The chamber of commerce's popular Kentuck Day Festival in downtown Crandon honors the area's early settlers who arrived from Kentucky and celebrates the rich heritage they left to future generations.

At this year's festival on Saturday, July 24, you'll see a large arts & crafts show on the Courthouse Square, sidewalk sales, flea market and a car show. Hours are 9am to 3pm. There will be music on the courthouse square grounds as well as music at the car show. The Crandon Area Historical Society will have a booth with photographs and stories of settlers that migrated from Kentucky to Crandon in the early 1900s. There will be other information booths including two area lake associations.

At the arts & crafts show over 75 artists and crafts people will be selling finely crafted and original items such as silk floral designs, scrolled wood items, photographs, honey products and wildlife art. The flea market on Polk Street will have about two dozen vendors.



The Forest County Health Department is encouraging residents of Forest County to continue to practice the safety practices that have been in place since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic; though we certainly are in a better place this year compared to last July.

Since December of 2020, nearly 3 million Wisconsinites have received their first dose of the COVID-19 vaccines; however, there are still populations that are unable to be vaccinated. This includes children ages 11 and younger and certain immunocompromised people. In Forest County 3,747 people have had at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine and 3,612 have completed the vaccine series. That means 50.8 % of adults 18 and over have had at least one dose, and 49.1 % have completed the series. For information on where to find a vaccine in Forest County, call the Forest County Health Department or go to https://www.vaccines.gov to find a vaccine near you.

"The COVID-19 vaccine has been a game changer. However, vaccines alone will not bring us to the end of this pandemic," said DHS secretary-designee Karen Timberlake. "We also have to stop the spread of the virus now, so it does not continue to mutate. With half of our population not yet vaccinated the use of mitigation strategies such as getting tested if you have COVID-19 symptoms, staying home, and keeping your distance from others when you are sick will help bring us to the finish-

There are unusually high rates of seasonal respiratory viruses circulating across the nation, public health experts also recommend that anyone experiencing symptoms, including those fully vaccinated, get tested for COVID-19. To find a testing site in Forest County call the Forest County Health Department at 715-478-3371. You can request an at home collection kit by visiting the DHS COVID-19 Testing webpage.

The Forest County Health Department is also urging everyone to travel with a mask. Certain places such as healthcare centers, public transit, and some local businesses may still require masks. For those not vaccinated, mask use in public places, physical distancing from others, and washing hands will help prevent infection. For those who are fully vaccinated, mask use will help protect vulnerable populations and can prevent other illnesses from spreading.

Governor Evers Vetoes Bill that Passed Senate Floor 29-1

Madison, WI – On Friday afternoon, in an effort to avoid attention, Governor Evers quietly vetoed Assembly Bill 293 which would have made Wisconsin a 2nd Amendment sanctuary state. He vetoed a bill that twenty-nine of thirty-three state senators voted in favor of. That's not governing for the greater good of Wisconsin, that's cow-towing to the private interests that fund his campaign. I'm very disappointed in the Governor's decision."

State Treasurer Godlewski & BCPL announce \$1 Million for UW System Grants & Scholarships

This year's distribution will be a record-breaking \$1,025,000 from the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands' (BCPL) Normal School Fund to help make college more affordable and provide grants to UW System programs

"Ensuring our investments are managed effectively so we can deliver a strong return is my first priority as Chair of the BCPL, and we will continue this work to ensure our beneficiaries can rely on funding year after year."

One of the beneficiaries, UW Stevens Point, dedicates its annual funds to a number of programs to support environmental education, including developing curriculum for K-12 schools, youth programming at county forests, and professional development opportunities. State Treasurer Sarah Godlewski joined Brian Sloss, Dean of the College of Natural Resources to discuss the program and impact of the funding. A video of that conversation is here.

"Thanks to funding from the Normal School Fund, the College of Natural Resources at UW-Stevens Point is able to provide a range of environmental education programs that benefit students, our communities, and our state," said Brian Sloss, Dean of the College of Natural Resources. "We're particularly proud of our ability to bridge education with real-world experiences, providing opportunities for students to grow as leaders in public policy, land management, and land-use practices."

"During the many years I've served on the Board, I've been so proud of Wisconsin that we invested this money in the way that it could continually help the students of the university," said Secretary of State Doug La Follette.

"This funding for scholarships and grants for programming is an investment in Wisconsin's future," said Attorney General Josh Kaul. "Lowering the cost of education for scholarship recipients can help alleviate the crush of student loan debt that denies economic security to so many, and it's particularly important now, as families continue recovering from the financial impacts of the pandemic."

With the COVID-19 pandemic affecting the financial security of many Wisconsinites, it is even more important the BCPL provide this record distribution that will help students complete their education and reduce the need for student loans. This distribution is split among four beneficiaries in the UW system; the Nelson Institute for Environmental Studies at UW-Madison, UW-Stevens Point's environmental program, UW Extension, and merit-based scholarships for Wisconsin residents attending UW schools.



Swimmer's itch occurs in some Wisconsin Lakes each year. Swimmer's itch is caused by the larvae (immature stage) of certain flatworms that can be picked up while swimming. Technically known as schistosome dermatitis, swimmer's itch appears as red itching, bite-like welts within several hours of leaving the water. It is neither dangerous nor contagious, but is very uncomfortable.

When the larva penetrates the skin, it causes a small red welt. The degree of discomfort and bodily reactions varies with the person's sensitivity and the degree of infestation. In some people, the reaction may be hardly noticeable. Others have considerable pain, fever, severe itching, and swelling. The swelling usually subsides within a week, but the redness can last longer.

Swimmer's itch organisms are most commonly noticed in early summer, when the water is its warmest. The season is relatively short - usually four to six weeks, depending on the weather.

It's best to regard swimmer's itch in the same manner as mosquitos, wood ticks and deer flies; there really is nothing that can be done to eliminate them, and our best action is to learn how to reduce exposure. Often these creatures we consider pests are signs of a healthy and diverse outdoors environment. Overall, they shouldn't discourage us from enjoying the many outdoor activities we can experience when we venture into their outdoor habitat.

Some people have noted that waterproof sunscreens and lotions reduce the infections.

If you decide to go in the water when and where swimmer's itch larvae are present, stay clear of plants growing in the lake. Swimming rather than playing or wading in shallow water will reduce exposure. Swim offshore if possible. If swimmer's itch is known to be present, avoid swimming when winds are likely to be carrying the organisms into the beach.

The most important thing to do to prevent the itch is to rub down very briskly right after leaving the water. This can crush the organisms before they can penetrate the skin. Showering shortly after leaving the water also should help.

After the swimmer's itch organisms have penetrated the skin, there is little that can be done to treat it. You may get some relief by using soothing lotions such as calamine or lotions containing antihistamines and/or local anesthetics. In severe cases, see a physician.






Wolf River Riders donate to Forest County Humane Society
