The Lake-Ness Monster was christened following the spring meeting of the Townsend Flowage Association on May 25. Jim Scott, father-in-law of Toni Scott, did the honors. Toni's suggested name for the new weed harvester was chosen from a long list of creative monikers submitted by members of the organization over the winter.

The weed harvester was designed and built in Spooner, Wisconsin. It was purchased using a 50-50 grant, half of it coming from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. TFA's half was raised via donations, dues, and an annual Family Fun Day and Corn Roast held every year on the first Saturday in August at the Townsend Town Hall. This year that date is August 3.

"The arrival of Lake-Nessie is a dream come true," says TFA board member Rich Schoonveld. Rich has been in charge of the association's weed harvesting equipment for almost three decades. "Until now, all of our equipment was purchased used and consequently needed extensive repair each year. Having a NEW machine is going to make my job a lot more fun," Rich chuckled as he checked out his new "baby."

Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest Reminds Visitors about Restrictions to Help Slow Spread of Emerald Ash Borer

Rhineland, WI May 20, 2013. The campgrounds are now open across the 1.5 million acres of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (CNNF) and firewood restrictions are in place to slow the spread of Emerald Ash Borer (EAB). This invasive beetle travels on firewood, so please leave firewood at home, unless you live within 25 miles of your National Forest destination.

The firewood restriction is one way of slowing the spread of Emerald Ash Borer, an exotic beetle from Asia that kills ash trees. This invasive insect's larva kills ash trees by destroying the soft layer of wood just under the bark. The risk of an EAB infestation on the National Forest within several years even with quarantines and firewood restrictions is very high.

Since 2002, EAB has spread to nineteen states, including Wisconsin, and two Canadian provinces. Movement of infested wood or nursery stock being transported from one location to another is the likely cause of new infestations beyond normal dispersal patterns of the insect.

Acceptable firewood to bring to the CNNF includes:

- **Wood gathered from within the Forest with a valid permit
- **Firewood purchased from a vendor within 25 miles of the national forest destination or brought from home that same distance
- **Wood that has been certified by the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (certified wood can be brought into the Forest from a distance of more than 25 miles)

In addition, state and federal laws forbid moving hardwood firewood, as well as ash logs and nursery stock, out of emerald ash borer quarantined areas. Currently, this means hardwood firewood that has been stored, purchased, or harvested in the following areas may not be moved out of these areas in Wisconsin: Brown, Crawford, Fond du Lac, Kenosha, La Crosse, Milwaukee, Racine, Rock, Sheboygan, Ozaukee, Trempealeau, and Vernon, Walworth, Washington, and Waukesha counties. A federal quarantine also prohibits the movement of hardwood firewood out of all or parts of more than a dozen other states and parts of Canada.

Experienced trustees return to Nicolet College Board

The Wisconsin Technical College System Board recently re-appointed three members to the Nicolet College Board of Trustees, returning experienced trustees to the board which determines the direction of the college. Trustees Ron Zimmerman, Thom Umlauf, and Jeannine Bruguier will each begin new, three-year terms when they are sworn in at the July board meeting.

Zimmerman has served on the board since 2009, both Umlauf and Bruguier since 2010.

State guidelines dictate that technical college boards must have employers, employees, a K-12 school superintendent, an elected government or school board member, and at-large members. There must also be a balance of geographic distribution from across the Nicolet District and a mix of male, female and minority representation.

Zimmerman, the current board chair, is from Tomahawk and recently retired as human resources manager from Packaging Corporation of America. Umlauf, the current board treasurer, is from Rhinelander and is president and CEO of Superior Diesel. Bruguier, from Lac du Flambeau, is the tribal administrator for the Lac du Flambeau Tribe.

Appointments to the Nicolet College Board of Trustees are made by the chairs of the county boards from Nicolet district counties, which include all of Oneida, Vilas and Forest counties and portions of Lincoln, Langlade and Iron counties. The appointments then go before the Wisconsin Technical College System Board, which confirmed the appointments of Zimmerman, Umlauf, and

Bruguier at a recent meeting.

