### Sen. Baldwin praises USDA on pandemic assistance for timber harvesters and haulers

#### USDA's Farm Service Agency will accept applications from July 22 through October 15, 2021

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Today, (July 22) U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin joined Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack and Congresswoman Chellie Pingree (D-ME) to announce that the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is providing \$200 million in relief for timber harvesting and timber hauling businesses that have experienced losses due to COVID-19, as part of USDA's Pandemic Assistance for Timber Harvesters and Haulers program (PATHH). Senator Baldwin worked to secure this critical assistance for Wisconsin's timber industry in the year-end bipartisan government funding legislation that was signed into law last year.

"Wisconsin's forests and timber economy don't just provide recreational opportunities and environmental benefits - they also support our rural communities and our state's economy. But unfortunately, the COVID-19 pandemic has resulted in mills laying off workers and loggers considering closing up shop," said Senator Baldwin. "I worked to help provide this much-needed relief for our loggers and haulers to make it through this challenging time, and I will continue working in the Senate to support our timber harvesting and timber hauling businesses who experienced a loss in revenue through no fault of their own."

"USDA's Pandemic Assistance for Producers initiative promised to get financial assistance to a broader set of producers and today's announcement delivers on that promise," said Secretary Vilsack. "On top of the existing challenges associated with natural disasters and trade, the pandemic caused a major disruption for loggers

# Laona Lions Community Soup August 7th



The caption on the 1930 Soup picture held at the John Russel cottage says that 312 people were served soup that day. What a remarkable feat that must have been in Laona just thirty years after the Connor sawmill came into operation. This tradition started with a few families in 1919-20 during a time of great growth throughout our country, a time referred to as Roaring Twenties. Ten years later at the time of this Community Soup, we were nine months into the Great Depression. Factories and sawmills were closed and un-employment numbers were at historical rates that we have never had since that time. This 1930 vintage Community Soup was indeed an act of kindness and showed how these early Silver Lake residents reached out to feed 312 people who were living here during the years of the Great Depression.

This tradition continued, with the exception of the WWII era, until 1951 when the Laona Lions Club was chartered and officially hosted this event.

The Laona Lions club will again be hosting the Centennial Community Soup on August 7th 2021 at the Silver Lake Beach. Dan Bobbe, Club secretary and event chairperson has chosen the theme. REMEMBERING THE PAST...PLEDGING TO SERVE OUR COMMUNITY ... WITH YOUR HELP.



and timber haulers including lack of access to wood processing mills. This industry plays a critical role in our nation's economy and we are proud to support these hardworking loggers and truckers as they get back on track."

"Patience sometimes pays," stated Matt Jensen, owner of Whitetail Logging and President of the Great Lakes Timber Professionals Association (GLTPA) headquartered in Rhinelander, Wisconsin. "When the COVID pandemic began and pulp mills like the one in Wisconsin Rapids began closing because of it, timber harvesters and haulers nationwide, for the first time in my logging career, asked the federal government for financial assistance." Money for assistance was included in the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2019 however, because FSA, through no fault of its own, had no experience in dealing with timber harvesters and haulers and had to start from scratch to build guidelines with which to access the money. "GLTPA and its members are very grateful for the persistent work done by Senator Baldwin, FSA, USFS, USDA and others to get PATHH money into the hands of producers who truly need it."

"The \$200 million Pandemic Assistance for Timber Harvesters and Haulers (PATHH) program will provide much needed financial assistance for those hardest hit by the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. This aid will help those loggers and truckers survive and recover from the negative economic impacts experienced within the timber industry," said Tim Christopherson, President of American Loggers Council.

#### **Program Details**

Loggers and timber haulers can apply for assistance through USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) from July 22 through October 15, 2021. The Pandemic Assistance for Timber Harvesters and Haulers program (PATHH) is administered by FSA in partnership with the U.S. Forest Service. Timber harvesting and hauling businesses that have experienced a gross revenue loss of at least 10% during the period of Jan. 1 and Dec. 1, 2020, compared to the period of Jan. 1 and Dec. 1, 2019, are encouraged to apply.

To be eligible for payments, individuals or legal entities must be a timber harvesting or timber hauling business where 50% or more of its gross revenue is derived from one or more of the following:

- Cutting timber.
- Transporting timber.

 Processing of wood on-site on the forest land (chipping, grinding, converting to biochar, cutting to smaller lengths, etc.).

Payments will be based on the applicant's gross revenue received from Jan. 1, 2019, through Dec. 1, 2019, minus gross revenue received from Jan. 1, 2020, through Dec. 1, 2020, multiplied by 80%. FSA will issue an initial payment equal to the lesser of the calculated payment amount or \$2,000 as applications are approved. A second payment will be made after the signup period has ended based upon remaining PATHH funds. The maximum amount that a person or legal entity may receive, directly or indirectly, is \$125,000.

