The Newald Mud Drags/Mud Bogs were held last Saturday in Newald. Sponsored by the Newald Fire Department, the event is part of a series under the auspices of the Upper Peninsula Mud Drag Association. Other races are held in communities around the U.P.

All of the racers were from the U.P. The fellows racing the Willys Jeep shown above are from Ishpeming. Rick Larkin and his buddy Matt race a jeep equipped with a Chevy 350 engine, differentials, transmission and transfer In spite of the fact that the only Willys parts on the vehicle is the body and the dashboard, it is still a Willys. Just ask them!

The race consists of a standing start on a mud track that is 200 feet long. Most of the vehicles will run the course in five to seven seconds. The mud bog is a pit filled with mud that is about as deep as a backhoe bucket. It was a little soupy last Saturday, and only one vehicle made it through



The course might be only 200 feet long, but the trucks are moving fast by the end of the track, and it takes more ground to get stopped than the length of the course. These fellows are racing some hot machines. When you look at the age of the trucks and jeeps in the drags, you don't see late model stuff, but the body style and age of the vehicle have little to do with the performance of the vehicle, and the drive train is not old and worn out. This is obvious when they hit high rpm's.

I would like to say the competition is fierce, but these racers are all friends, and if they win it is great, but if they don't, they still have fun. Continued on page 23

A mid-summer Crandon Community Blood Drive is being planned on Thursday, July 19 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The blood drive will take place in St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church, at 501 N. Park Avenue in Crandon

"Blood donations drop during the summer, even though the need for blood remains constant. The Crandon blood drive will help ensure that hospitals can receive a steady blood supply during this challenging time. If you haven't given blood in the past 8 weeks, I encourage you to donate blood on Thursday," urged Jan Hadsell of the Community Blood Center.

High school blood donors trying to donate eight times before graduation to receive a Gallon Grad award are encouraged to participate.

Donation appointments are highly recommended, and may be made by calling the Community Blood Center at (800)280-4102, or visiting www.save3lives.org. Walk-in donors are welcome, but scheduling an appointment keeps the total time required for a donation to less than an hour.

Blood donors must be at least 17 years old (16 with parental permission), weigh at least 110 pounds, be in general good health, and bring a photo ID. Donors are encouraged to eat a regular meal and drink plenty of fluids

Lisa Theo announces candidacy for 12th State Senate District

Lisa Theo would like to officially announce her candidacy for Wisconsin's 12th State Senate District. Lisa decided to run after watching legislators and bureaucrats in Madison put their needs ahead of priorities and values of those of us living North of Hwy 29.

"Many in Madison believe that the northern

border of Wisconsin ends at Hwy 29. We know they're wrong, that the best part of our state is North of Hwy 29,' Theo said.

One of the strongest values we are all taught in the Northwoods is go work together, and that's exactly what Theo will do. When elected she will work with members of both parties to make sure that our water, woods, wildlife and workers are protected, to bring good paying and long lasting jobs to our area, and to make sure that our recreational areas stay clean for hunters and all other users.

Since April, Theo has been traveling around the district meeting people and gaining support. She has received the endorsement of the Oneida County Deputy Sheriffs Association. Members released a statement saying that she will bring respect and balance back to state government. They also cited her balanced approach to gun ownership by saying, members "acknowledge Theo's understanding and respect of the role hunting plays in the culture and heritage of Wisconsin families."

Theo understands that hunting isn't just a sport in the Northwoods, it's who we are. She's seen first-hand the effects that a good hunt can have on our citizens through the eyes of her 80-year old father. As a boy, he spent many hours hunting in these forests to help feed his family. Although he has fewer mouths to feed today and only hunts for sport, Theo knows many people use venison and

game birds to keep their children healthy.

It was her father and mother who instilled Theo's values here in the Northwoods while she was growing up. Her father was born in Tripoli, and lived in Heafford Junction and Tomahawk. He moved to Milwaukee after high school. Her mother is from the Tilleda area west of Shawano. While Theo was growing up, both parents instilled in her a deep love of nature and the outdoors. Deer hunting seasons were spent in Tripoli, and summers were spent camping near Heafford Junction.

Now, Theo makes her home on Lake Nokomis, which is near the proposed mine in the Town of Lynne. Although she understands we need the minerals, Theo



opposes the Lynne mine because there is no way to responsibly get the minerals out of the ground without damaging the environment. She felt the same way about the proposed Penokee Hills mine and the now defunct Crandon mine. She demonstrated in Madison against the Crandon mine with her husband, Christos Theo, and sons.