Other trustees on the nine-member board are Robert Egan, Eagle River; Dave Hintz, Three Lakes; Amy Jacobs, Elcho; Marcelina Metropulos, Lake Tomahawk; Kim Odekirk; Argonne; and Deanna Pierpont, Mercer.

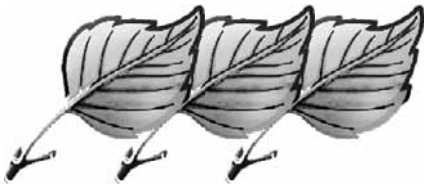

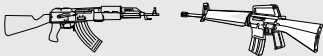

There is nothing quite like home-canned tomatoes or crisp family-favorite dill pickles. "Preserving food from your garden or farmer's market during the summer can make for quick and delicious family meals later on," says Barbara Ingham, University of Wisconsin Extension food safety specialist, "but be sure to follow research-tested recipes for safe, high quality food that your family will enjoy."

Forest County UW-Extension is offering a series of FREE lunchtime learning opportunities so your summertime canning and food preservation activities will be based on up-to-date research-tested information. Each of these one-hour programs will be a chance to listen, learn, and ask questions of experts in the field. The following programs will be held in the Forest County Courthouse Board Room – 200 East Madison, Crandon, from 12 noon – 1 p.m. in the board room.

June 3 Freezing Produce – Learn tips to preserving fresh green beans, peas, strawberries and other produce for year-round enjoyment.

July 1 Canning Vegetables Safely – Safely preserve your garden's bounty of vegetables with canning.

July 15 Canning Tomatoes and Tomato Products – Whether pressure canning whole tomatoes, canning salsa in a boiling water canner, or even making tomato jam – options abound for safely preserving tomatoes.

Aug 5 Time to Make Pickles – Your family will enjoy the taste of summer with safe, high quality quick-pack pickles (and we'll discuss genuine dills & sauerkraut too!).

Aug 19 Drying Foods at Home – Wondering what to do with those few onions, tomatoes, carrots or tomatoes sitting in the crisper? Try dehydrating them to make a flavorful soup base. And consider dried fruit as your go-to snack for hungry kids home from school.

Aug 26 Successful Storage of Garden Produce – Extend the season as long as possible by properly storing your garden's produce.

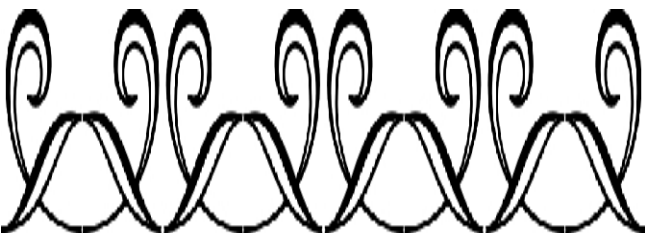

Crandon honors the fallen on Memorial Day

Since 1971, Memorial Day, has been the final Monday in the Month of May. It is to observe all of the men and woman who gave their lives to this great country. Every town across the United States holds a ceremony on this day. Some visit cemeteries or memorials, others have parades and family gatherings.

Crandon has it's own parade and speaker and this year Colonel Michael Shepherd was given the honor. Col. Shepherd is a 32 year veteran of the United States Air Force. He is a native of Crandon and a 1973 Crandon High School graduate.

Col. Shepherd gave the crowd a brief history of himself and Memorial Day. It was originally started to honor the fallen Civil War soldiers on both sides of the war, it was known as Declaration Day, but after the United States got involved in World War I, Memorial Day was designed to recognize any soldier from any war who gave their life fighting for their country.

Col. UNDERWATER SPEAR FISHING
REGULATION WILL BE ENFORCED

This is a reminder that WDNR Regulation NR20.20 **prohibits underwater spear fishing** in all Forest County waters including Lake Metonga.

