

Sara Witter Connor has recently published a book titled *Wisconsin's Flying Trees in World War II*. She has done extensive research over a number of years to find the information needed to chronicle the efforts made by the Lake States logging and lumber industry to help the Allies win World War II.

Did you know that one of the most effective planes used during the War was the British Mosquito and that the plane was constructed of plywood? And, that much of that plywood came from Wisconsin? To be more exact, much of the plywood used in the Mosquito and our gliders and the famed Spruce Goose came from the Roddis Lumber and Veneer plant in Marshfield, Wisconsin.

In her book, Connor covers the timber industry war effort from the stump to the skies over Europe, when the famed Mosquito was making daily raids on the European continent, and when U.S. soldiers dropped from the skies behind the Normandy beaches on D-Day.

Sara has done a tremendous job documenting these efforts in word and vintage pictures. It is well worth the read!







Intern to work with Wisconsin Wins Program

Meagan Neis from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, is joining the Wisconsin Wins project and visiting tobacco license holders to find out which businesses are complying with the law and which ones may need to provide their employees with more training regarding tobacco sales. Neis will be working in six counties: Oneida, Forest, Lincoln, Florence, Vilas, and Price.

WI Wins was launched in the spring of 2002 as part of a comprehensive approach to preventing youth access to tobacco. With the help of local retailers, illegal sale rates in the six counties above have dropped from 22% in 2012 to 9 % in 2013. According to Neis, "Wisconsin Wins is an outstanding program. I am excited to work with the youth and play an active role in the culture change surrounding tobacco in the Northwoods. My goal is to help the sale and usage rate of tobacco reach 0%."

The CDC states that on average, smokers die 10 years earlier than nonsmokers and that cigarette smoking causes more than 480,000 deaths each year in the United States. This is about one in five deaths! Yet, every day in the United States 3,600 young people between the ages of 12 and 17 years initiate cigarette smoking. When clerks make a difference to decrease youth access to tobacco products, Wisconsin wins.

Knocking out Procrastination

Does this story sound very familiar?

I am sure you will agree with me that we all encounter postponements that keep us from doing what is critical for our success. We cannot always control what happens to us but we can always exercise control over how it will impact us. We do not have to let delays defeat us. We don't have to give into these energy suckers and become a victim of procrastination. Why should we leave ourselves at the mercy of 'The Guilt of the Incomplete'? But first the question arises, why do we do that?

WHY DO WE Procrastinate. Before we discover a treatment for this universal disease, 'procrastination', let us look at some of the reasons behind it.

- **1. Waiting for the right mood.** You don't feel like doing it. Your mood is o_and you are emotionally down.
- **2. Waiting for the right time.** You don't think that it is the right time to take action, when actually it is.
- **3. Lack of clear goals.** How can you feel inclined to do it when the goal is not clear?
- 4. Underestimating the difficulty of the task. You thought doing it was no big deal, but when you started you realized that you would have to put in much more effort than you first thought. So why not postpone it for now?
- **5. Unclear standards for the task outcomes.** You started but did not have an idea about exactly what was expected. You did not know the performance criteria.
- **6. Feeling the task is imposed on you.** When you think you have to do it, your motivation is reduced. Your heart and mind are not fully involved.
- **7. The task is too ambiguous.** You finally got around to doing it but the task was too vague, unclear and blurred. Then you did not find good reason to continue.
- 8. Fear. 'I don't think I can do it; if I go ahead I will not succeed.'
- **9. Perfectionism.** 'I don't have the right skills or resources to do this perfectly, so I won't do it at all.'

FROM INACTION TO ACTION

After acquiring all the tools, techniques and strategies, why do people not put into use what they know? Why do people choose inaction instead of taking action? We have identified some psychological fears. These fears suppress your inventiveness; your talents and resources remain hidden, undeveloped and untapped. These fears include:

- **1. Fear of failure.** If I were unsuccessful, how would I handle the embarrassment? It's better not to show up for this presentation. Let's procrastinate.
- **2. Fear of success.** If I do it this time, people will expect me to do it again. Will I be able to handle the pressure that comes with success?
- **3. Fear of the status quo**. If the status quo is disturbed, who knows how the new situation will turn out? Let's maintain things as they are. Why take a risk?
- **4. Fear of perfection.** If I started it now, I would not complete it until I achieved a level of perfection. Do I have time for perfection?
- 5. Fear of loss. If I did it now, I might end up losing out on a few things.

Can you recognize that you're procrastinating? How would you recognize in yourself the symptoms of procrastination?

I am listing some of them:

- Filling your day with low priority tasks from your Do list
- Reading an e-mail more than once, without starting work on it
- Starting work on a high-priority task, and almost immediately going off to make yourself a cup of coffee or check your e-mails
- Leaving an item on your To Do list undone for a long time, even though you know it's important
- Regularly saying 'Yes' and filling up your time with unimportant tasks

Why you procrastinate can depend on both you and the task. They can often be reduced to two main reasons:

- 1. You find the task unpleasant; or
- 2. You find the task overwhelming

Now that you know the symptoms and reasons for procrastinating, the question is how do you crush procrastination? How do you knock it out?



