Kentuck Day Festival It's a family tradition



CRANDON, WI: Come to downtown Crandon, Wisconsin on Saturday, July 28, for the Annual Kentuck Day Festival. This popular summer festival celebrates the heritage of many of the area's early settlers from Kentucky. The rich history of families from Kentucky will be highlighted at this event, featured in the historical booth on the grounds of the courthouse square. With artist and crafter booths, great sidewalk sales, specialty food booths, kid's venue, and live entertainment on the grounds, there will be something for everyone to enjoy! Not to mention the best car show in the Northwoods and you won't want to be anywhere but in downtown Crandon.

Brand new to the Kentuck Day Festival line up is the 5K Moonshine Run. The Moonshine Run starts at 9:00 a.m. and will wind its way through downtown Crandon and end near the Kentuck Day festival grounds on the courthouse square. The registration (paid by July 25) is \$10 for youth (under 18), \$20 for adults, and \$50 for a family of four. Registration after that will be \$12 for youth, \$25 for adults, and \$60 for a family of four. All proceeds will benefit the Forest County Little League and the Forest County Youth Football League. It's a great way to kick-off a full day of family fun.

The 10th annual Kentuck Klassic Car Show will take place on the beautiful grounds of the Weber-Hill Funeral Home from 9:00 a.m. till 3:00 p.m. An entry fee of \$10.00 can be paid upon registration, taking place from 9:00 till 11:00 a.m., at the show grounds. Show Chair Winda Collins encourages everyone to register early as the first 100 participants receive a 'goody bag', including t-shirts and dash plaques. First, second and third place trophies will be awarded in each class. Food and refreshments will be available on the grounds and DJ Rusty will be playing tunes throughout the day. Whether your vehicle is show ready or a work-in-progress, plan to attend and show pride in your ride at the Kentuck Klassic Car Show.

After last year's record breaking number of spaces filled, the huge art and craft show set up on the courthouse lawn will offer a wonderful variety of items for purchase. Handcrafted items include wooden toys, furniture, carvings, wildlife art, oil acrylics, and water paintings, silk floral designs, scented candles, etched mugs, clocks, baskets, ethnic needlepoint, photography, quilting, honey products (from area owned bee hives), hand made jewelry, lawn ornaments, and much more. Many of these talented artisans are from this area as well as from throughout Wisconsin, upper Michigan, and Minnesota.

At the other end of the courthouse square the flea market section along Polk Street has grown into a popular shopping spot at this event, with over 25 vendors planning to set up a booth.

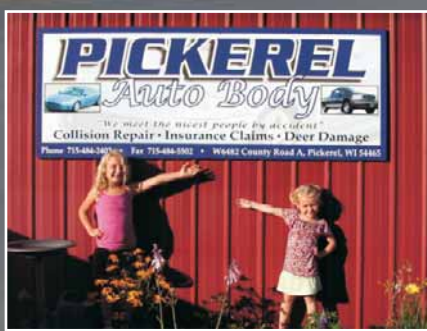
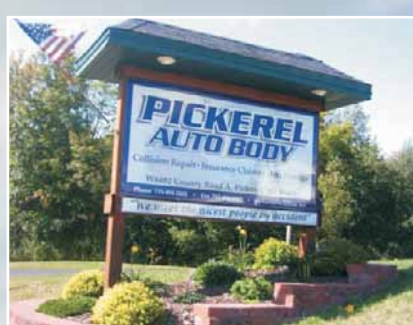

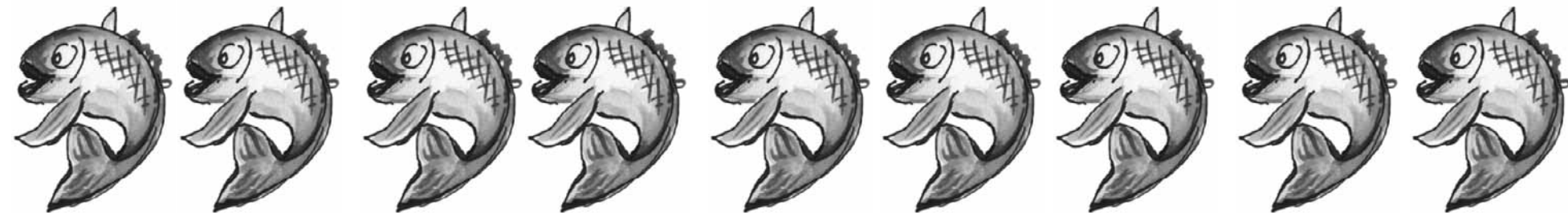

And Breakfast Programs

As children need healthy meals to learn, it is the policy of the School District of Laona to serve all students breakfast and lunch free of charge each school day. The School District of Laona is eligible to receive reimbursement for part of the cost of these meals through the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI). For those students who qualify for free or reduced price meals, based on their household size and income level or due to receipt of FoodShare, FDPIR, or W-2 cash benefits, DPI will reimburse the school at a higher rate.