Since 2012 was the first year of enforcement, even though the Regulation was adopted on June 1, 1999, the wardens were only giving warnings and/or taking the speared fish from the violators instead of issuing a citation and fine. However, in 2013 citations and fines will be issued for unlawful possession and use of a spear gun. The fine for this violation is \$423.90 plus \$8.75 for each fish illegally speared.

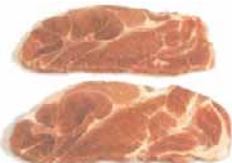

Can My Heart Get Healthier With Water?

Cardiovascular diseases are, as a group, the leading cause of death in western countries. Sudden death from cardiovascular disease accounts for over 300,000 deaths per year in the U.S. Because of the importance of cardiovascular disease, major efforts have been made to identify risk factors and to take steps to reduce these risks.

The findings of a six-year study of more than 20,000 healthy men and women aged 38-100 in the May 1, 2002 American Journal of Epidemiology found that women who drank more than five glasses of water a day were 41% less likely to die from a heart attack during the study period than those who drank less than two glasses. The protective effect of water was even greater in men.

There is an increasing body of evidence that drinking water hardness and elevated concentrations of certain minerals in hard water may reduce the risk of cardiac death and, in particular, the risk of sudden cardiac death. Recent interest has focused on deficits in dietary magnesium. In developed countries, these deficits are potentially compounded by use of medications, such as diuretics, that further reduce body stores of magnesium.

To minimize heart disease risk, the ideal water should contain sufficient calcium and magnesium to be moderately hard. No effort should be made to eliminate trace elements such as copper and iron where these elements are in short, dietary supply. Elements such as cadmium and lead, which can accumulate in the body, should be minimized. There is also concern that increased use of calcium supplements to prevent osteoporosis may alter the ratio of calcium to magnesium intake, further exacerbating the deficiency in magnesium intake.

Since calcium and magnesium compete for absorption, there is concern that increasing calcium intake, without also increasing magnesium intake, can result in a deficit of magnesium. The optimal ratio of calcium to magnesium is unknown. In this chapter, the plausibility of a relationship between waterborne and dietary magnesium ingestion and cardiac disease is discussed, primarily in terms of persons who are on magnesium therapy or participate in rigorous exercise.

In particular, can studies of these two high-risk populations provide evidence for or against the hypothesis of a causal relationship between water hardness and the risk of cardiovascular disease? A recent study tracked 7,172 men in the Honolulu Health Program. Baseline measurements were made between 1965 and 1968. Over a 30-year period follow-up, 1,431 men developed coronary heart disease. There was a statistically significant increased risk of coronary heart disease in men in the lowest versus the highest quintiles of baseline magnesium intake after adjusting for other dietary and non-dietary cardiovascular disease risk factors, both of which were also ascertained at baseline.

They did not present data on both calcium and magnesium intake for the various quintiles, making it impossible to determine the calcium to magnesium ratio. An interesting finding, however, was that systemic hypertension decreased with increasing magnesium intake. Unfortunately, in assessing the effects of both calcium and magnesium, some papers have adjusted for blood pressure, which appears to be an intermediate outcome of increased magnesium intake. By adjusting for such an intermediate outcome, one can falsely conclude that calcium is protective, but that magnesium has no effect on heart disease risks. In reality, the effect of magnesium on heart disease could be through its effect on lowering blood pressure.

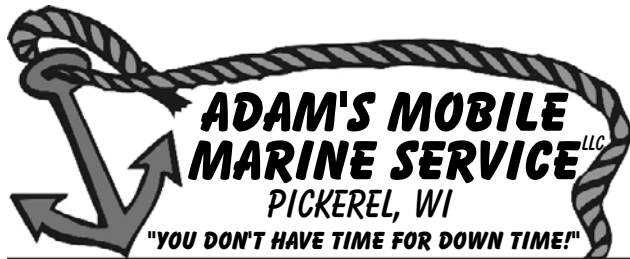

As you are well aware, there are more options in healthcare technology than ever before. However, you may not always be physically able to choose what treatments you need or want. For this reason it is important to plan in advance for future medical choices.

