Public input sought on WIS 32 project in Forest County

Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) North Central Region is seeking input on proposed improvements to WIS 32 between the Oconto County line (Carter) and County C in Wabeno.

An in-person meeting is not planned based on public health guidance to limit public gatherings. Input may be submitted in alternative formats until Friday, January 29, 2021:

Residents, property and business owners within the project limits have been mailed a handout with a comment form that can be sent back to WisDOT. Input can also be submitted via online survey: http://2.selectsurvey.net/wisdot/wis32forest

A handout, presentation, maps and other information are available on the project website: https://wisconsindot.gov/Pages/projects/by-region/nc/wis32forest/default.aspx

Proposed improvements include a mill and overlay, shoulder paving to better accommodate bicycle and pedestrian traffic, culvert replacements and repairs, centerline rumble strips, and storm sewer repairs. A detailed list may be viewed on the project website.

Temporary (temporary limited easement) land acquisitions are required to accommodate the curb and gutter and storm sewer repairs in Carter. Maps showing estimated right-of-way impacts are available on the project website.

This project is currently scheduled for 2023 but could be advanced to 2022. Motorists can expect to encounter single lane closures during construction along WIS 32. Narrow widths will be required during construction in Carter.

Adjacent property and business owners are encouraged to provide input. Deaf, hard-of-hearing, deaf-blind, and speech-disabled persons should contact the Wisconsin Relay Service by dialing 711.

If you didn't know, January 11 -15, is Wisconsin Salt Awareness Week. Did you know that all the salt that we apply to our streets, roads and sidewalks ends up in our freshwater? Of course, we use salt as a seasoning, a preservative and it was once used as currency, but the \$1 use for salt in the US is for road de-icing. According to the USGS's Mineral Commodities Report, 43% of salt used in the US in 2019 was put on our roads to melt snow and ice. This much salt, 42 million tons, adds up and it doesn't just stay on the roads.

Every bit of salt put down eventually ends up in our lakes, rivers and groundwater, which puts our freshwater ecosystems at risk. Once it gets in the water, treatment options are limited and expensive. Salt itself is expensive. Wisconsin alone spends \$40 million on road salt each year.

So why do we use salt? Well, it works at least above 15°. Above 15°F, salt mixes with snow and ice and raises its freezing point, which keeps things liquid. Below this temperature, it can't do its job and accumulates in

866 cases of covid-19 (28 active) confirmed in Forest County

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed additional persons have been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) for a total of 866 cases in Forest County. County health officials and local partners are contacting others with whom the individuals who tested positive had close contact with. As of today, Forest County has 3,902 negative test results. There are currently 28 active cases in isolation, 811 released from isolation, 3 hospitalized, and 24 deaths.

The Forest County Health Department encourages community members to minimize their contact with others by staying home when possible, practice physical distancing and good personal hygiene, wear a mask or cloth face covering, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are experiencing any symptoms or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please contact your health care provider and ask to be tested.

In an effort to keep our community members up to date on COVID-19, the Forest County Health Department will continue to update our Facebook page daily and local newspapers weekly with current COVID-19 case counts. This will include the number of negative and positive cases in Forest County. Please call our office at 715-478-3371 with any questions or concerns.

2021 critical year in County Broadband Project

Entering the first quarter of 2021, Northwoods Connect and the Forest County Broadband Commission will be focusing efforts on specific tower site locations and construction of new towers throughout the county. The county broadband project includes a plan for seventeen tower sites throughout the county. The plan projects broadband service to reach a minimum of 90% of county residents.

Presently, the first two towers to be in service will be the Hiles south tower, built at the Hiles transfer site and the Armstrong Creek tower on the town hall property. Wisconsin Public Service is completing electric service in Hiles this week. Both towers are expected to be providing service by late this month. Residents should anticipate rate and service information coming from Northwoods in the weeks ahead.

A critical piece in the broadband project is the status of the central tower site located in the city of Crandon where the existing WPS tower is located. Negotiations between the county and WPS have been ongoing for several months; hopefully with a final agreement on construction of a new WPS tower coming soon. The new tower is important in the broadband project as Northwoods will be mounting equipment on the new tower. Assuming an agreement is reached, the new WPS tower would be erected in late spring.

Northwoods personnel have made visits to several potential tower sites over recent weeks; evaluating the quality of those sites with the goal being 'best service' for those areas of the county. Northwoods continues to encourage property owners to contact the Northwoods offices with any possible tower locations. Mark Ferris, Forest County Broadband Commission Chairman stated, "it is so important that every possible tower location be evaluated now. These next two months are big in the planning of this entire project. Please do not hesitate to contact Northwoods. Lots of decisions are going to be made; obviously we want to maximize service to all county residents." Ferris suggests contacting Northwoods project manager Carrie Strickland. Conservation Corner Cont. from pg. 1 clumps. So, when it gets cold, it's better to use a different de-icer or sand for traction.

The biggest problem with salt-use is overapplication. Using salt when it will not work or simply putting too much down does not increase safety, instead, it puts our freshwater resources at risk. And in most circumstances, not that much salt is needed. Overapplication can be avoided by lightly scattering salt and leaving 3" of space between the crystals.

Environmental Scientists monitor salt in the environment is by looking specifically at chloride, part of the commonly-used rock salt, sodium chloride (or NaCl). Chloride is easy to track because when salt dissolves, chloride tends to stick around for a long time.

In Wisconsin, more and more waters are showing increasing amounts of chloride. Urban areas with a lot of pavement are hit the hardest, but chloride levels are increasing nearly everywhere. Road salt is the main source, but there are other sources, like agricultural runoff and water softener salt.

The abundance of lakes and rivers is what makes Wisconsin communities unique. With our pride in our freshwater resources comes a responsibility to care for them. Salt pollution is a threat that we can prevent by adopting better salt-use practices. Information on how you can do better with salt can be found on the Wisconsin Salt Wise website. This website provides information on how you can do better as an individual, homeowner, or winter maintenance professional, to stop over-applying salt and help keep our fresh waters fresh.

The Forest County Library Board is presenting the 2021-2025 Forest County Library Strategic Plan at a virtual ZOOM meeting on January 12, at 5:00-5:45 p.m. Maintaining quality libraries in Forest County is the major responsibility of the Forest County Library Board. To do so, the FCLB develops a five-year plan for the three libraries in Forest County. This plan recognizes that the Crandon, Laona and, Wabeno Public libraries have their own histories and entities, but realizes that creating a county-wide plan clarifies their mission, goals, services, and funding needs for five years.

The seven-member board and the three library

directors have a mission to provide access to library services that educate, entertain, and empower all people of Forest County. The FCLB is also assigned the task to see that these services are provided through equitable funding that supports our municipal libraries. Planning and goal setting is important to accomplishing this mission.
