Mursau school funding increase passes legislature

Madison ... The Wisconsin State Legislature passed a funding increase for rural schools by Representative Jeff Mursau (R - Crivitz) this week. The proposal will annually send 25% of US timber sales in the forest to area schools in 2014.

"I have been working all year to compensate our schools for over 1.5 million acres of federal forest that are unavailable to fund our schools," Mursau said. "Timber sale income should help educate our kids, keep schools open, and keep families close to both their work and their kid's schools."

Under current law, Wisconsin sends national forest income to local townships. Under Mursau's proposal, town governments will be held whole by a proportional increase in federal payments-in-lieu-of-taxes on a per acre basis. In addition, the State budget increases funding for public schools with an additional \$300 per student as well as a funding increase for rural school bussing aid.

"The State will provide schools an extra \$10 million for school districts with long bus routes," Mursau said. "We need to make sure schools can afford to get kids to school at the same time they face increasing gasoline prices."

Governor Walker is expected to finalize his deliberations by the end of June. Mursau will urge Governor Walker to sign the education funds into law.

Upon Walker's signature, Crandon will receive an annual payment of \$352,400, Goodman-Armstrong Creek will receive \$17,500, Laona \$133,700, and Wabeno Area \$276,400. Other area schools will also receive payments.

Brush Run obstacle course taking shape

**To be ready for the Mole Lake Casino
Super Truck Challenge July 4,5,6**



Boulders are rolling on the grounds at Crandon International Off-Road Raceway! All shapes and sizes piled up a steep dirt face with the new rock crawling area taking shape as Crandon's "Phase II" operations continue to move forward at a torrid pace on its all-encompassing off-road destination park.

The latest off-road feature taking shape on the Crandon grounds' natural stadium-style setting behind the race course is the new massive boulder section (pictured) for the Pro Ultra 4-style vehicles, along with a de-tuned course where the amateur weekend warriors can give the sport of rock crawling a shot.

Constructed by Crandon's Cliff Flannery and Dave Ante, with design input from defending Ultra 4 Open class series champion Brad Lovell, the Pro side of the rock crawling feature utilizes the largest of the boulders excavated from Crandon's own rock quarry. Five-to-six footers dug up and placed strategically to give the massive tire rock crawling moon buggy vehicles all they can handle.

"Those rocks had my rear end tipped up in the air a bunch of times," said Flannery at the helm of a 56,000-pound excavator, while placing the 12-15,000-pound boulders on the side of the steep incline.

On the de-tuned side of the feature Flannery placed two to three-foot rocks (which he said "were like shooting marbles" in comparison to placing the larger five to six-foot rocks) and combined them with some 40 tires and concrete pipe to create a challenging - yet makeable - feature for the amateur and first time rock crawlers at Crandon. Note to TORC drivers ... This area IS NOT rental car accessible! (Hahaha)

In addition to the boulders and tires Flannery, as mentioned, got a hold of some concrete piping that a local construction company and friend of Crandon had laying around in their construction yard down in Green Bay. Flannery arranged to have them - along with some giant 20' x 4' mats used in the timber industry - hauled back to Crandon by the logging trucks that pass by the track on Wisconsin HWY 8. The mats will be used for traction, bank stabilization and erosion control in Flannery's new "Mud Pit," along with an incredible 45-degree mat hill climb.

"I've seen some of the rock crawling on TV - mud bog, rock climbing, steep hills - and we're gonna have all that here at Crandon," said Flannery. "But the best part, instead of seeing just one feature, you're going to be able to see it all - right from your where you're standing! Plus, we've now got a lot of places where the Average Joe can go four-wheeling."

You name it and the July 4th, 5th & 6th Mole Lake Casino Super Truck Challenge has got it! Obstacle Course step up for Rockers, Mega Trucks Bounty Hole, Show-n-Shine, Sand and Rock Pit, Side-by-Side high H.P. Blower and Injected Mud Drag Racing, Burn Out, Mud Pit, Tuff Truck stadium-style racing with a lucky dog draw elimination buy-back in and the Tug-O-War Throttle King Challenge® qualifier. The real fun comes into play when the "Pay to Play" entrants can also attempt the obstacle course, sand dunes, mud hole, rock wall, trail ride and a bounty hole!

