

Last week, we marked the spring equinox on March 20, the first day of spring. I'm sure many of us are thinking about the change of seasons and the hope of warmer days to come. The warmer temperatures can also bring up the idea of climate change. There are many theories as to what our climate will look like in the future, the fact is that atmospheric carbon dioxide is at it's highest level Earth has ever seen and this is increasing the average temperature.

The main cause of climate change is the increase of carbon dioxide (CO2) production by humans in the form of burning fossil fuels like gasoline and coal. Carbon dioxide is a greenhouse gas in the atmosphere, meaning it helps keep Earth insulated from outer space and holds in the heat of the sun. This is important for life on Earth, but when too much carbon dioxide is produced, too much heat is retained in the atmosphere, creating an increase in the planet's average temperature.

Carbon dioxide in the atmosphere has only been recorded since 1958 at Mauna Loa Observatory in Hawaii, but data from thousands of years ago can be reconstructed from air bubbles trapped in the ice of glaciers.

Forests constantly adapt to changing conditions. Climate change has many factors that can affect the health of your woodland or property, including new weather patterns, rising temperatures, and changes to seasonal precipitation. These factors can create even more problems for your property, such as increased frequency and intensity of pests, invasive species, wildfires, and storms. Here are some tips I've found to consider to protect your property, especially your woods:

Keep Forests as Forests: Larger and more connected forests are more resilient and less impacted by stressors. Prevent fragmentation of your woods with a management plan and a legacy plan.

Reduce Stressors: Diverse forests with healthy trees tolerate pests and diseases better.

Address Vulnerabilities: Keep a variety of native tree species on your property as well as a variety of ages of trees.

The impact of climate change can be projected using forest impact computer models. The Climate Change Response Framework has a lot of useful information for landowners. They even have projections on which species of trees will likely decrease or increase due to the changing conditions. Continued on page -

COVID-19 vaccine update everyone age 16 & over

The Forest County Health Department continues to receive weekly allocations from the State of Wisconsin of the Pfizer vaccine to aid in the response to the current pandemic. As of March 30th 2021, there have been 2,753,146 vaccines administered across the State of Wisconsin. In Forest County, 30.1% (2,707) of our residents have received at least one dose of the vaccine and 23.1% (2,078) have completed the vaccine series. On March 30th, Governor Tony Evers, with the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) announced that everyone ages 16 and over will be eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine starting April 5, 2021. While everyone will be eligible starting April 5, vaccine providers will prioritize anyone previously eligible such as publicfacing essential workers and people with medical conditions. Please realize that there may be waitlists.

In Forest County, there are many options available for getting vaccinated including local and tribal health departments, community based vaccination clinics and healthcare providers. To find a local vaccine provider visit the COVID-19 vaccine provider map or visit https://vaccinefinder.org. Currently, the Pfizer vaccine is the only COVID-19 vaccine authorized for individuals age 16 and 17.

"We have built-up a strong network of vaccine providers across the state. Every community is different, some providers may have openings and others may have waitlists but I assure you that anyone who wants a vaccine will be able to get one in the coming weeks," said DHS Secretary-designee Karen Timberlake. "We appreciate everyone's patience as we work to reach 80 percent community immunity in Wisconsin."

We will continue to share more information about vaccine availability as it becomes available from DHS.

To continue to keep residents of Forest County safe and healthy, please continue using good infection control habits such as washing your hands, wearing a mask in public, avoiding large crowds, and staying home if you are sick and getting tested. 937 cases of covid-19 (2 active) confirmed in forest county

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed additional persons have been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) for a total of 937 cases in Forest County. County health officials and local partners are contacting others with whom the individuals who tested positive had close contact with. As of Friday, March 19, Forest County has 4,590 negative test results. There are currently 2 active cases in isolation, 912 released from isolation, 0 hospitalized, and 26 deaths related to COVID-19.

The Forest County Health Department encourages community members to minimize their contact with others by staying home when possible, practice physical distancing and good personal hygiene, wear a mask or cloth face covering, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are experiencing any symptoms or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please contact your health care provider and ask to be tested.