Theo and her husband Christos Theo have been married 27 years, and they have three adult sons. While the children were young, she returned to school earning her Bachelors of Science in Geography at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire (UWEC), and her Masters of Science in Geography at the University of Wisconsin-Madison (UW-Madison). She was the first person in her family to earn a college degree.

Theo is an instructor at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point where she teaches geography and has held a number of public service positions and started two home businesses during her more than 30 years in the workforce. She has managed women's clothing stores, served as a legislative aide to a state senator, worked in food service, ran a home childcare business, and had a home business designing and constructing original wedding gowns and bridal accessories. She has taught at the university level since 1999, first at UW-Madison as a graduate student, then at UWEC before joining the Geography and Geology Department at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point (UWSP) in 2007.

During her teaching career, Theo served as a task member of Lieutenant Governor Barbara Lawton's Wisconsin Women Equal Prosperity Initiative where she was responsible for spatial analysis and cartography. She also served as UWEC's representative to the Wisconsin Economic Summit from 2001-2003, coordinating a session on university and community partnerships for economic development in 2003. Theo's research as a university instructor concentrates on economic and community change in Wisconsin's Northwoods.

Building Committee moves forward



The Town of Lincoln Building Committee met the past two Wednesdays, June 20 and 27 to discuss the future of the new town hall and garage. On Saturday June 9th, the committee was approved to go forward with their plans by the electorates of the town. They have a \$600,000 limit with a ten percent contingency. The total amounting \$660,000. The committee decided that they would hire Raash Engineers and Architect.

On June 27, Raash designers came up to meet with the committee. They had a rough draft of a plan. The committee looked over the plans and made sure that nothing was forgotten and that all building codes were met. Raash Engineers and Architect will now make the changes to the design. They will meet with the committee again to double check all parts of the project on July 9th at 5 p.m. If all of the codes are met and the building design is approved, the project will be one step closer to actually building.

The building committee stated that they want to be able to get the building started this year. Prices for building are at the lowest they have been in a long time and indications point to rising costs next year. The committee also stated that they want to get started, but they also want to make sure that the process is done correctly and that when bidding starts, that local builders will have the opportunity to bid.

The building committee also looked into moving the green building to the dump site. The committee is receiving bids on moving the building. The committee looked into the costs of a new building and found that it would cost \$25,000 to almost \$30,000. Moving the building will save money. The money to move the building is added into the fund and not taken from any other budget. It was also factored into the budget of \$600,000. After the meeting with Raash, the committee looked at possible sites on the two acres to build. The committee found that they will have a great spot to build. They will just have to wait on the perk tests to determine where the well and septic have to go if they need a new systems.





To bolster enforcement by putting more officers on patrol for longer hours, agencies participating in Summer Heat will receive federal funding from the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Bureau of Transportation Safety. The mobilization will be backed by new Zero In Wisconsin television, radio and web messages from WisDOT highlighting why drivers need to slow down or risk getting stopped and ticketed.

Speeding is prevalent and deadly in Wisconsin, according to State Patrol Major Sandra Huxtable, director of the WisDOT Bureau of Transportation Safety. Last year, 160 people were killed and 7,700 injured in speed-related

"At higher speeds, you're at greater risk of a crash. Furthermore, the violently destructive forces of a crash become more severe as speeds increase." Major Huxtable says. "Drivers traveling at high speeds for an extended period of time on the open road also tend to not slow down sufficiently when approaching an intersection, work zone or traffic congestion.

Speeding is expensive as well as dangerous. Under Wisconsin law, the costs of speeding citations range from \$175 all the way up to \$893 along with three to six demerit points assessed on the driver's license. Moreover, insurance premiums often increase with speeding convictions. A citation for driving 25 mph or more over the limit in a 55 or 65 mph zone also requires a 15-day driver's license suspension.

Despite the obvious dangers and expense of speeding, it is by far the most common traffic conviction in Wisconsin. Last year, drivers amassed more than 180,000 speeding convictions statewide.

Many people speed in a futile attempt to get where they're going a little sooner. But as Major Huxtable points out, "You're actually going to be delayed

June, a lifelong resident of Laona, was one of Agnes and Joe Matiash's 10 children-a twin with her sister Jane. She was very active in Laona High School, proudly serving as band majorette, cheerleader, and substitute teacher in the elementary school. From what she tells her children, she also attended every dance in the Laona, Wabeno, and Armstrong Creek area!

