658 cases of Covid-19 (80 Active) confirmed in **Forest County**

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed additional persons have been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) for a total of 658 cases in Forest County. County health officials and local partners are contacting others with whom the individuals who tested positive had close contact with. As of today, Forest County has 3,302 negative test results. There are currently 80 active cases in isolation, 560 released from isolation, 5 hospitalized, and 13 deaths.

The Forest County Health Department encourages community members to minimize their contact with others by staying home when possible, practice physical distancing and good personal hygiene, wear a mask or cloth face covering, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are experiencing any symptoms or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please contact your health care provider and ask to be tested.

In an effort to keep our community members up to date on COVID-19, the Forest County Health Department will continue to update our Facebook page daily and local newspapers weekly with current COVID-19 case counts. This will include the number of negative and positive cases in Forest County. Please call our office at 715-478-3371 with any questions or concerns.

DMV gives new extension for drivers over age 60

Online prep speeds driver license renewal process, reduces time in DMV

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation's Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) recognizes the elevated health risk to drivers over age 60 during this pandemic and has granted them an extension until January 21, 2021 to visit a DMV to renew their driver license with no late fee.

While drivers over age 65 are required to renew in person, a DMV visit need not take long. DMV offers these tips to reduce the time it takes to renew a driver license:

- Use the Driver License Guide to fill in the form and submit it electronically
- Make an appointment through the Driver License Guide
 Tell your concerns to the DMV Customer Service
 Representative when you check in

"For those not qualified to renew their driver license online, we've developed robust online tools to help reduce the amount of time of their visit," DMV Administrator Kristina Boardman said. "We're continually gauging the health risks of vulnerable populations and challenging our staff to find new ways to safely and efficiently serve customers."

Here are other steps DMV has taken to protect the health of customers and employees:

- Made the decision to restrict all in-person transactions.
 DMV Customer Service Centers are open only for the issuance of Wisconsin driver licenses and identification cards.
- Allow qualified drivers ages 18 to 64 to renew their license online (wisconsindmv.gov/renewDL)
- Allow parents to verify teen eligibility and complete a road test waiver so fewer people in DMVs
- Limit the number of customers within the DMV
- Allow space in the lobby for social distancing
- •Require staff to wear protective gear and installed protective plastic barriers
- Sanitize facilities regularly

 Drivers who are less

Drivers who no longer want to use their driving privilege but want identification can easily exchange their license for an ID online and a new ID card will be mailed. Details and other resources for aging drivers are available at wisconsindmv.gov/olderdrivers.

By limiting the number of people within DMVs, providing electronic submission of paperwork and appointments, and extending the deadline, Wisconsin DMV has taken measures to safely manage customers' needs through this health crisis.







National Forest Christmas tree permits now available online

(Rhinelander, WI, November 18, 2020) - New this year, the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest is offering personal use Christmas tree permits through Recreation.gov at https://www.recreation.gov/treepermits/cnnf. Permits cost \$5 per tree, with a maximum of five permits per household. Visitors must have their permit(s) with them when harvesting.

"We're hopeful that making Christmas tree permits available online will make it easier for people to enjoy the experience of hiking through the woods to find the perfect tree," said Tim Vetter, Recreation, Wilderness and Lands Program Manager.

Visitors can also purchase permits by mail or through no-contact delivery at a forest office by calling any office location below:

Eagle River: 715-479-2827; Florence: 715-528-4464; Lakewood: 715-276-6333; Laona: 715-674-4481

Rhinelander: 715-362-1300

Fourth and fifth grade students are eligible for a free Christmas tree permit through the Every Kid Outdoors initiative. Every Kid Outdoors was created so fourth graders and their families could discover the Nation's wildlife, resources and history for free. The Forest Service recently extended the program to fifth graders who may not have been able to use their fourth grade pass as intended.

Students must print a pass or voucher from the Every Kid Outdoors website at https://everykidoutdoors.gov. Fourth graders should follow links to "get your pass," and fifth graders should follow the link to "get your voucher," which leads to the National Park Service website.