In an effort to keep our community members up to date on COVID-19, the Forest County Health Department will continue to update our Facebook page and local newspapers weekly on Friday's with current COVID-19 case counts. This will include the number of negative and positive cases in Forest County. Every Monday there will be an updated vaccine report on our Facebook page to update residents on the progress being made on vaccinating community members. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that at an election to be held in the Wabeno Area School District on April 6, 2021, the following proposed Revenue Limit Resolution of the School Board will be submitted to a vote of the people:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET TO EXCEED REVENUE LIMIT BY \$2,500,000 PER YEAR FOR FIVE YEARS FOR NON-RECURRING PURPOSES

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the Wabeno Area School District, Oconto, Forest, Langlade and Marinette Counties, Wisconsin that the revenues included in the School District budget be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$2,500,000 per year for the 2022-2023 school year through the 2026-2027 school year, for non-recurring purposes consisting of maintaining educational programming and operational expenses.

The question will appear on the ballot as follows:

"Shall the Wabeno Area School District, Oconto, Forest, Langlade and Marinette Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$2,500,000 per year for the 2022-2023 school year through the 2026-2027 school year, for non-recurring purposes consisting of maintaining educational programming and operational expenses?"

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT AND EFFECT OF VOTE

The referendum election ballot will ask District electors to vote "yes" or "no" on the referendum election question as set forth above.

A "yes" vote on the question is a vote to authorize the Wabeno Area School District budget to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$2,500,000 per year for the 2022-2023 school year through the 2026-2027 school year, for nonrecurring purposes consisting of maintaining educational programming and operational expenses.

A "no" vote on the question is a vote to deny the Wabeno Area School District the authority to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$2,500,000 per year for the 2022-2023 school year through the 2026-2027 school year, for nonrecurring purposes consisting of maintaining educational programming and operational expenses.

In the event a majority of the electors voting on the question vote "yes", the District will be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$2,500,000 per year for the 2022-2023 school year through the 2026-2027 school year, for nonrecurring purposes consisting of maintaining educational programming and operational expenses; if a majority vote "no" on the question set forth above, the District will not be so authorized.

NOTICE OF MEETING OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF CANVASSERS

By no later than 9 a.m. on the Tuesday after the election, the school district board of canvassers shall convene, pursuant to the provisions of Wis. Stat. § 19.84, for the purpose of conducting the school district canvass pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 7.53(3). This meeting will be open to the public pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 19.81-89.

INFORMATION TO ELECTORS2

Upon entering the polling place, an elector shall state his or her name and address, show an acceptable form of photo identification and sign the poll book before being permitted to vote. If an elector does not have acceptable photo identification the elector may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles. If an elector is not registered to vote, an elector may register to vote at the polling place serving his or her residence, if the elector presents proof of residence in a form specified by law. Where ballots are distributed to electors, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot.3 Upon being permitted to vote, the elector shall retire alone to a voting booth and cast his or her ballot except that an elector who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the elector's minor child or minor ward. An election official may inform the elector of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not in any manner advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

On referendum questions where paper ballots are used, the elector shall make a mark (X) in the are used, the elector shall make a mark (X) in the

square next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the elector shall make a mark (X) in the square next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using a tactile ballot marking device (Vote-PAD) to mark a paper ballot, the elector shall obtain from the inspectors, the assistive device and any audio or dexterity aids if required. On referendum questions, the elector shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to opposed to the question.

On referendum questions where touch screen voting systems are used, the elector shall touch the screen or use the keypad to select "yes" if in favor of the question, or the elector "yes" if in favor of the question, or the elector shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "no" if opposed to the question.

On referendum questions where **optical scan** voting systems are used, the elector shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using an electronic ballot marking device ("Automark", "ExpressVote", Clear Access or "ImageCast Evolution-ICE") to mark an **ontical scan** ballot, the elector shall touch the screen at "yes" if in favor of the question, or the elector shall touch the screen at "no" if shall touch the screen or use the keypad to select "no" if opposed to the question.