#### **Applying for Assistance**

Loggers and truckers can apply for PATHH by completing form FSA-1118, Pandemic Assistance for Timber Harvesters and Haulers Program application, and certifying to their gross revenue for 2019 and 2020 on the application. Additional documentation may be required. Visit farmers.gov/pathh for more information on how to apply. Applications can be submitted to the FSA office at any USDA Service Center nationwide by mail, fax, hand delivery, or via electronic means. To find a local FSA office, loggers and truckers can visit farmers.gov/service-locator. They can also call 877-508-8364 to speak directly with a USDA employee ready to offer assistance.

### Conservation Corner Cont. from pg. 1 Five common caterpillars in Wisconsin are the:

Monarch: the best place to look for monarch caterpillars is in open areas or along woodland edges. Monarchs spend a lot of time on their host plant, the milkweed. They lay their eggs on them and caterpillars eat their leaves. An interesting fact is that when they eat the leaves, the caterpillars absorb the poison in the leaves, which makes them taste bad to predators!

Painted Lady: This caterpillar lives in silk nests on 100+ host plants, including thistles, hollyhocks, and mallows. Caterpillars spend most of their time in these nests. Look for these in open habitats such as old fields, meadows, disturbed areas, and roadsides.

Viceroy: This caterpillar's strange appearance is a camouflage to look like bird droppings. Their host plants are the willow, poplar, and cottonwood trees. Vicerovs hibernate in tube-like shelters built on the leaves of these trees. They are a very unique looking caterpillar, but the adults look very similar to monarchs. You can find these caterpillars in wetland areas, especially along streams where their host trees are found.

Red Admiral: The red admiral is often found along edges of wet wooded areas, streams, trails, and nearby fields. They tend to live on plants in the nettle family. The stinging nettle helps the caterpillars protect themselves from predators. They also range in color from yellow all the way to black.

Cabbage White: As the name suggests, this caterpillar lives off cabbage as well as broccoli, cauliflower, and turnip leaves. Holes in these vegetable leaves are indicators of the presence of this caterpillar. They are pale green and covered in short velvet-like hairs. This caterpillar can be found in any open areas with plants in the mustard family.

### **Damage Causing Caterpillars**

There are at least three invasive caterpillars that can be found defoliating leaves of hardwood trees such as aspen, oaks, and birch.

Eastern Tent Caterpillar: The eastern tent caterpillar. Malacosoma americanum, is a conspicuous sight in early spring in Wisconsin. Those white masses in the forks of tree limbs are created by colonies of caterpillars. The tent protects them from predators, such as birds, and from temperature extremes. They come out of their silken webs to feed in early morning, evening or at night when it is not too cold. They return to the nest during the heat of the day and remain in the tent during rainy or cold weather. Forest Tent Caterpillar: The forest tent caterpillar is an important leaf-eating (defoliating) caterpillar in Wisconsin. Some people call forest tent caterpillars "army worms" because as they travel across the ground they look like marching soldiers. Forest tent caterpillars are about 2 inches long with colorful bodies covered by many hairs. The sides of their bodies are blue with narrow orange stripes. Their backs are black with white markings that resemble keyholes, penguins, or footprints. Gypsy Moth Caterpillar: European gypsy moths were accidentally introduced into Massachusetts in 1869 by an amateur entomologist. Since then, gypsy moths have defoliated millions of acres of trees in forests and urban areas in at least 20 states and the Washington DC area. Gypsy moth caterpillars feed on more than 300 species of deciduous and evergreen trees. Gypsy moths were first found in Wisconsin in the late 1960s in the eastern part of the state. By 1989, they had settled along Wisconsin's eastern shore from Milwaukee to Green Bay. Moths have since been found in every county. The eastern two-thirds of the state is considered generally infested and is quarantined. The quarantine prohibits the movement of items that could harbor gypsy moth eggs, caterpillars or adults and allow them to be moved to uninfested areas.

Society is touring a new travelling display, "We Stand on their Shoulders," which celebrates the history of Wisconsin women and voting. The banner exhibit will be on display at the Three Lakes Historical Society and Museum from August 3rd-August 14th.

"The year 2020, marks one hundred years since some women were granted the right to vote," said Jenny Kalvaitis, Coordinator of Secondary Education at the Wisconsin Historical Society. "But what a lot of people may not realize is that Wisconsin was the first state to ratify the 19th Amendment and pass a statewide Equal Rights Amendment."

"We Stand on their Shoulders: A History of Wisconsin Women and Voting" explores women's suffrage and leadership after the ratification of the 19th Amendment. The 19th Amendment laid the groundwork to enfranchise women but did not extend voting rights to all. A series of additional legislation between 1920 and 1982 broadened opportunities for women of all races to vote. This exhibit explores the landmark legislation, political advancements of women from 1919-1982, and the continuing conversation surrounding voting rights.