The following household size and income criteria will be used for determining eligibility. Children from families whose annual income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free and reduced price meals or free milk if a split-session student does not have access to the school lunch or breakfast service.

To obtain free or reduced price meals or free milk for children for whom households receive FoodShare FDPIR, or Wisconsin Works (W-2) cash benefits, an adult member needs only to list the names of the school children, give FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2 case number for each child, sign his/her name and return the application to the school office.

You may wish to draw water prior to our flushing dates and refrigerate it for drinking purposes.

During the flushing period your tap water can become discolored. Should you experience discoloration, please flush your water tap until the water runs clear.

Hydrant flushing improves water quality.

Should you be interested, we invite you to observe the change in the initial, intermediate and final water quality from the hydrant during flushing. Hydrant flushing can increase water pressure, remove discolored water from the system and increase fire-fighting ability in various parts of our system. This exercise flushes pockets of stagnated water out of the water supply system and improves water quality not only in color, odor and taste but can also remove harmful constituents before they are able to develop. For the school officials to determine eligibility for free or reduced price meals or free milk of households not receiving FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2, the household must provide the following information requested on the application: names of all household members and the adult signing the application form must also list the last four digits of his or her Social Security Number or write "none" if they do not have a Social Security Number. Also, the income received by each household member must be provided by amount and source (wages, welfare, child support, etc.).

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal and free milk policy, the High School Secretary will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he/she may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. If the parent/guardian wishes to make a formal appeal, he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to: Kay Connors, School Board Clerk, 5263 Fairway Court, Laona WI 54541 or call 715-674-3200.

If a hearing is needed to appeal the decision, the policy contains an outline of the hearing procedure. If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size changes, the family should contact the school. Such changes may make the household eligible for reduced price meals or free meals or free milk if the household income falls at or below the levels shown above, and they may reapply at that time.

Children formally placed in foster care are also eligible for free meal benefits. Foster children may be certified as eligible without a household application. Households with foster children and non-foster children may choose to include the foster child as a household member, as well as any personal income available to the foster child, on the same application that includes their non-foster children.

The information provided by the household on the application is confidential. Public Law 103-448 does authorize the release of student free and reduced price school meal eligibility status to persons directly connected with the administration and enforcement of federal or state educational programs.

In accordance with Federal Law and U.S. Department of Agriculture policy, this institution is prohibited from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. How to stay safe in the Sun

The first important thing to do to prevent sunburn is to wear protection against the harmful UV light of the sun. Wear waterproof sunscreen on the body and any exposed areas if you are going to the beach, swimming in the pool or lake. Remember to replenish and reapply the sunscreen often throughout the day. Don't forget to apply sun protection to areas like behind the ears, the back of the arms, and other "hard-to-reach" areas.

Wear protective clothing especially SPF clothes which can be bought at specialty store or order online and many online businesses selling SPF protective clothing.

Wear large broad brim hats to cover the scalp, face and head from sun's harmful UV rays. It is also a good idea to carry some shade with you like an umbrella, especially for the elderly and the pediatric age groups as well as individuals on medication. These groups of people are more sensitive and have lower tolerance to long exposure to the sun's heat and will become dehydrated faster.

Some prescription medication increases your sensitivity to direct sunlight so be informed and educated when you are on medications and find out before going out into the sun if this can happen. Ask your doctor or your local pharmacist and read the labels and instructions on the back of the prescription bottle.

DO NOT expose young infants and babies under 6 months of age in direct sunlight. Always cover the young infant with protective clothing and sun hat and carry some portable shade. It is also not recommended to apply sunscreen protection on babies as their skin are very sensitive to the chemicals that are in most of these products. Use specially pediatric formulated lotions to protect against dryness of the skin. Remember to hydrate the infant often with pediatric formulated fluids or water throughout the day if you are planning family day out in the summer sun. There are many types and varieties of products in the stores that sell water with electrolytes added to it.