The vote shall not be cast in any other manner. Not more than five minutes' time shall be allowed inside a voting booth. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the elector in marking his or her ballot may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

If the elector spoils a paper or optical scan ballot, he or she shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one elector. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the elector shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.4

The elector may spoil a touch screen ballot at the voting station before the ballot is cast.

After an official paper ballot is marked, it shall be folded so the inside marks do not show, but so the printed endorsements and inspectors' initials on the outside do show. The elector shall deposit the voted ballot in the ballot box or deliver the ballot to an election inspector for deposit, and deposit any unvoted ballots in the discard box. The elector shall leave the polling place promptly.

After an official optical scan ballot is marked, it shall be inserted in the security sleeve so the marks do not show. The elector shall insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve, or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. Where a central count system is used, the elector shall insert the ballot in the ballot box and discard the sleeve or deliver it to an inspector for deposit. The elector shall leave the polling place promptly.

After an official touch screen ballot is cast, the elector shall leave the polling place promptly.

An elector may select an individual to assist in casting his or her vote if the elector declares to the presiding official that he or she is unable to read, has difficulty reading, writing or understanding English or that due to disability is unable to cast his or her ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the elector's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the elector.

Evers announces the sale of CN RR to Watco in WI and the U.P.

Wisconsin Governor Tony Evers and Transportation Secretary-designee Craig Thompson today praised the announcement that the Canadian National Railroad has reached an agreement to sell key rail lines, including 650 miles of track in Wisconsin and upper Michigan, to logistics company Watco.

"This is truly great news for Wisconsin. This announcement means not only continued freight rail service for Wisconsin's Northwoods, but it also presents an opportunity to expand service," Governor Evers said. "That is especially good news for our Northwoods economy and the timber and paper industries that rely heavily on freight rail to connect to major ports and markets all over the world."

"More than 170 million tons of freight move by rail in Wisconsin each year," Secretary Thompson said. "For many of Wisconsin's major industries – agriculture, manufacturing, and wood products – rail is the most cost-effective way to move freight. Having reliable rail access will make our industries more competitive and contribute to our economic recovery. Rail is also a more energy-efficient way to move freight, reducing our state's carbon footprint. Plus, every ton of freight that move by rail means less congestion and wear and tear on our highways," he said.

In Wisconsin, nearly all rail lines are owned by private companies. Watco currently operates the Wisconsin and Southern Railroad (WSOR), which connects to the CN line and other Class I railroads.

Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest plans for 2021 prescribed fire season

Rhinelander, Wis., Mar. 30, 2021— The Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest is preparing to conduct prescribed fire activities to restore and improve wildlife habitat and to reduce wildfire risk across northern Wisconsin. Certified professional fire specialists expect to begin work in early April as weather and fire danger conditions allow. The forest will notify neighboring residents and state and local officials in advance of conducting the fires.

Prescribed fires, also known as prescribed burns, involve tactical application of fire under specified weather conditions. Highly trained and experienced fire staff complete careful planning and coordination before conducting a prescribed fire. Weather conditions must also be monitored, as wind, relative humidity and fuels moisture can affect decisions about how and when to implement a burn.

"This is an important management tool that requires expert input from resource specialists across the forest," said Scott Linn, zone fire management officer. "Just like prevention is important for personal health, prescribed fire can help keep the land healthy."

Prescribed fires simulate historic, naturally occurring wildfires and burning done by indigenous communities, and they provide great benefits to native plants and animals. Burning the previous years' plant matter returns nutrients to the soil, encouraging healthier and more productive plant growth.

This rejuvenation is especially important this year since local prescribed fires were cancelled in 2020 due to precautions related to COVID-19.

Due to recent favorable weather conditions, the forest will begin its prescribed fire season a bit earlier than usual this year. The forest expects to begin work in early April and may continue through fall, as weather conditions allow.
