I recently purchased my annual fishing license and trout stamp online. After doing so, I contemplated how I would prove it if approached by a DNR Warden. That request from a DNR game warden might be intimidating to an angler, hunter, or trapper who told the warden they had the required license or harvest authorization for their chosen activity.

A few years ago, there was only one way to prove it. The participant showed the warden a printed paper or vinyl document that served as a license or tag (now an authorization). Today, just about everyone has a cell phone and wireless technology has enabled other methods to be used as proof of licensing.

Online licensing is supposed to make things easier, but knowing for certain what serves as proof of licensing can be confusing. I have a Go Wild card that has a strip on the back. A Warden should have the ability to scan the card and see what licenses you have. Sometimes a Go Wild card is good, but for certain kinds of fishing it's not.

959 cases of covid-19 (5 active) confirmed in Forest County

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed additional persons have been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) for a total of 959 cases in Forest County. County health officials and local partners are contacting others with whom the individuals who tested positive had close contact with. As of Friday, April 30th, Forest County has 4,769 negative test results. There are currently 5 active cases in isolation, 931 released from isolation, 0 hospitalized, and 26 deaths related to COVID-19.

The Forest County Health Department encourages community members to minimize their contact with others by staying home when possible, practice physical distancing and good personal hygiene, wear a mask or cloth face covering, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are experiencing any symptoms or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please contact your health care provider and ask to be tested.

In an effort to keep our community members up to date on COVID-19, the Forest County Health Department will continue to update our Facebook page and local newspapers weekly on Friday's with current COVID-19 case counts. This will include the number of negative and positive cases in Forest County. Please call our office at 715-478-3371 with any questions or concerns.

Get Vaccinated!

The Forest County Health Dept. has a supply of Johnson & Johnson vaccine to help fight the covid epidemic. If you would like to reduce your chances of contracting this dangerous flu bug go the Health Department and get your shot on May 12th. No appointment needed. New equipment at the Crandon Fire Dept.

There is a guide to approved ways to show license compliance and is available on the DNR website. Type "Prove it" in the search window to access that guide.

The guide says an original hardcopy document is acceptable proof for any hunting, fishing, or trapping activity. Hard copy reprints are legal for all activities except for registration certificates for an ATV/UTV, off-highway motorcycle, boat, or snowmobile – and when a special tag is issued for wolf, bobcat, fisher and other carcass/ pelt tags. An exception was made for the February wolf season because there was not enough time for the DNR to send tags to hunters and trappers before the season opened.

An authenticated Wisconsin driver's license is acceptable proof for safety certificates, hunting licenses, and stamps (except for federal duck stamp), disabled hunting and trolling permits, deer and turkey authorizations, trapping licenses, goose permits, guide licenses, and wild rice harvest licenses and ID cards.

A driver's license is acceptable proof for having fishing licenses and stamps used on inland waters that are not boundary waters or outlying waters.

As I mentioned, another option is to buy a Go Wild conservation card available on the DNR website for \$3.50. This plastic card is the size of a driver's license or credit card. The back of the card has the purchaser's name, $\ensuremath{\mathsf{DNR}}$ customer number, and a bar code that wardens can scan. The card does not expire and the information available by scanning is updated every time the card-holder buys a new license or receives a harvest authorization. The acceptable proofs for the card are identical to those of a driver's license. A digital file issued by the DNR and displayed on an electronic device (usually a cell phone) has the same acceptable proof as a driver's license or Go Wild card. In addition, it is acceptable proof for temporary trail use receipt for ATV/UTV and snowmobile, temporary operating receipt for ATV/UTV, off-highway motorcycle, boat or snowmobile registration, safety certificates, and wild ginseng dealer and harvester license The digital file must be in PDF or html format. A screen shot or photo is not acceptable. Photos of a driver's license or Go Wild card are not acceptable proof. Any vehicle carrying a person with a patron license is granted free admission to state parks, forests, and recreation areas. Patron-holders are also granted free access to state trails.

For boundary and outlying waters (including Lake Michigan and Lake Superior) a hard-copy original or reprint is required.

As I mentioned, another option is to buy a Go Wild conservation card available on the DNR website for \$3.50. This plastic card is the size of a driver's license or credit card. The back of the card has the purchaser's name, DNR customer number, and a bar code that wardens can scan. The card does not expire and the information available by scanning is updated every time the card-holder buys a new license or receives a harvest authorization. The acceptable proofs for the card are identical to those of a driver's license. A digital file issued by the DNR and displayed on an electronic device (usually a cell phone) has the same acceptable proof as a driver's license or Go Wild card. In addition, it is acceptable proof for temporary trail use receipt for ATV/UTV and snowmobile, temporary operating receipt for ATV/UTV, off-highway motorcycle, boat or snowmobile registration, safety certificates, and wild ginseng dealer and harvester license The digital file must be in PDF or html format. A screen shot or photo is not acceptable. Photos of a driver's license or Go Wild card are not acceptable proof.




Any vehicle carrying a person with a patron license is granted free admission to state parks, forests, and recreation areas. Patron-holders are also granted free access to state trails.

Before 1992, state residents could buy a senior citizen recreation card that granted lifetime free access to state parks. Those cards are no longer available, but previously issued cards are stilled honored.