The planning process begins with each person knowing their health condition and how it could change. One of the most important factors in formulating your advance directives is choosing your healthcare agent. An appropriate healthcare agent may not always be the person who loves you the most, but someone who understands your beliefs and views. After formulating your plan, completing and advance directives document will record your choices.

Advance directives should be completed by anyone over the age of 18 and should be updated when choices change. Completing your advance directives can be considered a wonderful gift to friends and family because if a medical crisis should arise, everyone can work together to honor your wishes. Also, completing your advance directives can greatly reduce family and medical conflicts during an already stressful time.

If you are ready to take the first step in completing your advance directives, you can find out about the process by attending an Advance Care Planning workshop at a Ministry Health Care hospital in your area. To find out times and locations, contact the number below that is most convenient for you.

Upon completion, this document should be shared with your healthcare agent and your healthcare provider(s). The original advance directive documentation should be retained for your records.

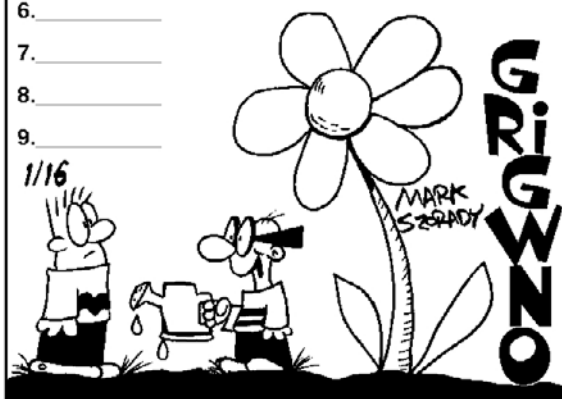

The Importance of Eating Green Vegetables

Imagine a food so powerful that it can help you lose weight, reduce your risk of cancer, make you look younger, strengthen your bones and has even been attributed with living longer? Imagine if this food tasted good, was readily available and relatively inexpensive. No need to imagine, it's a reality and they're called **green vegetables**.

The importance of eating green vegetables cannot be overlooked.

Green vegetables come across as quite unassuming, but they are packed with healthy nutrients such as Vitamins A, C, E and K (which are found in salad greens, kale and spinach). Many of the B complex vitamins are also found in broccoli, bok choy and mustard greens as well as fiber and calcium. There are so many great varieties of green vegetables and so many vitamins and minerals to be had!

However, while green veggies are full of fiber and vitamins, what makes green vegetables (and really all fruits and vegetables) so healthy is their abundance of phytochemicals. Can My Heart Get Healthier With Water?

Cardiovascular diseases are, as a group, the leading cause of death in western countries. Sudden death from cardiovascular disease accounts for over 300,000 deaths per year in the U.S. Because of the importance of cardiovascular disease, major efforts have been made to identify risk factors and to take steps to reduce these risks.

The findings of a six-year study of more than 20,000 healthy men and women aged 38-100 in the May 1, 2002 American Journal of Epidemiology found that women who drank more than five glasses of water a day were 41% less likely to die from a heart attack during the study period than those who drank less than two glasses. The protective effect of water was even greater in men.

There is an increasing body of evidence that drinking water hardness and elevated concentrations of certain minerals in hard water may reduce the risk of cardiac death and, in particular, the risk of sudden cardiac death. Recent interest has focused on deficits in dietary magnesium. In developed countries, these deficits are potentially compounded by use of medications, such as diuretics, that further reduce body stores of magnesium.

To minimize heart disease risk, the ideal water should contain sufficient calcium and magnesium to be moderately hard. No effort should be made to eliminate trace elements such as copper and iron where these elements are in short, dietary supply. Elements such as cadmium and lead, which can accumulate in the body, should be minimized. There is also concern that increased use of calcium supplements to prevent osteoporosis may alter the ratio of calcium to magnesium intake, further exacerbating the deficiency in magnesium intake.

