

79 cases of covid-19 (12 active) confirmed in Forest County

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed additional persons have been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) for a total of 79 cases in Forest County. The individuals are isolating at home. No further information will be released to protect the confidentiality of the individuals. County health officials and local partners are contacting others with whom the individuals who tested positive had close contact with. As of today, Forest County has 1,969 negative test results and 12 pending. There are currently 10 cases in isolation, 2 hospitalized, 63 released from isolation, and 4 deaths.

The Forest County Health Department encourages community members to minimize their contact with others by staying home when possible, practice physical distancing and good personal hygiene, wear a mask or cloth face covering, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are experiencing any symptoms or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please contact your health care provider and ask to be tested.

In an effort to keep our community members up to date on COVID-19, the Forest County Health Department will continue to update our Facebook page daily and local newspapers weekly with current COVID-19 case counts. This will include the number of negative and positive cases in Forest County. Please call our office at 715-478-3371 with any questions or concerns.

Crandon Off-Road World Championships Labor Day Weekend



It has been almost a full year since Crandon International Raceway fans have been able to enjoy the visceral excitement of world class off-road racing at the sport's most celebrated and historic track. Thankfully for many, that wait will end in a major way just in time for next weekend's Labor Day holiday weekend.

Crandon's massive golden gates are set to finally open for excited guests on Wednesday, September 2nd for the 51st annual Polaris Crandon World Championship Off-Road Races. The news comes just weeks after the track announced that both of its upcoming September offroad racing events will take place in the Northwoods of Wisconsin. June's rescheduled 27th Forest County Potawatomi Brush Run weekend, normally the traditional Midwest off-road season kick-off, is set for the Crandon "Big House" September 25th - 27th.

Off-road racing's oldest and most historic shortcourse event, the Polaris Crandon World Championship Off-Road Races will see its grass-filled Camp Crandon open on noon, Wednesday, September 2nd. A full day of practice on Thursday will be the perfect prelude to a packed weekend of 26 Champ Off-Road Pro and Sportsman class races as well as two feature events for Ultra4's King of the Hammers stars on Saturday night and Sunday.

For the fifth time since its inaugural running in 2016, on September 6th Crandon International Raceway will once again host its annual "World Cup Sunday." Created as a non-denominational "Super Bowl" of shortcourse off-road racing, the Crandon World Cup has been instrumental in bringing together the world's best Pro category racers from the west coast and Midwest for one special day of all-out, no points competition. 2020's Crandon World Cup will feature eight races to crown Crandon World Champions in Pro 4, Pro 2, Pro-Lite, Pro Buggy, Ultra4, Pro Mod SxS, Pro Stock SxS and Pro 450 Mod Kart categories.

The weekend will culminate in the always dramatic Crandon Cup race, an all-out competition that pits unlimited Pro 2 versus Pro 4 trucks in a staggered time start. Last year California short-course phenom RJ Anderson took home a whopping \$50,000 first place cash prize as well as a custom engraved Henry rifle as the Crandon Cup's big winner.

Another crowd favorite is sure to be Saturday night's one hour Ultra4 race. Held at Crandon's revised Ultra Cross Course (located just east of Camp Crandon), last year's inaugural event was an unexpected success as the highly modified all-wheel drive unlimited Ultra 4 vehicles took on massive rock obstacles, twisting forest trails and parts of Crandon's legendary short-course track all under the lights. "In so many ways this year has been challenging to our racers, fans and corporate sponsors...and that's an understatement," explained Crandon International Raceway President Cliff Flannery. "All we can do now is to go racing Crandon style come Labor Day weekend. Sure, there will be some changes here at the track, but the bottom line is that we are going to hosts our guests the best way we possibly can -- just like we have for the last 51 years. It's time for all of us to enjoy some fun with family and friends." Crandon International Raceway released a comprehensive 2020 COVID-19 operational plan to local law enforcement and health officials, as well as fans, racers and corporate partners, on its new website at www.crandonoffroad.com. Series officials in the Champ Off-Road and Ultra4 series will also be working closely with Crandon officials to ensure that all phases of the race weekend protocols are executed in an integrated manner. The staff at Crandon International would like to express our appreciation to Forest County Sheriff John Dennee and Health Director Jacee Shepard for helping make the 2020 season at Crandon possible.

While honeybees account for approximately 75 percent of crop plant pollination and many tree species count on wind pollination, several other animals and insects help pollinate grasslands and forests. These pollinators include birds, bats and other mammals. There are also lizards, flies, moths, butterflies and beetles, and more than 4,000 native species of bees in the U.S., like mason, sweat and carpenter bees.

This is why conservation districts in a number of states are beginning to explore management plans that incorporate woodland pollinator habitat. "Woodlands and agroforestry practices provide important habitat for wild bees, bats, butterflies and other pollinators and they are vital for safeguarding ecosystems, for biodiversity and for crop production," said Gary Bentrup, research landscape planner at the USDA National Agroforestry Center.

Research shows that the abundance and number of pollinator species increase in forestland when there are openings in the canopy. Additional studies conclude that prescribed burns provide new territory and nutrients for woodland pollinators that assist in understory regeneration, which ultimately can help in forest restoration efforts. **Continued on page 13**



Tiffany Voted No on the Great American Outdoors Act

Tom Tiffany, the representative from the Wisconsin 7th Congressional District, voted NO on the Great American Outdoors Act. It still passed both the House and the Senate with over-whelming bipartisan support and was signed into law. Since the funding will come from offshore oil and gas leasing revenues income taxes will not be increased.

This legislation will benefit both conservation and the economy.

Thus, Tiffany voted against funding deferred maintenance projects at national parks, national forests, and national wildlife refuges and other conservation projects like parks, trails, and boating access sites.

He voted against a \$22 billion tourism industry. Tourists spent nearly \$14 billion in Wisconsin in 2019, generated \$1.6 billion in state and local revenue taxes, and supported 200,000 jobs.

Tiffany voted against the interests of thousands of small businesses like resorts, motels, sporting goods stores, bait shops, ski and bike shops, gas stations, cafes, supper clubs, grocery stores, and others who provide services to residents and tourists alike pursuing outdoor recreation.

Tiffany voted against those of us who use our public lakes, waterways, wildlife refuges, forests, trails, and parks for fishing, boating, swimming, hunting, skiing, snowmobiling, biking, hiking, bird watching, and just relaxing in the great outdoors.

Once again, Tiffany voted in agreement with the mining industry which strongly opposed this legislation. He also had a history of voting against conservation and in support of mining interests while a Wisconsin state senator. The Wisconsin Conservation Voters writes of his voting record, in part, "he worked in concert with out-ofstate and foreign mining corporations to bring metallic sulfide mining, America's most toxic industry, back to Wisconsin with his Industrial Acid Mining Bill. In the process, Sen. Tiffany divided and misrepresented conservation groups and misled local governments. Despite saying the bill would not take away local control, Tiffany has actively threatened local governments with future legislation that would remove their ability to pass strong local protections."

As an independent voter I am writing this letter in the interest of transparency in government. I am retired from a 42 year career in fisheries, wildlife, and water quality research and management.

Pollinators are currently facing many threats, from habitat fragmentation and loss to diseases and parasites, and recent assessments suggest that 40 percent of invertebrate pollinator species may be at risk of extinction worldwide.

"Although we know forests that have recently been subjected to disturbance can be good for pollinating insects, we are only beginning to understand which groups are present and how they respond to forest management," said Jim Rivers, assistant professor in the College of Forestry at Oregon State University. Rivers researches how insect pollinators respond to natural and human-caused disturbance.


