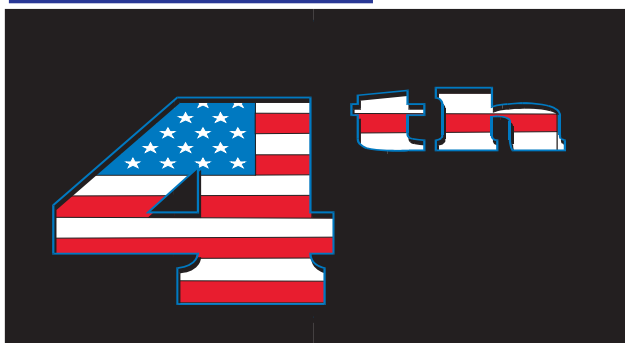

**City of Crandon holds special
meeting on mayoral recall
election**

A Special Emergency Meeting of the Crandon Common Council was held last week on Thursday, June 26th at City Hall.

The meeting was called by Council President Bucky Dailey because the mayor could not be contacted. The reason for the meeting was to affirm the date of the recall election for the post of Mayor, City of Crandon, as called for by state statute.

Prior to the call to order of the meeting, Mayor Jaeger told the council that he did not call the meeting, and he believed that the meeting was illegal and that he would prefer formal charges in the morning if the meeting was held. Jaeger tossed the gavel to Dailey saying "She's all yours." Jaeger elaborated by saying that there wasn't a long enough grace period for a special meeting.

City Attorney asked what a grace period was for, and Jaeger replied that there wasn't enough time to notify everybody.

Attorney Lindsay Erickson, to make sure that everything was above board and legal, stepped out and made a call to the Government Accountability Board (GAB) to check out the legalities. When she returned, she said she was comfortable with the meeting.

Alderman Otto asked what constituted an emergency meeting? Erickson answered by explaining that state statute required an election date be set within a legal time limit or the GAB would step in and set the meeting. Erickson also explained that if Otto or anyone else on the council wasn't comfortable with having the meeting that evening, they could do it tomorrow, on Friday. The mayor asked if it could be held on Monday so Alderman Asher could be present, and Alderman Ison and Gryczkowski spoke up and said that the issue shouldn't be put off any longer and that it needs to get done.

Erickson explained that Alderman Berg had wanted this meeting to change his no vote from the previous meeting, and that she also wanted to clear up any questions concerning the process.

The emergency meeting was finally called to order and a discussion was held about the proper procedures required for the council to order the recall vote.

Alderman Houle asked if he was forced to vote yes, and if he didn't he could be prosecuted for his no vote, and Erickson said that he could indeed vote no if he wished to. Houle asked if he could be prosecuted for voting no and Erickson signified this was correct.

Otto wanted to see some of this in writing, and Erickson explained that the statute read "shall," and that means in legal jargon, "must." Erickson also explained that if you don't do it, you are in violation of the law.

There was a motion by Alderman Stamper to approve the order of recall and seconded by Alderman Berg.

Before the roll call vote was taken, Houle stated that he doesn't think the government can force him to vote against his will under duress of being prosecuted, so he wouldn't vote yes.

Berg said that he had felt that way at the first meeting on the recall, but had changed his mind and said that he had taken an oath of office and had vowed to uphold the laws of the state.

A roll call vote was taken, and the following votes were recorded: Aye votes were given by Berg, Dailey, Gryczkowski, Ison and Stamper. Houle voted "No," and Otto abstained, with the motion carried by the majority.

As a result of this vote, the GAB won't have to step in and set an election date. The recall election will be held on Tuesday, July 29, 2014 at City Hall. A candidate has stepped in to run against Mayor Jaeger. Dennis Rosa has filed his nomination papers to run against incumbent Mayor Jaeger.

Kelly Westlund, a former City Councilor from Ashland, is mounting a challenge to Republican Sean Duffy to represent northern Wisconsin in the U.S. House of Representatives in what is being called one of the most contentious House races of 2014.

As a member of the Ashland City Council, Westlund saw the impacts state and federal decisions have on local governments and rural communities. She says that as a member of Congress, she will fight to protect the rights and decision-making abilities of local government.

A former nonprofit executive and small business owner, Westlund's work focused on helping rural communities become more self-reliant. Westlund says she understands the need for long-term job creation and responsible management of natural resources in northern Wisconsin, adding that industries such as logging, fishing, tourism, and agriculture can provide a platform for economic growth and security for rural communities.

