Chamber Receives \$30,000 Marketing Grant

The Wisconsin Department of Tourism recently awarded \$356,534 in Joint Effort Marketing (JEM) grants. JEM grants provide partnership funding to help nonprofit Wisconsin organizations promote tourism, including 501(c)(6) organizations such as Convention and Visitor Bureaus and Chambers of Commerce.

The Forest County Chamber of Commerce was awarded \$30,000 for a Year 2 JEM grant to promote Crandon Rocks. Crandon Rocks Labor Day Weekend is a four-day event that will be held September 1st through September 4th. Festivities will be held at the Crandon International Off-Road Raceway, as well as at various businesses throughout Forest County.

"The latest round of JEM grants shows off some of Wisconsin's one-of-a-kind events and destinations," said Governor Tony Evers. "Wisconsin outpaced the national average for travel spending recovery compared to 2019 for 24 months in a row, and it's projects like these that will continue to spur tourism's recovery and uplift local communities."

Water lovers of all ages are invited to join Forest County Association of Lakes (FCAL) and local watershed protection groups on a search for aquatic invasive species on Friday, August 19th, 8:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m., at the Lake Lucerne Advancement Association pavilion.

Snapshot Day is a fun, hands-on effort that relies on participants to monitor streams, lakes, and wetlands at designated sites around Wisconsin to look for signs of non-native plants and animals that pose risks to Wisconsin waterways and wildlife. Information collected will be provided to the WI DNR to inform and guide monitoring and response efforts.

"It isn't a huge time commitment for volunteers, but Snapshot Day is a great way for people to experience meaningful community science in Wisconsin," said River Alliance of Wisconsin Aquatic Invasive Species Program Director Ellen Voss. "Volunteers come away with a sense of how everyone plays a role in protecting Wisconsin's rivers and lakes."

"Early detection is key to keeping problematic species in check," said Voss.





Bonus antlerless permits on sale starting on August 15

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) today announced that bonus antlerless harvest authorizations will be available for purchase starting at 10 a.m. on Monday, Aug. 15 online through the Go Wild license portal and at license sales locations.

Deer population levels vary throughout the state. and antierless harvest opportunities vary by management zone. This allows for greater harvest opportunities where deer are abundant and a more conservative harvest where deer are fewer in number.

Bonus antlerless harvest authorizations, formerly known as tags, are available for purchase in all deer management units (DMUs) for the 2022 season.

Bonus authorizations are sold at a rate of one per person per day until sold out or until the 2022 deer hunting season ends. Bonus authorizations are \$12 each for Wisconsin residents, \$20 each for non-residents and \$5 each for youth ages 11 and under.

A list of units with bonus antlerless harvest authorizations available for purchase is available on the DNR website.

Each day at 9:45 a.m., an online queuing system will be put in place to manage volume. At 10 a.m., all online users waiting on the Go Wild system will be randomly assigned a number and staged into a virtual queue.

There is no advantage for customers who enter the site before 9:45 a.m. Please note that customers who enter the site after the randomization at 10 a.m. will be added to the end of the virtual queue in the order in which they arrive.

When accessing Go Wild, follow the prompts until you reach your personalized dashboard. To purchase a bonus antlerless harvest authorization, click the "Buy Licenses" button from the dashboard to open the sales catalog. From there, you will find "Bonus Antlerless Harvest Authorization" at the very top of the list. If you have not had the chance to get your license in advance, you can purchase one after you select the bonus antierless harvest authorization in Go Wild.

Hunters will need to know the deer management

zone and unit in which they intend to hunt. They will also need to determine whether they will hunt on public or private land to make their purchase.

The first three days of bonus sales are management zone-specific, and the fourth day is open to all zones:

Aug. 15, 10 a.m. - Forest Zones (Northern and Central).

Aug. 16, 10 a.m. - Central Farmland Zone.

Aug. 17, 10 a.m. - Southern Farmland Zone.

Aug. 18, 10 a.m. - All zones available.

As a reminder, a minimum of one Farmland (Zone 2) antlerless harvest authorization is included with each deer hunting license purchase in units that offer them. Some units will offer more than one antlerless deer harvest authorization with each deer license.

Forest County has 250 permits available.

7 tips to help encourage your child to exercise

Exercising is good for anyone of any age, but it can be crucial in adolescents. According to the Center for Disease Control (CDC) less than one-quarter of children 6 to 17 years of age participate in the recommended 60 minutes of physical activity every day.

place August 7 to 13. This week is dedicated to helping encourage parents and guardians to empower their children to be physically active every day. Staying active together and being a role model for a healthy life can help children build confidence while teaching them the importance of physical activity.

"Exercising with your child regularly can teach them how fun and exciting physical activity can be," says Dr. Erika Crockford at the Aspirus Eagle River Clinic. "Lifestyle

habits that are learned in childhood are much more likely to stay with a person into adulthood. When sports and physical activities are a family priority, it provides children and parents with a strong foundation for a healthy lifestyle."

Here are 7 other great ways to help encourage children to be physically active, according to American Academy of Pediatrics:

• Emphasize fun. Find a sport that the child enjoys. The more they enjoy the activity, the more likely they will be to continue

· Choose an activity that is developmentally appropriate. For example, a 7- or 8-year-old child is not ready for weightlifting or a 3-mile run, but soccer, bicycle riding, and swimming are all great activities for kids this age.

