Elysia enjoys spending her free time with family. Her newest hobby is creating amigurumi. She loves traveling, the outdoors, bubble baths and good coffee.



## The Blackwell Centennial A look back in time



The Flanner Sawmill in Blackwell

Blackwell's Centennial Celebration will be held on July 9th, this summer. This 100 year-old story begins with the harvesting of the tall and majestic white pines which were covering much of northern Wisconsin in the late 1800's. Pine logs are a softwood and could be floated down rivers, which were the primary means of transportation. Logs were skidded by oxen and auled over the winter by sleighs and horses to the rivers.

George C. Flanner was one of the lumbermen who came to northern Wisconsin and established a sawmill on the Rat River, called the Flanner/Steger Lumber Company. John Blackwell, for whom the town was named, was the treasurer.

The new town was formed in 1922, despite the opposition of the Connor Lumber Company. Laona worried that the loss of territory to Blackwell would give the "Crandon Bunch" too much control. To be continued.

## Covid-19 community level increases to medium in forest county

On Friday May 13th, 2022, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) updated its COVID-19 Community Levels with new local data that puts Forest County in the Medium category. The Community Levels are a tool for monitoring COVID-19 and its impact on communities, and the recent uptick in cases in Forest County have resulted in an increase in the county's level from low to medium.

CDC COVID-19 Community Levels are based on the total number of new COVID-19 cases per 100,000 people, number of new hospital admissions, and average percent of staffed inpatient beds and in the past 7 days. Low, Medium and High Community Levels determine which prevention measures are recommended for individuals and communities. Recommendations for Medium Community Level are as follows:

If you are immunocompromised or at high risk for severe disease, talk to your health care provider about whether you should wear a mask in public.

If you live with someone at high risk, or come in contact with people who are high risk, consider wearing a mask while indoors with them or using a home test before coming in contact with them.

If you have symptoms or were exposed, be sure to get tested and stay home while you're sick/waiting for results.

Stay up to date with your COVID-19 vaccines.

At all levels, people may choose to wear a mask based on personal preference, informed by personal level of risk or risk to household members. In addition, people with symptoms, a positive test or exposure to someone with COVID19 should wear a mask. Healthcare systems, businesses and schools may implement additional prevention strategies regardless of Community Level.

"We have been seeing cases, hospitalizations and percent positivity increase in our area over these past few weeks due to the COVID-19 Omicron subvariants," said Samantha Hoffman, Forest County Health Department director/health officer. "The medium level does not indicate a crisis level, but it does signal that the risk of infection is increasing in our communities and provides guidance for lowering the risk for yourself and those around you, especially if someone has a high risk for severe disease."

Staying up to date on your COVID-19 vaccines is the best thing you can do, no matter the community level. If you are looking for a COVID-19 vaccine, consider the following opportunities:



#### **Bullheads Be Gone!** Volunteers needed!

The Lake Metonga Association (LMA) is once again asking for the public's help to remove black bullheads from Lake Metonga, as they are at nuisance levels in the lake which hurts the walleye and perch populations. Since 2008 LMA has been working with Mike Preul (Mole Lake Fisheries Biologist) and Greg Matzke (DNR Fisheries Biologist Forest and Florence Counties) to decrease the numbers of bullheads in the lake. It has been proven that bullheads can have a negative effect on the walleve and perch populations in the lake as they forage on the young of the year walleye and perch. This sort of behavior makes it so that there are less walleye and perch growing into those nice eaters everyone loves to catch!

From 2008 to 2017, approximately 33,000 bullheads were removed by electrofishing and netting; however, in 2018-2020 no removals were done due to multiple events, and this let the bullhead population rebound! Last summer the Fisheries and Habitat Committee (part of the Lake Association) began a bullhead removal project, which was very successful. Mike Preul's team was able to remove about 12,500 adults and volunteers netted approx. 1 million minnows. After these efforts last year, more walleye young of the year were seen in a DNR survey than there were the previous couple of years. If you love your fishing opportunities and wish for them to possibly get better, help with bullhead removals this summer! The Lake Association needs help to net out the bullhead minnows when you see them, along with keeping any adults you may catch!





