The Laona and Wabeno Rebel Drama and Music Departments are presenting the musical, *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown* in the Nancy Volk Theatre at Wabeno High School on March 9-12, 2023

About the Show: Almost everyone knows cartoonist Charles M. Schulz's loveable characters who began appearing in the Peanuts syndicated comic strips when they debuted in 1950. Schulz's sweet, funny, and innocent child characters have been entertaining audiences for almost 75 years.

In the early 1960s, composer Clark Gesner began writing songs based on the Peanuts characters. Eventually, Charles Schulz gave Gesner permission to produce the songs and create a musical. The first production of the musical, *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown,* premiered off-Broadway in March of 1967. The show ran for almost four years with a total of 1,597 performances, closing in February of 1971.

Six favorite characters appear in the original musical cast, including Charlie Brown (David Nelson), his quirky dog, Snoopy (Autumn Warden), the blanket hugging, Linus (Lauren Harris), his older and annoying sister, Lucy (Ab Peterson), Lucy's friend, Patty (Madison Thomson) and, of course, the child pianist, Schroeder (Jedediah Sarratt TH/SAT, Lizzy Novak FRI/SUN).

The script includes a series of vignettes that feature the characters reenacting favorite moments from the Peanuts comic strip. The title song, "You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown," shows all of Charlie Brown's friends praising him for being a "good man." Other scenes include Lucy as the "doctor," Schroeder being pursued by Lucy, Charlie Brown rallying his team during a losing baseball game, Snoopy daydreaming about the "Red Baron," Charlie Brown trying to fly a kite, and much more.

Kierra O'Keefe is in charge of painting all of the scenery and props and managing the backstage. Kelsey Beaber is the principal lighting technician, and Brian Sears is the audio technician. Nora May Kamke is assisting with the costumes and makeup. Ezekiel Sarratt has helped with the set construction and acted as a production assistant. In addition, Lauren Harris has assisted with painting the scenery and props, and Trina Ward is a show helper.

Directing the production is WHS English and drama teacher, Janet DeJean Newton. Under the direction of WHS Band Director, Michelle Boor, members of the WHS band will accompany some of the musical numbers: Maddy Calhoun, Ted Gust, Mitsuki Nelson, and Treyton Schaefer. Both Michele Boor and her husband, Jason, Boor will also perform in some of the numbers, along with WHS alumni, Nat Johnson. WHS music teacher, Charisa Statezny, has been teaching the cast the music and will play some of the piano accompaniment.

# Crandon Area Community Foundation

The Crandon Area Community Foundation (CACF) held its annual board of directors meeting at Lake Ave Restaurant on February 8th. Current board members are Jill Krueger, President, Brian Schultz, Vice Pres,/Treasurer, Karen McMillion, Secretary, RT Krueger, board member, Andy McMillion, board member. The 501 C3 non-profit organization had a slow start when it was established a couple years ago just as the pandemic first hit. The organization definitely made up for lost time in 2022 however!

The goal of CACF is to support community projects with funding, time and logistical assistance. We work on beneficial projects that lack the support of a formal organization behind them and work with established organizations on their projects that just need a little extra funding or man-power.

Several of the Foundation's current projects were discussed at the meeting. In 2022, we initiated a program in cooperation with the City of Crandon to place advertising signs on the ballfields at Cardinal and Palmer Parks. Our initial efforts were very successful and we hope to build on this in 2023. Businesses, organizations and even private individuals can purchase a sign. All proceeds (after an initial fee that goes to a local small business) will be put toward City park projects.

Another major project underway is the revitalization of the Veterans Memorial on the courthouse grounds. In the summer and fall of 2022, an effort coordinated among CACF, American Legion Post 94 and the Crandon Area Historical Society carefully inventoried and removed historical items from the building, removed display cases, patched and painted, and prepared the building for a new look in 2023. There is still a need for articles, artifacts, photos and information for the new exhibits. If you have information, would like to assist with research, or assist with the building project, please call Jill Krueger at 715-478-3139. In addition to the building project, there will be new signage for the tank and cannon and the cannon's wheels will be repaired. The initial funding for this project was provided by local donations and CoVantage Cares Foundation.

The greatest current proposed project is the renovations of the tennis/pickleball courts at Cardinal Park. CACF received a significant private donation toward this effort but the project still poses significant financial and logistical hurdles.

The CACF board discussed a number of additional on-going projects. Watch for more updates, here and on our Facebook page, regarding the community gardens, Park Louise and other projects and activities over the upcoming months. 