 Provide a safe environment. Make sure the child's equipment and where they practice or play is safe. Make sure the child's clothing is comfortable and appropriate for the activity.

· Provide active toys. Young children especially need easy access to balls, jump ropes, and other active toys.

Be a role model. Children who regularly see their parents enjoying sports and physical activity are more likely to do so themselves.

 Set limits. Limit screen time, including time spent on TV, videos, computers, and video games, each day. Use the free time for more physical activities.

 Make time for exercise. Some children are so overscheduled with homework, music lessons, and other planned activities that they do not have time for exercise. · Make sure the child has a convenient time and place to

Planning around both parents and children's schedules may be difficult, but it's a crucial bonding experience that can influence a child's lifestyle and health.



Baldwin Pushes for Stronger Federal Response to Monkeypox Public Health Emergency

WASHINGTON, D.C. – U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin is urging a more robust federal response to the ongoing Monkeypox Public Health Emergency.

Senator Baldwin joined a group of senators led by Senator Jeff Merkley (D-OR) in a letter to Senate Majority Leader Charles Schumer (D-NY) and Minority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY) urging the Senate to include critical funding to address the monkeypox (MPV)/orthopoxvirus Public Health Emergency (PHE) in any forthcoming legislative package in the 117th Congress.

In their letter, the Senators spotlight that the United States public health system remains on the frontlines in identifying MPV cases, informing Americans about access to vaccines and therapeutics, and connecting constituents to necessary medical care and resources. Yet this system continues to be strained by the COVID-19 pandemic and underfunded.

"MPV testing efforts are currently encountering processing and collection barriers that have led to underreporting of cases and poor data to aid the federal government in directing necessary resources in an appropriate manner," the Senators wrote. "Additionally, as both a prophylaxis and treatment, acquiring and administering vaccines swiftly is crucial to stemming the spread of MPV and protecting all communities across the United States. Finally, clinics and providers are facing additional barriers in clinical services supplies, education for providers to properly identify MPV, vaccines, testing supplies, contact tracing, and community outreach to bolster our public health response to MPV, and ensure that accurate and adequate information is reaching our constituents."

Volunteers are also key to the success of the free event.

"Snapshot Day is a great opportunity for community members to get out and work together to check our streams and rivers for potentially harmful invasive species," said St. Croix River Association Invasive Species Program Lead Angelique Dahlberg. "Last year, we found an Asian clam the furthest north it's been documented in the St. Croix. Understanding where these species are is invaluable to resource managers and understanding what is out there and why it could be harmful is invaluable to our communities."

No experience is necessary, and training is provided virtually prior to the event and at the volunteer meetup site. Recommended for ages 8 and up, and minors must be accompanied by an adult.

WI DNR defines invasive species as, "plants, animals and pathogens that cause harm to the economy, environment and/or human health." Invasive species are often non-native but it is important to remember that not all non-native species are invasive. Invasive species are typically generalists - they can utilize a wide range of resources and survive in a wide variety of environmental conditions. Faster growth rates or earlier reproductive maturity often help invasive species establish rapidly. When coupled with a reproductive advantage of sheer numbers - think hundreds of seeds or millions of eggs they can have more offspring survive and continue the cycle. There are often a lack of predators or disease to control these growing populations allowing AIS to continue breeding, eating, and out-competing native species in Wisconsin.



Early lung cancer detection

WAUSAU, Wis. - Lung Cancer is commonly associated with people who smoke, but the reality is not everyone who smokes gets cancer.

August 1 is World Lung Cancer Day. According to the American Cancer Society, lung cancer is the second most common cancer in both men and women (not counting skin cancer) and is by far the leading cause of cancer death among both men and women. Each year, more people die of lung cancer than of colon, breast, and prostate cancers combined.

Some people with early lung cancer have symptoms, but most lung cancers do not cause any symptoms until they have already spread. "If you talk to your provider when you first notice symptoms, your cancer might be diagnosed at an earlier stage when treatment is more likely to be effective," says Dr. Christopher Peterson, Aspirus Medical Oncologist. "In addition, even if you do not have symptoms, you should discuss your history of smoking with your provider."

The most common symptoms of lung cancer are:

• A cough that does not go away or gets worse.

· Coughing up blood or rust-colored sputum (spit or

·Chest pain that is often worse with deep breathing, coughing, or laughing

Hoarseness

Weight loss and loss of appetite

Shortness of breath

Feeling tired or weak

•Infections such as bronchitis and pneumonia that don't go away or keep coming back

New onset of wheezing

If lung cancer spreads to distant organs, it may cause:

• Bone pain (like pain in the back or hips)

 Nervous system changes (such as headache, weakness or numbness of an arm or leg, dizziness, balance problems, or seizures), from cancer spread to the brain or spinal cord

· Yellowing of the skin and eyes (jaundice), from cancer spread to the liver

·Lumps near the surface of the body, due to cancer spreading to the skin or to lymph nodes (collections of immune system cells), such as those in the neck or above the collarbone


· Most of these symptoms are more likely to be caused by something other than lung cancer. Still, if you have any of these problems, it's important to see your doctor right away so the cause can be found and treated, if needed.