#### Conservation Corner Cont. from pg. 1

As temperatures warm and plants start emerging again, we in the Conservation Department start thinking of unwanted plants. The Most Common Invasive Plants in North America are:

Barberries, Buckthorn, Garlic mustard, Japanese honeysuckle, Japanese knotweed, Purple loosestrife, Queen Anne's lace, Purple loosestrife, which has taken over many a backyard garden, has now taken to our natural wetlands. A vigorous grower, it crowdsout native plants, eliminating cover and essential food sources needed by wetlandwildlife.

Purple loosestrife isn't the only invasive plant causing problems in natural landscapes.

Norway and Amur maples have joined buckthorn and honeysuckle as woodland invaders.

Do a little research before adding new plants to your landscape. Select plants suited for the growing conditions in your backyard. Then, check with us at your local Conservation Department or an area nursery for a list of invasive plants that plague your

Though the list of potential irritation-inducing plants is long, not all gardeners will be affected by some or even any - of these plants. The best tactics to avoid the itch are to be careful about what you plant, be diligent about wearing protective garden garb and learn maintenance strategies that'll keep your landscape looking good...and your skin rash-free.

Infamous plants like poison ivy or even some ornamental euphorbias also contain irritants in their saps that result in a painful and itchy rash. Don long sleeves if you plan to garden around or weed these irritants out of your landscape. Immediately wash the irritating oils off your body and clothing to avoid further exposure and expansion of the rash.

Oddly enough, gas plant, wild parsnip and garlic mustard sap cause a rash only when the irritating oils are exposed to sunlight. That's why some gardeners weed at dusk or by their landscape lighting to eliminate the risk. But if you can work around these irritants only by the light of day, wear long sleeves and gloves and wash skin

Those with small children and pets may want to avoid planting the very toxic datura commonly known as Jimson weed, and castor bean.

The seed in the fleshy red fruit of the yew the nuts of horse chestnut trees and all parts of the oleander plant are also toxic. And let's not forget the wild mushrooms Mother Nature sometimes scatters in the yard. Try growing an indoor mushroom kit instead!

That said, perhaps the most important thing we for our children is to curb their sense of adventure when it comes to eating wild plants. You should also keep houseplants, seeds and bulbs out of the reach of small children and pets. And store all garden chemicals in their original containers in a secure location. And try natural ways to kill weeds and eliminate insect pests rather than noxious chemicals.

Lastly, reduce the risk by identifying and labeling all your landscape plants. As a gardener, it is great to have a record of what's planted where. But as a parent or pet owner, you never know when this kind of information will be useful in the case of an emergency.





Nicolet College set to launch summer Outdoor Adventure season



Anyone interested in exploring the outdoors and learning new skills is invited to attend any of the 30-plus offerings in the upcoming Outdoor Adventure program at Nicolet College.

"The Outdoor Adventure program is all about creating that pathway for people to get outside, enjoy new experiences, and learn new skills," said Terry Rutlin, Outdoor Adventure coordinator at Nicolet College.

"Over the past couple of years we've seen an

"Over the past couple of years we've seen an increasing number of people in classes and it's exciting to see so many new faces and see the enjoyment they experience on any number of adventures."

As is customary, the upcoming slate of classes will feature several new offerings as well as traditional, longtime favorites.

New classes include a multi-day fly fishing adventure to the scenic Bois Brule River in northwestern Wisconsin, how to train retriever bird hunting dogs, primitive fire starting with a bow drill, and wild rice processing, among others.

Long-time favorites include the popular Loon Paddle on the Turtle-Flambeau Flowage with loon experts Terry Daulton and Jeff Wilson, the Kayak/Canoe Cookout on the Willow Flowage, and the assortment of instructional kayak, paddleboard, canoe, and mountain bike classes that increase the skill level of individuals interested in

A growing trend in recent years has been the popularity of foraging-oriented classes. One of those is On the Hunt for Wild Mushrooms, which was first held three years ago.

