Conservation Corner

Earlier this summer, botanists discovered a population of the wetland invasive plant European frog-bit (Hydrocharis morsus-ranae) in Oconto County. This is the first time this species, which is widespread along the coastal areas of lakes Erie and Huron up to the eastern Upper Peninsula, has been found in the wild in Wisconsin.

The population was discovered north of the city of Oconto near Lake Michigan.

European frog-bit grows in shallow, quiet, or slow-moving water; along the edges of lakes, rivers, and streams; and in swamps, marshes, and ditches. It is a free-floating, stoloniferous aquatic plant that can grow to form dense floating mats of interlocking plants. The leaves are leathery, measure 0.5-2.5" across, and are round to heart-shaped. The flower has three white petals and the stem has horizontal runners that produce new plants.

The dense growth form of this species can get caught in boat motors, affect fish and waterfowl movement, and decrease oxygen levels in water as plants decompose.

European frog-bit is extremely difficult and costly to control, and its ability to form new plants vegetatively has allowed it to spread and proliferate quickly. The plant has been declared a noxious weed in parts of the United States.

If you see European frog-bit, take one or more photos, make note of the location, date, and time of the observation, and report to Forest County Land & Water, lcc@co.forest.wi.us or 715-478-1387.

1011 cases of covid-19 (24 active) confirmed in Forest County

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed 24 additional persons has been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) in the last week, for a total of 1011 cases in Forest County. County health officials and local partners are contacting others with whom the individuals who tested positive had close contact with. As of Thursday, August 12th, Forest County has 5,259 negative test results. There are currently 24 active cases in isolation, 962 released from isolation, 3 hospitalized, and 27 deaths related to COVID-19.

The Forest County Health Department encourages community members to practice good hand hygiene, wear a mask or cloth face covering when necessary, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are experiencing any symptoms or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please contact your health care provider and ask to be tested. If you are interested in a COVID-19 vaccine, please call our office or your primary care provider.

In an effort to keep our community members up to date on COVID-19, the Forest County Health Department will continue to update our Facebook page and local newspapers every two weeks with current COVID-19 case counts. This will include the number of negative and positive cases in Forest County. Please call our office at 715-478-3371 with any questions or concerns.

Adopting State's guidance for K-12 schools is best way to create a safer return to school

The Wisconsin Association of Local Health Departments and Boards (WALHDAB) supports the goal of keeping students in the classroom for in-person learning for the 2021-2022 school year. As schools prepare for the upcoming school year, WALHDAB urges schools to follow recently published state guidance to better protect the health and safety of students and staff.

Adopting the following basic prevention strategies will provide schools the best opportunity to establish a safer environment necessary to sustain inperson learning throughout the school year. The Delta variant is one of the most contagious respiratory viruses and it spreads more easily and quickly than other variants.

"These recommendations come as our state experiences a surge in COVID-19 cases caused by the Delta variant, now the dominant strain of COVID-19 across the United States and in Wisconsin", says Darren Rausch, WALHDAB Co-President and Greenfield Health Department Health Officer/Director.

A second white cottage was moved onto the property to accommodate family and friends. The children, grandchildren and great grandchildren of Patty (Bess) and John O'Keefe (married in 1937) continue to enjoy the lake, now Lake Lucerne. O'Keefe family members are traveling from California in August to join the family members who occupy four cabins on Lake Lucerne. On the agenda: fishing, campfire stories about old adventures on the lake, visits to old haunts such as Johnnie's, pontoon rides and hikes to PONDEVRON on Davison's Tree farm.





CDC continues to recommend that people who are not fully vaccinated maintain physical distance of at least three feet from other people at school. Several studies from 2021 school year show low COVID-19 transmission levels among students in schools that had less than six feet of physical distance when the school implemented universal masking and other layered prevention strategies.

Schools should work with their local health department to manage contact tracing efforts. Isolating those with positive COVID-19 test results, and quarantining close contacts helps all of us get ahead of the spread.

CDC recommends offering symptomatic testing and screening testing depending on community transmission, population, and activity. See the CDC website for more information.

Practice good hygiene by covering your cough washing your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, and maintaining clean facilities. Cleaning once a day is enough to sufficiently remove potential virus that may be on surfaces. Visit the CDC's website for more information.

This effort requires a commitment from all of us that share a vision of healthier and safer return to in-classroom These recommendations are by no means exhaustive or static. Intervention and control measures should be based on the most recent guidance available from local, state, and federal public health and healthcare authorities. State guidance K-12 Cont. from pg. 1

Masking is a proven tool in mitigating the spread of the COVID-19 virus. Masks are particularly important in a school setting given the significant portion of the student population that is either not vaccinated, or not yet eligible to receive the vaccine. Mask use, regardless of vaccination status is therefore the safest way for everyone in schools to protect themselves and prevent transmission to others. This recommendation is in alignment with guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), and the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS). Masking all ages regardless of vaccination status is a key component and important to incorporate as school starts to keep kids healthy and safe in school.

Promote Vaccination

Vaccination continues to be our best path towards ending the COVID-19 pandemic and a critical strategy to help schools sustain a safe in-classroom learning environment. On May 12, Wisconsin expanded COVID-19 vaccine eligibility to include adolescents aged 12-15. Schools are asked to promote vaccines among staff, families, and students by providing information, encouraging vaccine trust/confidence, and establishing supportive policies and practices that make vaccination easy and convenient.

Implement a Layered Approach to Mitigation

Again, the Delta variant has demonstrated increased transmissibility and all available layers of protection to lessen the spread of disease are important. WALHDAB strongly recommends using a layered approach. Adopting layered strategies, in addition to masking and vaccination, provide the best chances to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 and create healthier and safer in-classroom learning environments for students,





Need help with Medicare costs?

If you have Medicare and you're facing challenges with paying for health care, you may be eligible for programs that can help you save money on medical and drug costs. People with limited income and resources may qualify for Medicaid, a joint federal and state program that helps with medical costs.

Even if you don't qualify for Medicaid, Medicare Savings Programs may be able to help you pay your Medicare premiums and other costs. If your income is \$1,449 or less for an individual, or \$1,959 for a couple, and your resources are under \$7,970 for an individual or \$11,960 for a couple, you may already be eligible for one of these programs.

If you qualify for Medicaid or one of the Medicare Savings Programs, you'll automatically get Extra Help paying for your prescription drugs. Extra Help is a Medicare program that helps people with limited income and resources pay Medicare prescription drug costs, like premiums, deductibles and coinsurance.

If you don't automatically qualify for Extra Help, you may still be eligible if your income is \$1,610 or less for an individual, or \$2,177 for a couple, and your resources are under \$13,290 for an individual and \$26,520 for a couple. You can apply online for Extra Help with Social Security Administration at www.ssa.gov or by calling: 1-

800-772-1213 (TTY 1-800-325-0778).

Another program that can help with your prescription drug costs is SeniorCare, Wisconsin's prescription drug assistance program. This program is available to Wisconsin residents who are 65 years of age or older and are a U.S. citizen or have qualifying immigrant status. Your annual income determines your level of coverage in this program. For more information or to access an application online, go to: www.dhs.Wisconsin.gov/seniorcare or call 1-800-657-

It's important to call or fill out an application if you think you could qualify for savings, even if your income or resources are higher than the amounts listed above. These amounts change yearly, and you may be eligible for another savings program depending on your situation.