Students can obtain their Christmas tree permit in person at a forest office or online. At a forest office, students must present their valid Every Kid Outdoors pass or voucher. If obtaining the permit online, they must enter the pass or voucher number during checkout. All online purchases, including those for free permits, will incur a \$2.50 processing fee.

Visitors should plan their tree harvest by measuring the transport vehicle and space where they plan to display their tree(s). Cell service may be limited or unavailable on the forest, so consider bringing a map. Maps are available for download, at any forest office, and

The forest recommends against tree harvesting during gun deer hunting season, Nov. 21-29. Throughout fall, forest visitors should wear bright clothing and plan midday visits for better visibility. The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources lists all hunting season website its https://dnr.wisconsin.gov/topic/hunt/dates.



Nicolet Promise tuition assistance available to eligible high school grads

Nicolet College is now accepting applications for its popular Nicolet Promise program, which so far has paved the way for 57 students to attend college tuition-free.

"The Nicolet Promise puts college within reach for many recent high school graduates who otherwise may not have been able to attend college," said Nicolet Dean of Enrollment Erika Warning-Meyer. "This program creates the opportunity for eligible students to learn the skills they need for successful careers."

When Leah Schindeldecker graduated from high school she thought she was going to have to take a gap year in order to work and save money to attend college. Then she heard about and applied for the Promise "The Nicolet Promise is the best thing I could have

asked for and I wanted the chance to explain how much I appreciate the Promise," said Schindeldecker, who went on to graduate from the college's Accounting program. "The financial assistance Promise provided eased all the stress I had about attending college."

Recently the Foundation Board revised eligibility requirements to allow more students to take advantage of the Promise program.

To be eligible, students must have graduated with a high school diploma or earned a GED/HSED within two years prior to enrollment at Nicolet College either in 2020 or 2021; reside in the Nicolet College District; be eligible for Federal Pell Grants as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA); and enroll in a financial aid eligible academic program, taking a minimum of 9 credits per term.

The current application period is for students planning on attending Nicolet in the fall of 2021.

Under the program, the Nicolet College Foundation will pay the balance of tuition and fees for eligible students after federal and state grants have been applied. The Foundation will cover this cost for up to 15 credits per term, until completion of an associate's degree or 70

"Many people may feel that college is not an option for them because of cost," Warning-Meyer explained. "Others might be reluctant to enroll because they think they will be overwhelmed with student debt. The Nicolet Promise addresses both of those issues."

The program also aims to encourage young adults to stay in the Northwoods at a time when many leave seeking opportunity elsewhere.

"The chance to earn a tuition-free college education is a huge incentive for young adults to stay in the region," she said. "The skills they will learn are in high demand across the Northwoods. Our hope and goal is for these students to graduate and start careers that are financially and personally rewarding in area communities."

Prospective students have until March 1, 2021, to complete the Nicolet Promise requirements. Interested individuals should go to nicoletcollege.edu/promise to complete the Promise Inquiry Form and view all program requirements.

Nicolet Foundation Executive Director Heather Schallock said the Nicolet Promise is made possible by ongoing fundraising efforts and generous donors financially supporting students through their gifts to the Foundation.

"All of our donors have a great deal of faith in students attending Nicolet and want to do whatever they can so everyone who wants a college education has the opportunity to earn a college education," she said.


In light of COVID-19, Nicolet has instituted several health protocols to ensure student safety.







The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) discourages social gatherings of any size, including getting together with friends or extended family during hunting season at deer camp. The less time spent with people from other households, the less likely you are to get sick or spread COVID-19 to others. Try to lodge in your own room, tent or trailer and limit the number of households using shared spaces.

"Wisconsin is in crisis - our case numbers are rising and our hospitals are strained," said DHS Secretary-designee Andrea Palm. "Each of us must do our part to stop the spread of COVID-19. Limiting your interactions with people outside your household is a key step, so we ask hunters to reduce their travel and to hunt with the people you live with."

Although activities such as heading to camp or gathering at check stations are often considered an integral part of hunting season, extended physical or close contact increases the risk of COVID-19 transmission.

While deer camp will look different this year, there are still ways to enjoy the social aspects of deer hunting and mentoring through video chats, text messages and other creative ideas that keep you and others safe. Hunters are reminded to register their deer online or by phone.
