Wisconsin offering COVID-19 vaccinations to children ages 12-15

(Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine deemed safe and effective)

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) announces that children 12-15 years old are now eligible to receive the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine and vaccinations can begin starting Thursday, May 13. The Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine requires two doses for full protection and is the first and only vaccine available for this age group.

After successful clinical trials and a rigorous review of all available data, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) authorized Pfizer's request to expand the emergency use authorization (EUA) to include adolescents ages 12-15. On Wednesday, May 12, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) confirmed the vaccine is safe and voted to recommend the vaccine to the age group.

"Our nation's leading medical experts deemed the Pfizer vaccine safe for this age group, and the initial data shows the vaccine is 100% effective in preventing COVID-19," said DHS Secretary-designee Karen Timberlake. "This is a game changer especially as we are experiencing an increase in cases, hospitalizations, and reports of long-term symptoms in younger people. We are asking parents and guardians to get their children vaccinated as soon as they can."

Parents and guardians of children ages 12-15 can schedule a vaccination using a variety of options, including with their health care provider, at community-based vaccination clinics, local and tribal health departments, or pharmacies. 964 cases of covid-19 (1 active) confirmed in Forest County

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed additional persons have been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) for a total of 964 cases in Forest County. County health officials and local partners are contacting others with whom the individuals who tested positive had close contact with. As of Monday, May 17th, Forest County has 4,855 negative test results. There is currently 1 active case in isolation, 940 released from isolation, 0 hospitalized, and 26 deaths related to COVID-19.

In an effort to keep our community members up to date on COVID-19, the Forest County Health Department will continue to update our Facebook page and local newspapers weekly on Friday's with current COVID-19 case counts. What's in Mosquito Sprays?

Most residential mosquito control companies use insecticides known as pyrethrins, which are chemicals derived from chrysanthemum flowers that are toxic to insects; or more frequently, pyrethroids, which are synthetic chemicals that mimic pyrethrins. Whether natural or synthetic, these are broad-spectrum insecticides that are highly toxic to a wide variety of insects, not just mosquitoes.

Companies use pyrethrins and pyrethroids in their standard treatment options. Marketing efforts and corporate talking points correctly state that these pesticides are regulated and approved for use by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), but that doesn't

Holt & Balcom Logging Camp Museum in Lakewood open this summer!

After an unprecedented year of being closed due to the coronavirus pandemic, the Holt & Balcom Logging Camp Museum will reopen this summer. With maintenance and cleaning done by volunteer staff, the site is ready for school field trips and regular summer activities. School visits began May 17 with Suring coming for its annual field trip outing.

"Hopefully, other schools will be able to fit us into their year's end busy schedules," says Bob Brown, School Tours Coordinator and Camp Curator: "It's always fun to watch the excitement as the children enjoy a hands-on interactive look at their logging heritage."

As in the past, the Museum will be open on Summer Saturdays. A special 2021 program, Lucy Loved Lakewood will be presented on Saturday July 17 at 1:00 p.m. Joining Kathleen Marsh, who will portray Lucy Holt, will be Lakewood historian Tom Thielke. "Lucy" will share some fond memories of her first visit to the Logging Camp in 1894 with her future husband W.A. Holt as well as precious time spent vacationing at the Holt family's iconic Island Lodge at Archibald Lake.

Tom will pick up the story of Lucy's deep connection with Lakewood, including her use of a movie camera (1920s cutting edge technology) to record local history for posterity. Tom's presentation will show rare vintage video of the Cathedral Woods, Holt logging crews at work, and Holt's sawmill operation in Oconto.

If you have never been to Holt & Balcom, or if you haven't been there recently, this is the perfect year to visit. The Museum is open Saturdays (10-3); Memorial Day through Labor Day. If you cannot come on Saturday, special tours can be arranged. Call Bob Brown (715-276-3505) or Kathleen Marsh (715-276-6515).

Updated mask guidance from the CDC

The Forest County Public Health Department is encouraged by the recent update from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) regarding COVID-19 and fully vaccinated individuals.

A person is considered fully vaccinated against COVID-19 if it has been two or more weeks since they got the second dose in a two-dose series (such as Pfizer or Moderna), or one dose of a single-dose vaccine (such as Johnson & Johnson).

The updated guidance and recommendations from CDC and DHS is a promising sign that we are nearing the end of the pandemic. This updated guidance reflects on the effectiveness of COVID-19 vaccines against spreading strains of the SARS-CoV-2 virus. The science shows that COVID-19 vaccines are effective in real-world settings in preventing mild and severe disease, hospitalization, and death. Therefore, individuals who are fully vaccinated can start returning to normal activities.

This guidance applies to fully vaccinated individuals. Mask wearing, regardless of vaccination status, continues to be an important tool to help slow the spread of COVID-19 in Forest County.