Remember that even in the car one can get a sunburn. There are certain precautions and protective measures to take to decrease the risk of this happening especially if you have young family members and babies. Taking long trips in the car can expose the infants and children to the UV light that penetrates the windows. One thing to do is to have the windows tinted and UV protected. This will decrease the intensity and amount of UV lighting entering the car. If your car does not have tinted windows there are cheaper and temporary ways to give protections. One way is to place a towel or small sheet on the window or you can purchase UV light window shields at most children's specialty stores that have sticky backs on them to enable it to be removed easily after use from the window. It is better to use the car air-conditioning than rolling down the window if you are traveling long distances and for many hours in the car. Also remember the sunroof and convertible cars will expose the people in the car to direct sunlight so wear sunscreen protection before going out on a long excursion or car journey on a hot sunny day.

Another way to stay safe in the sun is to periodically move into a shady area to allow your body temperature to cool down and also to prevent the risk of sunburn to your skin. Drinking plenty of water is advisable. Avoid certain hours and times during the day, for example, the midday sun is usually the hottest time of the day and the sun is at its maximum intensity. Try to schedule your outings and trips to the early hours or late afternoon periods in the day especially if you have young babies and children, or elderly, or have people on prescription medication.

Find a pair of sunglasses that will give you UV protection so you can reduce the risk of burning your retina or cornea or even burning the eyelids. There are many variety of styles and shapes available but it is better to get advice with an optician or ophthalmologist when purchasing a good pair of eye protection. Remember, also, if you wear contact lenses you will probably be at more risk to getting dry eyes and eye problems if you don't wear eye protection when out in the direct sunlight. Carry plenty of eye solution with you when planning a day out in the sun.

Advice on swimmer's itch from the Forest County Health Dept.

What is swimmer's itch?
Swimmer's itch is a skin rash caused by a parasite (shistosomes) which ordinarily infect birds, semiaquatic mammals, and snails. Common grackles, red-winged blackbirds, ducks, geese, swans, muskrats and moles have been found to carry the parasite. As part of their developmental life cycle, these parasites are released from infected snails, migrate through the water, and are capable of penetrating the skin of man. After penetration, these parasites remain in the skin and die but can cause an allergic reaction in some people. The parasite in man does not mature, reproduce or cause any permanent infection.

How is swimmer's itch spread?
An individual may get the infection by swimming or wading in infested water and then allowing water to evaporate off the skin rather than drying the skin with a towel. Person-to-person spread does not occur.

What are the symptoms of swimmer's itch?
Whenever infested water is allowed to evaporate off the skin, an initial tingling sensation may be felt when the parasite gets into the skin. A rash can appear within 1 to 2 hours. The itching may continue for several days but should disappear within a week.

What is the treatment for swimmer's itch?
There is no treatment necessary for swimmer's itch. Some people may get relief from the itching by applying skin lotions or creams to the infected site.

What can be done to reduce the chances of getting swimmer's itch?
Towel off immediately after swimming or wading in infested water can be very helpful in preventing rash development. Swim in water away from the shore. Avoid swimming in areas where snails have accumulated. Don't encourage birds to stay near swimming areas by feeding them.



MADISON – While waterfowl hunters won't know the official season dates and bag limits until after federal wildlife officials set the annual framework and the season is approved by the State Natural Resources Board, state wildlife officials expect another 60-day season for ducks and possibly an additional seven days for Canada geese.

"We won't have a final waterfowl season proposal for the fall 2012 seasons until Monday, July 30," said Kent Van Horn, Wisconsin state waterfowl biologist who just returned from the Mississippi Flyway Council meetings.

"However, much of the news this year is good. Although we saw average wetland conditions across most of North America at the time of breeding, waterfowl numbers remain high from last year. Late summer and early fall rains will be particularly important to providing fall waterfowl habitat this year."

State waterfowl hunting seasons are structured within the bounds of an annual framework decided by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. With the overall picture on the 2012 waterfowl breeding populations being good, hunters can expect average to liberal season frameworks in 2012.

Season to be set by Natural Resources Board, August 8

Later this week the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service be releasing the final frameworks within which the state agencies can set the fall 2012 waterfowl hunting seasons. However, based on available survey results and analysis, state wildlife officials expect the following season parameters:

60-day overall duck hunting season with a total duck bag limit of six ducks

60-day, two bird bag on pintails

60-day, one bird bag on canvasback

60-day, four bird bag on scaup

Early September Canada goose season from September 1-15

Two Canada goose hunting season periods in the Horicon zone - Period 1 – Sept. 16-Oct. 28, Period 2 – Oct. 29- Dec. 16

An extra seven days of Exterior zone Canada goose hunting, for a total of 92 days.

The Natural Resources Board will set the 2012 season structure at its Aug. 8 meeting in Germantown. At that time, Wisconsin waterfowl hunters will know the final hunting season structure for 2012:

"We expect to post the season proposals on the waterfowl page of the DNR website dnr.wi.gov/ early next week," said Van Horn.

