing and restaurant ownership. I dove into the community, ultimately becoming the president of the Minocqua Island Business Association, where I work with local business and community organizations to bring more tourism to this beautiful Northwoods town.

I decided to run for office after observing how the state legislature responded – and failed to respond – to the coronavirus pandemic. We needed representatives that listened to health experts and supported a careful, statewide process of re-opening. I also am deeply committed to democracy, which has been undermined in Wisconsin. We should prevent partisan gerrymandering that allows a political party to rig elections in their favor. We should make every effort to allow our citizens to vote by mail so they don't have to risk their lives with in-person voting. We should overturn Wisconsin's notorious voter ID laws that are aimed to suppress the vote and make it difficult to vote by mail.

We also need to accept BadgerCare expansion. The state legislature has already left \$1 billion in federal funding that would have helped Wisconsinites and we miss out on over \$200 million each year. We need to protect our natural resources for our tourist economy and quality of life. That includes opposing toxic mining. Wisconsin needs to invest in its children and its future by reversing years of budget cuts to public education and childcare. To pay for that we need tax reform so our public funding is designed to benefit the people of Wisconsin, not the super-wealthy.

To the Editor:

In a Special Election on May 12, we sent Tom Tiffany to Washington to represent our Northwoods communities. Maybe he's not the right person for the job. He voted against the Great American Outdoors Act. This Act includes full and permanent funding of the Land and Water Conservation Fund from offshore oil and gas revenues. Many Wisconsin lands and waters are protected by the LWCFmost important for our communities is the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest. The Act also included \$1.9 billion annually for the next 5 years to compensate for deferred maintenance on lands managed by the National Park Service, U.S. Forest Service, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Land Management and Bureau of Indian Education. Anyone who has used our local public lands in the last few years is well aware that there has been a serious lack of money for maintenance, leading to closures of popular trails and camping areas.

The Great American Outdoors Act will preserve our Northwoods natural legacy, and will also boost the local economy and preserve recreation and tourism. Perhaps it was the economic shot in the arm that convinced President Trumpnot known as a conservationistto sign it. 41% of House Republicans voted for it. But not Tom Tiffany. He decided to vote against the best interests of his Northwoods constituents. Maybe it's time to rethink this November who will truly represent us in Washington. One of our senators, Ron Johnson, also voted against the Great American Outdoors Act, while our other senator, Tammy Baldwin, voted for it. Our rural areas want and need their share of federal revenue, but Tiffany and Johnson seem determined to make sure we don't get any. Their "antigovernment" stance was painfully misplaced here, and could have cost our communities much needed revenue.

Referrals of suspected children with disability shall be referred to either of the people listed above.

IEP - Team Evaluation

Whenever a child is referred who is suspected of having an exceptional educational need, the school district shall establish an IEP Team. An appointment of this team shall be the responsibility of the Program Support Teacher. The Program Support Teacher shall approve the evaluation process and may request additional information.

The notice of intent to evaluate shall be sent to the parents that will include:

A full explanation of the due process/procedural safeguards;

A description of the evaluation proposed, an explanation of why the evaluation is proposed, any options that were considered, and the reasons why those options were rejected;

A description of each evaluation procedure used as a basis for the evaluation;

The type of professionals conducting the evaluation;

A description of any other relevant factors.

Written parental consent shall be obtained when a child is being evaluated for the first time within the district. This consent form shall include:

A statement documenting that the parent understands the content of the notice; Information on the general areas to be evaluated;

Information on the general types of procedures to be used.

#### Help track Wisconsin's deer population by reporting deer sightings

MADISON, Wis. - The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources is asking the public to participate in Operation Deer Watch, an annual citizen-science survey that collects information on Wisconsin's white-tailed deer and gives residents an engaging opportunity to assist with deer herd management efforts.

Participants can report their deer sightings through an easy-to-use online form. The data collected provide insights into the reproductive status of Wisconsin's deer herd and help shape deer management for the state. Now through Sept. 30, participants are asked to record all bucks, does and fawns seen during the day.

A printable tally sheet is available to help citizenscientists record sightings and enter their results online at a later time. For safety, participants should not record sightings while driving a vehicle. Instead, wait until the vehicle is stopped to take note of your sightings.

Any deer sightings can be counted, whether you spot deer while in the woods, on a drive or while out for an evening walk.

"This is a fun and useful opportunity for everyone to enjoy Wisconsin's plentiful wildlife while participating in citizen science," said Brian Dhuey, DNR wildlife population and harvest assessment specialist. "The DNR encourages anyone interested in deer to take part."