Alzheimer's Caregiving - The Experience of Grief and Loss

As the population ages, there has been an increased need for elder care. Institutionalized care is an option, but many elders are being taken care of by a family member or loved one within the home. These caregivers take on a tremendous responsibility by assisting their loved ones with the activities of daily living (ADLs). This can include feeding, cleaning, or dressing a loved one. This type of caregiving is especially involved in situations where the loved one being cared for has Alzheimer's disease. Although research and support for a cure for Alzheimer's is important, the strain involved with caregiving should not be ignored.

Alzheimer's Disease Facts

Alzheimer's disease is a brain disorder that affects the cognitive abilities of an individual that causes a decrease in the ability to perform ADLs over time. The disease usually affects people that are over 65 years of age, but there are cases of people being diagnosed as early as the late 40s.

Because of constant care needed for caring for a person with Alzheimer's, many caregivers leave their careers to become Alzheimer's caregivers full time. Alzheimer's caregiving causes stress on the caregiver in three ways: financially, physically, and emotionally. The emotional effects can go beyond depression and into grief during the caregiving process and on to bereavement after the loved one has died.

Impact of Alzheimer's Disease on Caregivers

According to the Alzheimer's Association (2007), family caregivers provide 70% of Alzheimer's care. In addition, 45% of these caregivers have reported suffering from some type of depression. As a result, Alzheimer's caregivers need a lot of support through interventions such as community forums and workshops. Mental health assistance should be available for Alzheimer's caregivers in dealing with grief issues related to caring for their loved ones.

Increasing the awareness of the grief and loss feelings that caregivers experience within the caregiving process and after their loved one is gone will give them the ability to recognize the signs that their own mental health is at risk. The goal will be to give caregivers the tools to deal with the grief in the most effective way.

Alzheimer's Caregivers and Grief and Loss

The feelings of grief and loss are normal among Alzheimer's caregivers. The loved one that once was their companion, mother, father, or grandparent is no longer recognizable. Loved ones of people with Alzheimer's disease experience multiple losses (Gruetznier, 2001). Some common symptoms of grief that Alzheimer's caregivers experience are denial, anger, guilt, and depression.

According to the Alzheimer's Association (2007), guilt and depressive symptoms are prevalent among caregivers. However, it is important to note that depression and caregiver grief are similar in their symptoms, and sometimes can be hard to distinguish (Gruetznier, 2001). Caregivers should be provided with enough information to recognize the difference between depressive symptoms within the grieving process and actual clinical depression so that they know when to seek help for themselves.

There is an enormous involvement of the caregiver in the Alzheimer's disease discussion. By increasing awareness, the hope is that it will lead to:

- The development of community based programs to assist caregivers with respite
- Training programs to help caregivers effectively take care of the patient and themselves
- The recognition of the signs of at-risk bereaved caregivers to be able to provide proper support
- Preparing the caregiver for their loved one's death
- The initiation of more caregiver research, for not only Alzheimer's disease, but also other diseases and conditions that affect the elderly

and the department's responsibility, to manage the state's wolf population," said Dave MacFarland, DNR carnivore specialist. "Goals established in our current management plan are lower than our current population. The quota approved today will put downward pressure on the number of wolves in the state in accordance with the approved plan."

The DNR Wolf Advisory Committee, comprised of DNR staff along with stakeholders and partners representing the agriculture industry, the Chippewa tribes, Wisconsin Conservation Congress, sportsman groups, and statewide organizations with a vested interest in wolf management, proposed the 2013 quota.

The upcoming season's quota of 275 is an increase over 2012's quota of 201. State hunters and trappers harvested 117 wolves during the inaugural season.

The state's current late-winter 2013 minimum count is 809 to 834 wolves. This count is similar to the late winter population count prior to the 2012 wolf hunt.

"It is important to note that this is the minimum number of wolves the state is estimated to have in late winter, at the point where wolf population is at its lowest and just prior to the birth of pups," said MacFarland. "This late winter minimum count approximately doubles in spring of each year after pups are born, and then declines throughout the year."

Analysis of available data, review of published scientific literature, and use of population modeling tools suggests the quota, if reached, will result in an approximate 10 to 20 percent reduction in the 2014 late winter count, according to MacFarland.

"We want people to understand that meeting a quota of 275 wolves does not equal removal of over a third of the current minimum population," said MacFarland. "The committee has been working closely with University of Wisconsin researchers and based on our best population modeling knowledge, we estimate the approved quota could reduce the population by approximately 13 percent taking all mortality factors into account."