ANTI-PROCASTINATION-FORMULA

This attitude or syndrome has the potential to negatively impact your results, success and even your entire life. I have created a strategy to defeat procrastination and build results faster. I call it the IMAN TECHNIQUE. I Must Act NOW. So, are you ready to act now?

tandem of Johnny & CJ Greaves - return to Crandon Raceway for the annual running of the Brush Run, including the \$25,000 Forest County Potawatomi Community Cup Race.

Back in 1970 the Crandon Area Jaycees and some 150 volunteers, led by President Rolland Yocum, pulled off what was to be called the inaugural Crandon Brush Run 101. The day began with a breakfast at the high school, with the racers – some 100 of them in dune buggies, modified cars and trucks and motorcycles – taking off from the Forest County Fairgrounds at 1 p.m. Chicago area off-road enthusiasts Wally Schauer and Jim Zbella would win the grueling contest with a time just over three hours.

Not knowing it at the time, the city of Crandon, located 100 miles north of Green Bay, would have written the first chapter of a now 45-year storied history of off-road racing, setting the stage for what's now viewed as the Mecca of short course off-road racing – aka the Big House.

"Back then the Jaycees basically just took the Baja racing they saw on TV and re-created it through the woods around Crandon," explained current Crandon Raceway President Cliff Flannery. "It wasn't until we got bumped from one farmer's property to another that this short course idea really began to take root."

Crandon's story spread like wildfire amongst the tight-knit off-road community. And as the name recognition of the drivers grew, including off-road legend Walker Evans, Crandon's reputation as a big time event caught the attention of television producers – namely ESPN. It got so big they added a second event, a spring race, which officials rebadged as the Brush Run. And in 1989 ESPN would broadcast its first of many Crandon events, the Labor Day contest now being called the "World Championships."

The two events annually draw in the area of 75,000 fans, infusing an estimated \$10.5 million into the local economy. As one small gas station owner put it: "The Crandon races are like our second and third Christmases." Fans literally come from all over the United States to be part of the off-road happening that is the Brush Run and World Championships. The camping is a festival in and of itself, bringing family and friends back year after year to the same camping spots where the revel in year's past events while making new friends along the way.

"Everyone at Crandon Raceway is thrilled to be celebrating out 45 year this summer and look forward to seeing everyone out for the Brush Run next weekend," added Flannery. "We've got 650 volunteers that help put on this event and they'll do everything they can to make sure you have one heck of a time here at Crandon Raceway!"

Townsend Flowage Association donates to Pickerel Lake Assn.



The Pickerel Chain, located in the Town of Townsend, is comprised of three interconnected lakes: Pickerel, Little Pickerel, and Smoke. The lakes have a history of severe fish population winterkills, usually every ten to twelve years. Typically, this happens when a long cold snowy winter causes dissolved oxygen to be depleted due to aquatic vegetation die-off. This occurred in the winter of 2012-13 when an estimated 95% or over 20,000 fish perished. The seemingly unending winter of 2013-14 resulted in a second consecutive winterkill, almost totally decimating fish populations in the Chain.

In the past, the situation was dealt with by local fishermen who transplanted fish from other local lakes to repopulate the chain. This is no longer an option as concerns about the transfer of diseases and exotic species make this illegal. This means

restoring the fishery and solving the problem of recurring winterkills has become the responsibility of the land owners on the lakes. To that end, in May 2013 the Pickerel Chain Lake Association (PCLA) was formed.

According to President Steve Heimermann, PCLA's chief goals were restocking the lakes and eliminating future winterkills. "Working with the DNR, northern pike were restocked in 2013," he stated. "The group also began raising funds and stocked crappies and bluegills with those monies. Considering the history of the Chain, we began studying the feasibility of installing aeration systems in the lakes. PCLA has decided on a plan to install aeration systems in the lakes, beginning with the initial installation in Pickerel Lake in time for the winter of 2014-15. That system could cost up to \$13,000. The two smaller lakes have cost estimates of \$9,000 each, for a total of \$31,000."

Heimermann: "Since aeration systems are not sanctioned under DNR grant programs, such installations must be financed by local fund-raising efforts. The PCLA, as a new organization, is not fully tax exempt at the present time, which limits some fund raising options. Therefore, we are relying on contributions from members and supporters to raise the initial \$13,000 in time for this year's aerator installation.

The Townsend Flowage Association recently donated \$1000 to PCLA. "We are happy to help our neighbors on the Pickerel Chain," said TFA President Dan Coopman. "We understand and sympathize with their winterkill problems and support Pickerel Chain lakeowners' efforts to come up with a permanent solution."