WEDC invests in the School District of Wabeno Area for fab lab equipment

Wabeno – The Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC) announced May 5, 2021 that the School District of Wabeno is the recipient of a state grant to fund new fabrication laboratory (fab lab) facilities, which will equip Wisconsin students with essential skills for the 21st century's global economy. Wabeno Area School District was awarded \$25,000 to expand their fab lab.

"WEDC has invested over \$3.4 million for the past six years to provide 95 school districts across the state with the equipment necessary to help students learn high-demand skills, including technology, manufacturing and engineering," said Missy Hughes, secretary and CEO of WEDC. "Fab labs benefit not only the students themselves with important technology and career skills, but they also benefit Wisconsin employers, who will be able to find workers with the right skills to allow their companies to grow and thrive."

Including Wabeno Area School District, 28 school districts throughout the state are being awarded a total of \$635,089 in Fab Labs Grants this year to establish or expand their fab labs.

WEDC's Fab Labs Grant Program is designed to support hands-on learning in the subjects of science, technology, engineering, art and mathematics (STEAM) by assisting public school districts with equipment purchases such as 3D printers, laser engravers, computer numerical control routers and plasma cutters for instructional and educational purposes.





mean they are without any negative environmental consequences.

Pyrethroids are relatively safe but should not be viewed as harmless. If you spill enough on your skin you might experience itchiness, numbness, nausea, and respiratory problems, among a rather long list of adverse events. At very high doses pyrethroids can kill you, a fact known because some people have injected it (suicide) and in one case because somebody ate food that was cooked in pyrethroid concentrate (it resembles cooking There are also scattered reports that some pyrethroids are carcinogenic and estrogenic but I don't think such effects are shockingly large, and to date they seem to be restricted to mouse studies. Each pyrethroid listed above has a slightly different toxicity, so to get more information, Google the name or read the linked material by clicking on their name.

There is no way for companies to spray these broad-spectrum insecticides in your yard without also killing other insects they come in contact with, including bees, butterflies, caterpillars, ladybugs, dragonflies and other beneficial insects, along with the mosquitoes. How Sprays Hurt Bees and Other Wildlife

The focus of much of the toxicity testing by regulatory agencies has been on domesticated honey bees because their pollination services are critically important for our agriculture system and food production. Researchers have documented widespread contamination of honey bee hives with toxic pyrethroids, finding residues of these chemicals in the pollen that bees bring back to the hive, in beeswax, and on bees themselves, at levels that can be lethal to bees or cause harmful effects.

Much less is known about the impacts of these sprays on wild insects and other native wildlife, but mosquito-control insecticides have been linked with declines of native pollinators. It's clear that wild native bees and other pollinators are also at risk from mosquito

Wild bee susceptibility to insecticides directly correlates with the surface area to volume ratio of the bee, meaning smaller bees like alfalfa-pollinating alkali bees native to the west and southwestern U.S. are at even greater risk from mosquito sprays than honey bees.

Recently, thousands of monarch butterflies were found dead in the Fargo-Moorhead area of North Dakota and Minnesota after aerial spraying of a 100-square mile area with permethrin to control mosquitoes. Monarch populations have plummeted at an alarming rate in recent decades.

Mosquitoes themselves play an ecological role, serving as pollinators and as a food source for other wildlife.





Nicolet students save big as the college expands use of free instructional materials

Nicolet College is well on its way to hitting the \$1 million mark in textbook savings for students by continuously expanding the program that eliminates costly textbooks and replaces them with educational materials students can get for free.

Since starting the program in 2018, students have saved \$856,200 in textbook costs, said Penny Kuckkahn, director of Instructional Effectiveness and Flexible Learning.

'Textbooks can be quite expensive which adds another financial challenge for students," said Kuckkahn. "Our goal is to reduce and remove as many barriers as possible to students getting a college education. By using these free materials, known as Open Educational Resources, we are able to open the door to college a little wider for students to get the skills and education they need to get further ahead in life."

When the program was first launched in the 2018-2019 academic year, student textbook savings totaled about \$69,000.

That number has jumped to \$261,487 annually for the recently completed 2020-2021 academic year.

The majority of the instructional materials come from oercommons.org, a vast, content-rich website where educators from across the globe openly share a wide variety of instructional material that is available at no cost. "This is a major shift in how students access learning

materials they need," said Cindy Domaika, who first brought OER to Nicolet and is the manager of Open and Educational Resources at the college.

"Sources range from electronic textbooks to videos and PowerPoint presentations to a wide variety of

other content that is available entirely in an electronic Domaika stressed that all of the material that

makes it into a Nicolet OER class goes through a rigorous review process to ensure it meets academic standards. Every Nicolet class has a list of course

competencies that outline the subject matter to be learned in that course. To gather the educational material that covers all

of the competencies, Nicolet instructors and Domaika work hand in hand to find course materials.