Westlund understands the challenges facing the people of northern Wisconsin. The first in her family to earn a four-year degree, Westlund worked her way through college waiting tables. And she's no stranger to financial struggle. During the economic collapse in 2008, Westlund's husband, a carpenter, was laid off and their family relied on unemployment insurance to make ends meet. Populist economic issues such as extending UI for the long-term unemployed and raising the minimum wage have been central to Westlund's campaign.

Westlund grew up in a military family and spent her childhood on bases around the country. With a father in the Air Force, a step-father in the Navy, and a mother who worked for the Department of Defense, her upbringing influenced Westlund to focus much of her campaign on addressing the needs of veterans and military servicemen and women.

Westlund criticized what she calls "the least productive Congress in the history of our country," saying she believes that the people of northern Wisconsin deserve real representation in Washington -- not gridlock and obstruction. She has been traveling the expansive 7th Congressional District and meeting with voters since her announcement in December.



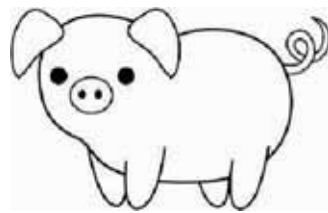

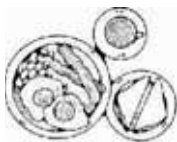

Natural Resources Board approves first phase of DNR land sales

Madison - The Natural Resources Board today approved recommendations from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources for the first phase of land sales to occur under the direction of the 2013-15 state biennial budget bill.

The 2013-15 state biennial budget directed the Natural Resources Board to make 10,000 acres of land available for sale by June 30, 2017. This new law specifies that net proceeds from the sale of these lands will be used to repay outstanding public debt related to the Knowles Nelson Stewardship program.

"This new land sales effort is the result of a directive from the Wisconsin state legislature," said DNR Secretary Cathy Stepp. "The Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program has done wonders for our state's natural resources - this next step will ensure that it continues to create new recreational opportunities throughout the state."

The Wisconsin Legislature created the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program in 1989 to preserve valuable natural areas and wildlife habitat, protect water quality and fisheries and expand opportunities for outdoor recreation. Since its inception, the program has added more than 600,000 acres of land for public recreation through direct purchase or easement.

Those interested in locating public access properties throughout Wisconsin are encouraged to utilize tools created by the department. A Public Access Lands atlas and online mapping application are available to help locate public lands.

DNR currently owns approximately 1,517,454 acres in fee title ownership and 300,267 acres in easements. The sale of 10,000 acres represents less than 1% of the Department's total land ownership.

The sale of land under this new law will help the department achieve the following objectives: realign land ownership for more efficient management; repurpose lands that don't serve the department's mission to more suitable use; work with other organizations to meet common property and conservation goals; direct limited land management funds to properties that serve the department's mission; and resolve boundary and access issues.

The law will only affect lands located outside of official project boundaries established prior to May 1, 2013. A project boundary is created by a feasibility study, master plan or other official action by the Natural Resources Board. The department currently has over 600 named projects with established project boundaries.

In addition to the involvement of the public and state and local officials, the department conducted field reviews to evaluate the conservation and recreation values of each land parcel.

Parcels with legal access from a public road will be offered for sale to local or tribal governments with expressed interest in the parcel and later to the general public through a competitive bidding process. In all cases, the department will work closely with local municipalities and adjoining landowners to ensure that trail corridors and/or easements are perpetuated prior to marketing any parcel for sale and that the Department retains access as necessary to adjoining lands.

It is important to note that there is no specific timeline for marketing any of the parcels. When each parcel is cleared for sale it will be marketed as outlined above.

During the last week in June, Science students, Amelia Weber, Brittany Kevilus, Austin Townsend and Mason Wamego accompanied by their teacher, Steve Kircher, traveled to UW-Madison to attend the Morgridge Institute's Summer Science Camp. The purpose of the camp is to provide an opportunity for high school students in rural communities to experience the academic excellence and cultural adventures of the UW campus. The students were able to conduct research and experiments along with UW scientists in stem cells, regenerative biology and tissue engineering to include turning stem cells into heart muscle, neural material and bone. As part of their camp, they were able to tour a teaching lab at the UW hospital complex and perform a laproscopic surgery simulation.

The camp included science lectures, hands on labs, college advising, and fun filled evening activities that included a Camp Randall tour and a Madison Mallard baseball game. Students met prominent scientists and researchers, including Dr. Jamie Thompson, the scientist who discovered stem cells. When asked, Dr. Thompson said his lab is currently working on growing blood vessels from stem cells and figuring out the clock that triggers cells to split and reproduce.

To conclude the week, students were required to do a Poster as a final project and present them to parents, researchers and sponsors. Mr. Kircher and the Camp staff were most impressed with the posters and presentations the students conducted.