When the boys returned home after WWII, June caught the attention of handsome John Aschenbrenner, also a lifelong Laona resident. They married in June, 1947. Soon after (and unbeknownst to her) Johnnie bought Clark's Resort on the shores of Wabikon & Riley Lakes. Their lives changed forever that October 4, 1947 afternoon when Clark turned over the keys to a bar, 9 cabins, 23 wooden boats, a 2-room shack ("home sweet home"), water pump, ice house, and gas operated generator (no electricity), 5 outdoor "johns" (no plumbing). Johnnie's Resort began as a seasonal establishment open from May 1 (opening day of fishing season) through Thanksgiving and deer hunting. Sixtyfive years later, Johnnie's continues under the guidance and hard work of their son Johnnie and wife Cheryl. Locals and visitors continue to stop by, stay, and reminisce at Johnnie's.

The "between years" for June were filled with the joy and tears accompanied by any life, particularly one spent operating your own business out of your home. June worked from dawn to dusk beside her husband, hanging hundreds of sheets "on the line", making hamburgers, tending bar and scrubbing floors. She balanced her husbands' quiet demeanor with her outgoing ways. They welcomed two children; Johnnie and Susan. Young Johnnie quickly learned the art of fishing for which he is still passionate. Susan and Johnnie inherited the family's love of the outdoors; Susan tempered this with an interest to also see what was beyond the lake. Now they both built homes overlooking Wabikon Lake, as a testament to their parents.

June remembers the many people whom she welcomed to her home: A man who lost his false teeth in an outdoor "john" (later scooping them out with a fishing net). The quiet and kind George Tuckwab and lke George who literally made it possible for them to survive their first years. Muskie fishermen racing in with white flags flying to weigh and display their trophy fish. Three and for generations of families returning to Johnnie's for family gatherings in the cabins, complete with roaming bear, fish stories, and wood ticks. A young man reported seeing a Sasquatch creature in the creek between the lakes some late evening several years ago. Trout fishermen returning with decorated boats, bullhead tournaments, and spring break-up parties. Yes, it all happened under June's watch!



Conditions Favor Mildew and Other Plant Diseases

With the warm weather and recent rain, many homeowners are seeing full, healthy gardens. But the persistently high humidity and lingering rain showers have also made conditions perfect for the onset of many

The most prevalent of these is powdery mildew. Powdery mildew is caused by several genera of fungi; each species within those genera attack different groups of garden plants. But each fungus causes the same disease, and each requires the same treatment. However, the different sources of disease make it likely that while one plant is infected, others nearby are not. This doesn't mean gardeners should not be watchful for other symptomatic plants, however: if powdery mildew appears on one plant, conditions favor the development of the

After stretches of wet, muggy weather, gardeners should be on the watch for powdery mildew symptoms, especially on phlox, lilac, roses, zinnia, birch, oak, cucumbers, and squash, plants highly susceptible to the disease. Plants infected with powdery mildew appear to be dusted with fuzzy white, light-gray, or slightly brown fungus. This "powdered sugar" mildew most often is

visible on the leaves. In advanced stages, buds fail to open and diseased leaves turn brown and dry.

Powdery mildew spores overwinter in infected plant parts, plant debris, and dormant buds. Each spring they blow to new sites and re-infect their host plants in both the same and new locations. Careful control can prevent severe infections, especially with timely diagnosis. Gardeners should not grow mildew-prone plants like phlox or roses in shady areas where circulation is poor, and should be sure to prune and thin plant material to promote healthy air flow.

In greenhouses, where powdery mildew is perhaps the most common disease, gardeners can ventilate well in the late afternoon to drive out moisture before nightfall, when humidity is high, and infected plants in any area should be treated by removing infected debris. This can be composted, but requires a high temperature to be thoroughly eliminated. Homeowners can dispose of infested debris in normal garbage.

Infected plants can be treated with fungicides;

they are usually more effective if applied in the earlier stages of the infection. Fungicides for ornamentals should be used for plants on their label; triforine (Funginex, Triflorine), sulfur (Sulfur, wettable sulfur), copper sulfate, myclobutanil (Systhane), thiophanate-methyl (Cleary 3336, Domain, Fungo, and Benefit), and dinocap (Karathane) fungicides are among the most effective. Baking soda (1-1/2 tablespoons) and horticultural oil (3 tablespoons) in water (1 gallon) is also effective for powdery mildew control, and most of these treatments will require repetition every 7-14 days until conditions change.