Since calcium and magnesium compete for absorption, there is concern that increasing calcium intake, without also increasing magnesium intake, can result in a deficit of magnesium. The optimal ratio of calcium to magnesium is unknown. In this chapter, the plausibility of a relationship between waterborne and dietary magnesium ingestion and cardiac disease is discussed, primarily in terms of persons who are on magnesium therapy or participate in rigorous exercise.

In particular, can studies of these two high-risk populations provide evidence for or against the hypothesis of a causal relationship between water hardness and the risk of cardiovascular disease? A recent study tracked 7,172 men in the Honolulu Health Program. Baseline measurements were made between 1965 and 1968. Over a 30-year period follow-up, 1,431 men

developed coronary heart disease. There was a statistically significant increased risk of coronary heart disease in men in the lowest versus the highest quintiles of baseline magnesium intake after adjusting for other dietary and non-dietary cardiovascular disease risk factors, both of which were also ascertained at baseline.

They did not present data on both calcium and magnesium intake for the various quintiles, making it impossible to determine the calcium to magnesium ratio. An interesting finding, however, was that systemic hypertension decreased with increasing magnesium intake. Unfortunately, in assessing the effects of both calcium and magnesium, some papers have adjusted for blood pressure, which appears to be an intermediate outcome of increased magnesium intake. By adjusting for such an intermediate outcome, one can falsely conclude that calcium is protective, but that magnesium has no effect on heart disease risks. In reality, the effect of magnesium on heart disease could be through its effect on lowering blood pressure.

Arthritis Foundation Walk with Ease

Get the proven benefits of physical activity! Many people, especially those with arthritis, don't participate in regular physical activity, despite the health benefits it would offer.

The Arthritis Foundation Walk with Ease program was developed to help people with or without arthritis form walking groups whose goals are safety and success. The program's three major objectives are to provide participants with:

- education about successful physical activity for people with arthritis
- education about arthritis management
- opportunity to begin and develop an ongoing aerobic fitness program

Walk With Ease's information and strategies are based on research and tested programs in exercise science, behavior change, and arthritis management. Sponsored by the Arthritis Foundation and based on work done at Stanford University's Center for Research in Disease Prevention, the Thurston Arthritis Research Center and Institute on Aging of the University of North Carolina have developed Walk With Ease as a program with proven benefits!

How does it work? Groups meet for six weeks, two times per week. Each session lasts about one hour. The length of each session depends on how long your group decides to walk. At the start, some people may only be able to walk 5 to 15 minutes, but the program will help you gradually build up to at least 30 minutes of walking three times a week. The program can be modified to meet the interests and needs of participants, who walk at their own pace.

Each session begins with a brief discussion of a topic important to successful walking or arthritis management. After the discussion, the group will warm up, stretch, walk, cool down, and stretch one last time. Walking with a group is fun, and groups often spend additional time socializing.

Who can participate? The Walk With Ease program is designed for people with arthritis - young and old, male and female, fit and not-so-fit. It is also suitable for people without arthritis who would like to begin a regular walking program to gain the benefits of regular aerobic exercise.

If you can be on your feet for 10 minutes without increased pain, you can probably participate successfully, and the program can be modified to meet your needs.

If you want to participate but have concerns about your health, consult your healthcare practitioner before you begin.

How do I register? Enrollment is limited to 12 people. Participants are accepted "first come, first served." To participate in the course, you must complete and return an application and release form. If the course is full when your application is received, you will be placed on a waiting list and notified by mail.

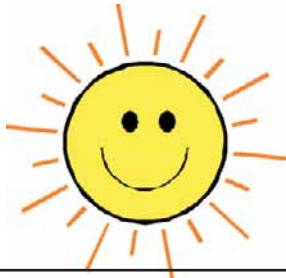