The quota will be distributed across the landscape with six hunting and trapping zones, identical to last year. The harvestable quota established for each zone concentrates hunting pressure more in areas with higher potential for agricultural conflicts, allowing for higher population densities in core wolf habitat where potential for conflict is lower.

Though the quota has been decided, the amount of wolves harvestable by state trappers and hunters may be adjusted dependent on tribal harvest declarations. Once that is determined, DNR can confirm the quota and the total licenses that will be available to state hunters and trappers. The department will maintain the 10-to-1 license-to-quota ratio from the 2012 season. One half of available permits will be issued randomly among all permit applications and the second half will be issued through a cumulative preference point drawing. Successful applicants will be notified by letter, likely in mid to late September. Applicants who are not successful in the drawing will be awarded a preference point toward future drawings.

Those interested in obtaining a license or a preference point for the 2013 season must apply by Aug. 1. The permit application fee is \$10 and applications can be purchased from authorized license agents, over the Internet through the DNR Online Licensing Center or by phone at 1-877-945-4236 toll free.

The season is set to begin Oct. 15 and will run in each zone until the zone is closed by the DNR or the last day of February, whichever occurs first. The department has the authority to close hunting zones when quotas are met or earlier if deemed biologically necessary.

Lumberjack Steam Train Kicks Off
2013 Season This Thursday**

LAONA, WI, June 19, 2013 -- The historic Lumberjack Steam Train will make its first run of the year to the Camp 5 Logging Museum Complex on June 20, 2013. Take the whole family on a trip back in time with a ride on a vintage steam train, located in Laona, Wis., within convenient driving distance of Chicago, the Twin Cities and all points in Wisconsin.

As the season kicks off the Camp 5 Museum Foundation is happy to announce a major donation of documents and pictures from the early lumber years in Northern Wisconsin collected by author Harvey Huston. Some of the items from the collection donated by his daughter, Ondre Huston, are already on display. Over time the entire collection will be incorporated into the already extensive collection of early logging history in the museum. The Foundation is working toward cataloging and cross referencing names and places so that future generations may be able to track their relatives.

"I am delighted to know that my father's collection has found a home where it will be appreciated by so many people," said Ms. Huston. "In addition, I know my father had enjoyed his correspondence and visits with Mary Roddis Connor and Gordon R Connor who founded Camp 5 and had helped him with information for his books."

"There is a lot of information included in the files of Harvey Huston. So far, we have only scratched the surface, it is a 'treasure trove' of information and we are proud that she chose to donate it to our collection," said Cate Dellin, president of the Camp 5 Museum Foundation. "These new materials will be interesting to railroad buffs, genealogists and early Wisconsin historians. The collection includes pictures of early towns like Pickering and Long Lake, among others and show how isolated living up in this area was in the early years of settlement."

Harvey Huston was the author of the books Thunder Lake Narrow Gauge Railroad and also the Roddis Line. His two books on logging railroads in Northern Wisconsin culminated years of research. A long time summer visitor to Northern Wisconsin, his love of railroads, his naturally curious mind, his love of history, and his organizational skills all brought this to his quest and mission to know more about the history of the area. He was the attorney for the Santa Fe Railroad and resided in the suburbs of Chicago. His books were published after years of diligent research and hundreds of letters, searching for answers to his questions. He also accumulated hundreds of early photographs, of which he used many in his books.

Tickets on the Lumberjack Steam Train include the round-trip ride and admission into the Camp 5 Logging Museum Complex of historic and natural attractions, including the Logging Museum and Blacksmith Shop, Green Treasure Forest Tour, Animal Barn and Corral, the Nature Center, Cracker Barrel Store, Francis Weiner Diesel Static Display and Choo Choo Hut Restaurant & Picnic Area. Three PBIS Schools of Merit**

The School District of Crandon is proud to announce that Crandon Elementary School, Crandon Middle School and Crandon High School have all been honored by the state as PBIS schools of merit for the second consecutive year. This honor is bestowed on schools who demonstrate "tremendous work accomplished through the implementation of Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports". The Crandon Schools were 3 of the 146 schools selected statewide to receive this honor.

Schools were recognized as Schools of Merit based on an application process, which included team and meeting information, implementation and outcome data, as well as narrative questions that described the data, systems and practices of PBIS implementation.