Waterfowl hunters are reminded of upcoming public meetings and hearings on the 2012 duck and Canada goose hunting seasons. The latest information on the status of waterfowl and waterfowl management decisions in Wisconsin will be presented. Anyone interested in ducks and geese is encouraged to attend these meetings. Citizens can attend one of several

EDITORS NOTE: In a conversation with waterfowl specialist Kent Van Horn, Van Horn stated that he was going to recommend a season opener for ducks on September 22nd, giving locals in the north a chance to hunt local ducks. He also said that he would recommend a split season on duck in the north, with the opener on September 22nd until November 5th, when there would be a five day closure of the season. The season would reopen on the 10th of November and extend through the Sunday following Thanksgiving, giving hunters a chance to hunt late flights of diving ducks on northern lakes.

This doesn't mean that the recommendation will be accepted, but we appreciate his efforts.

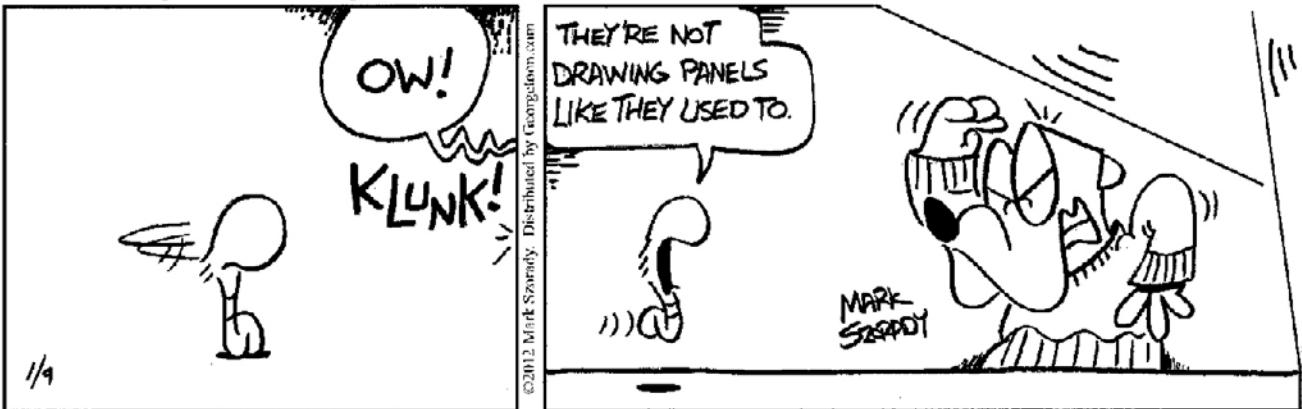

Application period for wolf hunting permit opens August 1, closes August 31



MADISON – Hunters and trappers interested in participating in Wisconsin's inaugural wolf hunting and trapping season must apply for a permit between August 1 and August 31, 2012. The permit application fee is \$10 and applications can be purchased from authorized license agents, over the Internet through the Department of Natural Resources "Online Licensing Center" or by phone at 1-877-945-4236 toll free.

The wolf hunting and trapping season runs October 15 to February 28, 2013.

For the 2012-13 seasons all wolf permits will be awarded by random choice in a drawing that will be held shortly after the close of the permit application window. Successful applicants will be notified by letter. Applicants who are not successful in the drawing will be awarded a preference point toward future drawings.

Starting with the 2013-14 season one half of available permits will be issued randomly among all permit applications and the second half will be issued through a cumulative preference point drawing.

"If you think you will ever be interested in participating in a wolf season, either this year or in future years, it's important to apply for a permit starting this year in order to accumulate preference points," said Bill Vander Zouwen, ecology section chief in the DNR Bureau of Wildlife Management. "With the limited number of wolf permits expected to be available each year, hunters and trappers with preference points will have a better chance of being selected in future drawings."

At the time of purchase applicants may apply for a permit or a preference point only. The preference point only option is available for hunters and trappers who wish to hunt or trap in future seasons but are not able to participate in the 2012-13 season and want to start accumulating points.

Accumulated preference points will be eliminated when an applicant is selected in the drawing to receive a permit. Accumulated preference points will also be eliminated if a hunter or trapper does not submit a permit application in three consecutive years.

Six wolf harvest zones were established by the Natural Resources Board. Each zone will have a wolf quota although those quotas will not be firmly established for several weeks until officials factor in tribal declarations. The number of licenses will equal 10 times the total quota after the tribal declarations are subtracted.