"Back then if someone would have told me mushroom hunting would be as popular as it is, I think I would have had a hard time believing them," Rutlin said. "But every time we've offered it the class has filled. We've also added a second class and that's always filled as well. People clearly are interested in wild mushrooms and want to learn as much as they can about them and also identify which mushrooms are safe to eat and which ones need to be avoided."

Building on that popularity, the college is also offering a class that teaches individuals how to grow their own shiitake and oyster mushrooms.

Other related offerings include Foraging in the Northwoods, which provides broad-based instruction on general foraging, and Fall Wild Cranberry Foraging, where students learn about wild cranberries and also visit an area sphagnum bog to collect a bounty of berries.

New this is year is the Wild Rice Processing class, which will teach individuals how to properly prepare their rice after it has been harvested.

Outdoor photography classes include an afternoon workshop on the shores of Lake Superior with noted photographer and writer Jeff Rennicke, as well as a general outdoor photography class and another that focuses specifically on fall photography.

## Wisconsin DNR warns of extremely high fire danger

MADISON, Wis. – The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is asking the public to avoid burning due to very high fire danger across most of Wisconsin.

Areas with VERY HIGH fire danger today include Adams, Ashland, Barron, Bayfield, Brown, Buffalo, Burnett, Calumet, Chippewa, Clark, Door, Douglas, Dunn, Eau Claire, Florence, Fond du Lac, Forest, Green Lake, Iron, Jackson, Juneau, Kewaunee, La Crosse, Langlade, Lincoln, Manitowoc, Marathon, Marinette, Marquette, Menominee, Monroe, Oconto, Oneida, Outagamie, Pepin, Pierce, Polk, Portage, Price, Rusk, Sawyer, Shawano, Sheboygan, St. Croix, Trempealeau, Taylor, Vilas, Washburn, Waupaca, Waushara, Winnebago and Wood counties.

Areas with HIGH fire danger include Columbia, Crawford, Dane, Dodge, Grant, Green, Iowa, Jefferson, Kenosha, Lafayette, Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Racine, Richland, Rock, Sauk, Vernon, Walworth, Washington and Waukesha

DNR burning permits for debris piles, barrels and broadcast burns are suspended in 36 counties today where the DNR has authority to regulate burning.

In the last week, 127 wildfires have burned nearly 100 acres, most of which were related to down powerlines, with some resulting from debris burning, equipment and lightning. The DNR has responded to 450 fires burning over 630 acres so far this year.

Quick response times by the DNR, local fire departments and aerial suppression resources have minimized fire growth keeping most fires small to just over one acre in size.

The southern half of the state is greening up, which is moderating fire potential, yet this part of the state is currently in High fire danger. In the north, green-up has begun in the heavier soils and hardwoods, but vegetation in the dry, sandy and pine areas remains vulnerable to large fire growth. The pine in those dry areas is in a stage where the moisture levels are at their lowest point resulting in increased flammability in the crowns of the trees making fires challenging to control and suppress.

Any fire could quickly start and spread in these conditions. To help us keep Wisconsinites safe, the DNR is asking the public to avoid outdoor burning, including limiting the use of campfires until conditions improve.

Cooler temperatures and some small chances of rain occurring over the coming days should help moderate fire danger and foster further greening of vegetation.

Be fire smart. Fire danger and burning restrictions changes daily – check before you burn after 11 a.m. each day for the most up-to-date fire danger and any burning restrictions.

Check daily fire danger, wildfire reports and burning restrictions on the DNR website at bit.ly/WiFireDanger.

#### Nicolet receives \$1 million in grants

Keeping with its commitment to continually improve higher education in the Northwoods, Nicolet College recently applied for and received nearly \$1 million in grants from the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) to advance instruction and services in numerous academic areas.

"In the end the biggest beneficiaries of these grants will be the students," said Nicolet President Kate Ferrel. "They'll learn the skills and receive a quality education that leads to careers with family-supporting wages."