The School District of Crandon has many more celebrations to share; including 6 out of 9 of our varsity athletic teams receiving conference titles. This is a remarkable and historic feat in the conference and one which we are very proud of.

While the district excelled in the athletic arenas, it also did well academically and in the arts. There were wonderful productions both at the elementary, middle and high school levels. The productions included Under the Big Top and Hail to the Chief. Those productions played to packed houses in the Robert Jaeger Auditorium.

The forensics team traveled to state competition and competed well. The solo and ensemble participants fared very well in the regional and state level competitions.

Our students are also performing well in visual arts. A Crandon freshman took "Best of Show" in the highly competitive Northern Lakes Art Show. Speaking of art work, the new symbol of the district, the new Cardinal, was approved by the school board. This cardinal is an original design which was submitted as a part of a community wide art contest to redesign the Crandon Cardinal so that it is an original, representing our school. As soon as an electronic, copy written version of the new logo is created, it will be unveiled.

Attendance among the students in the district has shown steady improvement over the past three years. Attendance at school on a regular basis prevents lapses in the curriculum students receive making the students more well-rounded in their education. This is one of the many factors contributing to the increase in scores our schools are experiencing.

As James Comer, the Maurice Falk Professor of Child Psychiatry at the Yale University School of Medicine's Child Study Center, has stated, "No significant learning occurs without a significant relationship." This has been the most significant piece to the improvements the district has experienced. I believe every student feels a close bond with at least one of the teachers, paraprofessionals or administrators at school. These relationships are facilitated by the work the district is doing in regards to Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports at school. Adults are focused on what students are doing well, and building on those things. When a student violates a rule, all staff members are viewing those incidents as teachable moments, as well as opportunities to look for ways to support the student so they do not make the same error repeatedly. This process builds relationships and makes students feel valued and respected. When students feel this way, they perform better. The School District of Crandon is indeed fortunate to have a staff and student body that embraces this philosophy.

None of the successes that are listed would have been achieved without the terrific work of great people. The coaches, the drama directors, the teachers and students have all contributed to the wonderful success the School District of Crandon has experienced. It is also important to recognize parents, as a child's first and most important teachers, have done a great job getting their students to school and preparing them for the rigors of the curriculum. The community and the parents have been very supportive of the schools this year, and that support is another factor in why the district is performing well.

The school board also plays a part in the positive work occurring. They have been terrific in supporting the initiatives in the district, allowing the work to be done. The board has established policies that allow for hiring the best possible candidates for positions. They have helped to create an atmosphere of success in the district.

As with the end of every school year, transition is inevitable. We have had some longtime members of the school community retire. Those shoes seem hard to fill, but they will be filled, and the district will continue to move forward in a positive way. Next year will see new leadership in the elementary and high school. Mrs. Jamee Belland will serve as the Elementary School Principal and Mr. Andy Space will assume the reigns of the high school as the Middle and High School Principal. Mr. Wendell Quesinberry will join us as the new Activities Director/Dean of Students.

Our school motto is "Learning Today, Leading Tomorrow!" Since 2010, the School District of Crandon has produced leaders who either are, or soon will be serving in leadership roles in other districts. Seven former Crandon teachers are now serving as administrators either in this district or other districts. It makes the district proud to know that we are producing adult leaders for Wisconsin public schools.

The district has had a great 2012-13 school year. The PBIS awards are examples of the hard work that is, and will be recognized on the part of our schools. It is truly a great time to be a Crandon Cardinal.

**USDA Seeks Applications for Grants to
Improve the Quality of Rural Housing**

WASHINGTON - JUNE 20, 2013 -- Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack today announced that USDA is accepting applications for grants to help low- and very-low-income rural residents repair their homes. USDA remains focused on carrying out its mission, despite a time of significant budget uncertainty. Today's announcement is one part of the Department's efforts to strengthen the rural economy.

The grants are then distributed to qualified homeowners or owners of multi-family rental properties or cooperative dwellings who rent to low- and very-low-income residents. The grants can be used to weatherize and repair existing structures, install or improve plumbing or provide access to people with disabilities. In addition, the program assists rental property owners and cooperative housing complexes in repairing and rehabilitating their units if they agree to make such units available to low- and very-low-income persons.

Last year, Community Development Alternatives, Inc., in Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin, received funds to help five very-low income homeowners make repairs to their homes. Additionally, in Vernon County, Wisconsin, Couleecap, Inc. was able to assist four very-low income homeowners make needed repairs.