For the 2012-13 wolf season, hunters and trappers may fill their harvest tag in any zone. All kills must be reported within 24 hours and zones will be closed when harvest quotas are reached. Zone harvest totals and season closures will be posted on the DNR website dnr.wi.gov search the keyword, "wolf." Zone closures will also be noticed in statewide news releases and the department will have a call-in line that hunters and trappers can check daily for closures. It is the responsibility of the hunter and trapper to check for closures each day before going out to hunt or trap.

A wolf license authorizes both hunting and trapping. The license holder must meet the appropriate safety education requirements. Persons who intend to trap wolves must successfully complete a Wisconsin Trapper Education course unless exempt; persons born on or after January 1, 1973 who intend to hunt wolves with a firearm must possess a Hunter Education Certificate (or equivalent) unless participating the Hunting Mentorship program.

Wolf harvesting licenses may be transferred to a youth or adult who is eligible to use the license, provided the transfer application is received by October 1 (15 days prior to the start of the wolf season).

Vehicle titles will be sent to lien holders starting July 30, 2012

Vehicle owners will receive titles when a loan is paid off

Wisconsin soon joins 38 states in becoming a title-to-lien holder state. This means that any title with a lien (loan) listed on or after July 30, 2012 will be sent to the lien holder rather than the owner. Lien holders may choose to receive either paper or electronic titles. The advantage to electronic delivery is that Wisconsin does not issue a paper title to the lender or owner of the vehicle until the lien is satisfied. This process eliminates most of the paper handling involved in vehicle titling and results in greater convenience and lower costs. These changes implement provisions included in the 2011-2013 state budget passed by the legislature last year.

As far as vehicles titled before this date are concerned, Mitchell Warren, director of the DMV Bureau of Vehicle Services wants people to know that “if you already have your title, even if it lists a lien holder, nothing changes. You can keep it. Titles will only be issued to lien holders on or after July 30, 2012.”

Owners of vehicles with liens purchased on or after July 30, 2012 will receive a Confirmation of Ownership from: (www.dot.wisconsin.gov/drivers/vehicles/title/lienholder/images/t056-sample.jpg) and will receive the actual title when all liens are paid off. Warren notes that “a confirmation of ownership does not replace a vehicle title. What it does do is confirm that a person owns the vehicle and specifies that there is a lien on that vehicle.” More information can be found at the WisDOT web site at <http://liens.dot.wi.gov>.

This is a fully-funded, all-expense-paid demonstration project that is free for the Veterans. The program includes transportation to and from the Job Corps center, housing, meals, basic medical services, academic and career technical training, bi-weekly living allowance, and job placement and post-graduation support.

We have worked with Job Corps to create an accelerated, customized program developed specifically for Veterans. This program recognizes the maturity and life experience that our Veterans have gained from their military experience.

Job Corps employs a holistic career development training approach that teaches academic, vocational, employability skills and social competencies in an integrated manner through a combination of classroom, practical and based learning experiences to prepare participants for stable, long-term, and high-paying jobs. One of the important outcomes is that participants will obtain a credential or certificate certifying them in a trade.

Veterans accepted in the demonstration project will be living among non-Veterans and other Veterans who are also transitioning from the military to civilian life. One of the Job Corps program's key benefits is its post-graduate support. 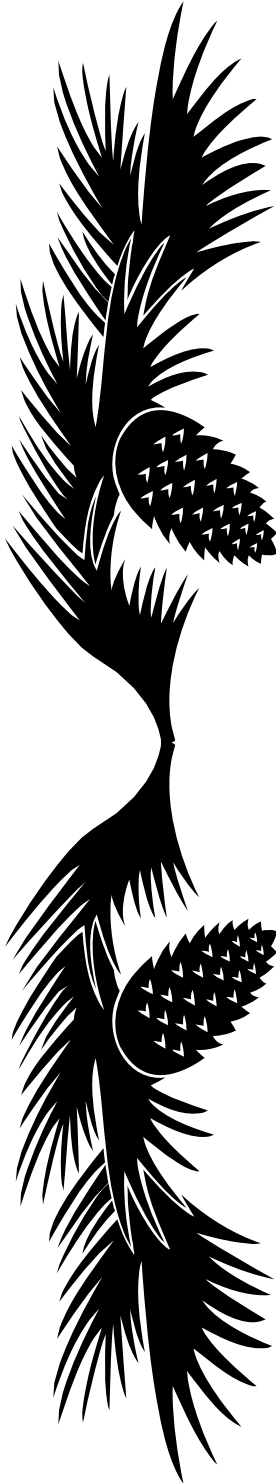
