



Nicolet College Foundation awards record number of scholarships for upcoming academic year

The Nicolet College Foundation has awarded a record 308 scholarships for the 2014-15 academic year, nearly double the number awarded 10 years ago.

"Scholarships make it possible for many students to attend college who may otherwise not get the education they need to improve their lives," said Heather Schallock, executive director of the Nicolet College Foundation.

"The Foundation's growth over the years has been due to the generous support of a growing number of donors and to each and every one of them we extend a huge thank you."

In all, the Foundation has awarded \$361,000 in scholarships for the upcoming academic year. These range from \$500 to \$2,500 for traditional scholarships to about \$6,000 a student for those recognized as Community Scholars.

The Foundation started the Community Scholars program last year, offering full-ride scholarships to Nicolet to a graduating senior in each of the 11 PK-12 school districts in the Nicolet District. These scholarships cover all tuition, books, and required supplies.

"I cannot thank the Nicolet College Foundation enough for assisting me in accomplishing my goals and dreams," said Bobbi Schauer, a Community Scholar from Elcho, who has her sights set on becoming a doctor. "This is an incredible opportunity."

To qualify, students must have a 3.7 grade point average or better and have demonstrated exemplary behavior while in high school.

Last year six students accepted the full-ride scholarships to attend Nicolet. Seven students accepted Community Scholars awards for the upcoming year. Along with Schauer, the other Community Scholars for next year are Natalie Miller, Three Lakes High School; Trevor Marvin, Crandon High School; Samantha Busha, Northland Pines High School; Emily Bushor, Lakeland Union High School; William Keiffer, Rhinelander High School; and Jacob Pakulski, Wabeno High School.

"The financial assistance donors provide to students really does transform lives and helps build a stronger Northwoods," Schallock said.

I will try to keep taxes down by applying for grant money for vehicle and equipment purchases.





Promoting Healthy Bones

Bone is alive. Bone is a living and growing tissue. Throughout life, bone is constantly being renewed in a process called remodeling. During remodeling, old bone is removed and it is replaced with fresh new bone.

Healthy bone actions:

- eat a well-balanced diet rich in calcium, vitamin D, and magnesium
 - participate in regular exercise
- · take safety precautions to protect your bones and prevent falls
 - · limit alcohol intake
 - avoid excessive dieting and excessive thinness
- · talk to a medical professional about promoting healthy bones.

Why does calcium matter? Think of your bones as a bank account in which you "deposit" and "withdraw" calcium throughout life. Calcium is a mineral that makes bone dense and strong. Throughout your life, if your dietary calcium intake is too low, your body will "withdraw" the calcium it needs from your bone. Over time, if more calcium is taken out of your bones than is put in, the result may be thin, weak bones (osteoporosis). In your senior years, usually after age 70, thin, weak bones may break more easily during normal activities. It is important and easy to meet your daily calcium, recommendation by choosing a well balanced, calcium rich diet including spinach, kale, soybeans, white beans, some fish like sardines, salmon, perch and rainbow trout, dairy products *if tolerated) and calcium fortified foods such as orange juice and some cereals. Supplements may be necessary.

Why is Vitamin D important? Vitamin D is

necessary to build and maintain strong bones by helping your body absorb and use calcium. Except for fatty fish and fortified milk, soy milk or orange juice, there are few reliable dietary sources of vitamin D. To get the proper amount of vitamin D, sun exposure and supplements are generally necessary.

Magnesium is important too! Magnesium is necessary to convert vitamin D into its active form so that it can turn on calcium absorption. Green leafy vegetables, such as spinach, legumes, nuts and seeds, whole grains, bananas, dark chocolate and dairy products are good sources. It can be a challenge to get enough Mg through

Get moving! An ideal exercise program combines weight-bearing, muscle-strengthening, and posture and balance exercises. Weight-bearing exercise such as walking, dancing and climbing stairs builds bone mass in youth and maintains it in adulthood. Muscle strengthening exercises build muscle that helps support your bones. Lifting weights, using resistance bands and exercising on resistance machines are ways to strengthen muscle. Proper body alignment and posture training exercises promote correct posture and may help to minimize the stooped posture that results from osteoporosis. To ensure your safety, consult your medical professional before beginning an exercise program.

Forest County Sheriff's Dept. acquires MRAP vehicle



In April 2014, the Forest County Sheriff's Office received a Mine-Resistant Ambush Protected vehicle (MRAP) through the Wisconsin 10-33 program for free. Initial cost of the vehicle is approximately \$733,000 and the vehicle is approximately one year old. The only cost associated to Forest County was a trucking fee from the plant in Texas where the vehicle was manufactured to Forest County.

The MRAP is strictly a defensive vehicle and is not armed with weapons. It will however protect the crew from bullets and explosive devices. The MRAP is also six wheel drive and is fully capable of accessing unmaintained roads in the winter for rescue operations. The MRAP will also be used for high risk calls including active shooters, barricaded gunman, dangerous drug arrests & searches, and hostage or injured person rescues.

The Forest County Sheriff's Office has used armored vehicles from other jurisdictions in the past and will now utilize the MRAP to reduce response time to emergency situations. The Forest County Sheriff's Office is dedicated to reducing operational and equipment costs to the citizens of Forest County.