"In addition, the local economies in the Northwoods will also reap rewards by having that skilled workforce businesses need to be efficient, productive, and profitable."

In all, Nicolet applied for and received 13 state grants that will total \$989,348.

The WTCS awards grants annually and Ferrel made special note of the fact that Nicolet received all of the grants for which it applied.

The largest grant, \$350,000, will be used to further expand the college's "family" of patient simulators used to train students in Health Occupations programs.

This next generation of simulators will have advanced features that allow students to practice on what is known as high-risk, low-volume scenarios.

"Clinical training where students go out and work in health care settings is a central part of the education for many Health Occupations students," said Candy Dailey, dean of Health Occupations at Nicolet.

"But being a rural area with relatively low patient volumes compared to larger urban areas, the students may not be exposed to that wide of a range of health conditions even though they are spending several months in these facilities. What these new simulators will allow us to do is create a variety of high-risk health scenarios that aren't that common and thereby expanding their experience base when they start careers in health care facilities."

Other funds will go to developing and implementing diversity, equity, and inclusion work across campus, culturally relevant curriculum within program areas, and the piloting of virtual reality assessment and simulations.

Grants will also go to enhance a variety of student support services at the college, upgrade the Career Services and Career Coaching programs at Nicolet, and support work-based experiential learning opportunities for students. Money from this family of grants will also be used to fund the Student Emergency Assistance program, which helps students pay for a variety of unexpected life events that would otherwise force them to drop out of college.

Still other funds will be directed toward programs for all middle and high school students in the Nicolet District visiting the college for career and college exploration events. These will include the Career Expo for seventh graders and the Heavy Metal Tour for eighth graders. High school students will have the opportunity to attend College Visit Day, Skills Competition Day, and Live From the Heart, an on-campus event where students interested in health care careers will video-conference in to watch a live heart surgery.

"At its core it's all about creating opportunity for students, giving them the tools, knowledge, skills, and experiences they can benefit from in whatever professional endeavor they choose," President Ferrel said.

#### City-dwelling fox, coyote population presentation May 25 at Nicolet College

Ever see a fox or coyote where it seemingly shouldn't be? Maybe crossing a busy city street or cruising through a neighborhood packed with houses?

Increasingly, such interactions are becoming much more common in the Northwoods and across the state, even in such unlikely places as downtown Madison.

Since 2014, University of Wisconsin - Madison Wildlife Professor David Drake has been researching this growing natural phenomena and will bring his latest findings to Nicolet College for a special presentation at 9:30 a.m., Wednesday, May 25, in the Nicolet College Theatre.

Sponsored by UW-Madison's Badger Talks program, Nicolet College, and the college's Learning in Retirement program, the event is free and open to the public.

"Traditionally, much of our knowledge and research on foxes and coyotes has been from rural or wild settings,"

"With urbanization continually increasing, our studies look at how these animals use the urban landscape and how their life histories and behaviors change as a result. A big part of this involves their relationship with humans."

Drake's curiosity was sparked after he routinely began spotting red fox and coyotes on the densely-packed UW-Madison campus and even living under a campus building. This led him to launch the UW Urban Canid Project.

To study these urban canines, Drake and his team of researchers live-trap and radio-collar these animals. These collars allow researchers to remotely monitor the animals' locations without having to see or disturb them. Collecting location data over a long period of time allows researchers to better understand where animals are spending their time and what factors may be drawing them there.

Blood, nasal, and fecal samples are also collected to analyze what diseases are prevalent in the fox and coyote populations in Madison.

"These animals interact with humans on a daily basis, most often without ever being noticed," Drake explained. "And understanding the health of these canines can have direct implications when it comes to the health of domestic

Over 200 Badger Talks are hosted around the state each year, featuring faculty and staff with expertise in a variety of disciplines.

The presentation is part of Learning in Retirement's Ced's Nature Series, named after local long-time educator, writer, and naturalist Ced A. Vig, who started the nature series in the late 1990s.




