Rare, historic artifact found in Reservoir Pond. Townsend

In the spring of 2014, Debbie and Kyle Roeser of Green Bay pulled a very heavy white pine floater out of the water near the boat landing on Reservoir Pond in Townsend. It has a U and a D clearly marked in two places leading to its identification as an original log from the [Uri] Balcom and [Devillo] Holt Lumber Company. It was most certainly cut prior to 1887 when Holt bought out Balcom and use of this blaze (stamp) was discontinued.

Camp 5, Laona, hosts the Timberworks Lumberjack Show



The Lumberjacks are coming to Camp 5! On Saturday, July 19th, the Timberworks Lumberjack Show will perform their amazing repertoire of old lumberjack skills at Camp 5. Sponsored by Stihl, manufacturers of modern lumberjack tools, this logging team performs many of the feats that were required by the lumberjacks of days gone by. And, be careful, the audience sometimes get drawn into the show!

These modern-day lumberjacks will demonstrate such skills as axe-throwing, and the proper way to use the cross-cut saw (it used to be called the "misery whip"). There is also a one-man saw contest held between the Timberworks Lumberjacks. See chain-saw carving, poleclimbing, and birling. If you don't know what birling is, imagine two men on either end of a floating log, each of them trying to throw the other in the water, using fancy footwork and squirrel-like quickness!

Over a million people have watched the Timberworks Lumberjack Show and learned something about the men and their skills in the tall timber that helped create a nation.

Visitors to Camp 5 will also enjoy the museum, the working blacksmith, the petting zoo, the Crackerbarrel Gift Shop, the Green Treasure Forest Tour, a pontoon boat ride on the famous Rat River, and, of course, the trip to Camp 5 on 'Ol 4-Spot, a working 1916 vintage steam train complete with vintage passenger cars and cabooses!

You embark on the Lumberjack Steamtrain at the depot on Highway 8, on the west side of Laona. The first train leaves the depot at 11:00 a.m., 12:00 p.m., 1:00 p.m. And 2:00 p.m., with the last train returning to Laona at 4:00 p.m.

The Lumberjacks will perform at 11:45, 1:30, and 2:45.

UW Extension food tips

Grilling season is shifting into high gear as many people enjoy Wisconsin's all-too-short summer by cooking meals outdoors. When you're grilling out, keep in mind that foodborne illness peaks in the summer, says University of Wisconsin-Extension food science specialist Barbara Ingham. She offers these tips to help you keep the grilling

--Wash your hands with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds before and after handling food, especially raw meat.

--Always marinate foods in the refrigerator, not on the counter or outdoors. "Boil used marinade before applying it to cooked food," says Ingham. "Reserve a portion of unused marinade to use as a sauce for cooked meat. Do not rely on heating to decontaminate the marinade that has been in contact with raw meat."

--When grilling foods, preheat the coals on your grill for 20 or 30 minutes, or until the coals are lightly coated with ash.

—If you partially cook food in the microwave, oven or stove to reduce grilling time, do so immediately before the food goes on the hot grill. "Partial cooking saves time, can help prevent flare-ups, and for products like chicken, often results in a better quality meal,'

--When it's time to grill your food, cook it to a safe internal temperature. Use a food thermometer to be sure. "Place the food thermometer in the thickest part of the meat. Don't let it touch the bone, fat or gristle," says Ingham. Check the temperature in several places to make sure the food is evenly heated.

· Beef, veal and lamb steaks and roasts: 145°F for medium rare (with a 3-minute rest time) and 160°F for medium.

· Ground pork and ground beef: 160°F.

· Poultry: at least 165°F.

· Fin fish: 145°F or until the fish is opaque and separates easily with a fork.

· Shrimp, lobster and crabs: The meat should be pearly and opaque.

· Clams, oysters and mussels: Until the shells are open.

--Never place cooked food on a plate that previously held raw meat, poultry, seafood or eggs. Be sure to have plenty of clean utensils and platters on hand.

--Grilled food can be kept hot until serving by moving it to the side of the grill rack, just away from the coals to avoid overcooking.

--Avoid placing foods in the Danger Zone (40°F to 140°F) for more than one hour on a warm summer's day. "Never let raw meat, poultry, eggs, cooked food or cut fresh fruit or vegetables sit unrefrigerated for more than an hour on a warm day," says Ingham.

Water Safety

· Never swim alone. Even good swimmers need buddies!

Swim in designated areas supervised by lifeguards

Ensure that everyone in your family learns how to swim well

Never leave a young child unattended near water

Children and inexperienced swimmers should wear life jackets at all times when on boats or near bodies of water Make sure the life jacket is the correct size. It should not be loose and should always be

worn as instructed with all straps buckled. ·Avoid alcohol use around water. Alcohol impairs judgment, balance, and coordination; affects swimming skills; and reduces the body's ability to stay warm.

Know your limits. Don't swim farther or hold your breath for longer than you are able to Sun Safety

Seek shade

·Protect your skin with clothing

·Wear a hat

·Wear sunglasses that block UV rays

·Wear sunscreen

·Read the labels (sunscreens with broad spectrum protection and with SPF values of 30 or higher are recommended)

·Be sure to apply the sunscreen properly (always follow the label directions)

· Protect your children from the sun

· Children need special attention. They tend to spend more time outdoors, can burn more easily, and may not be aware of the dangers

Hot Weather Tips for Your Health

·Never leave children, disabled persons, or pets in a parked car-even briefly

·Wear loose-fitting, cotton clothing, preferably of a light color

Drink plenty of water to prevent dehydration and eat lightly

Avoid caffeine and alcohol as these promote dehydration

·Be aware of the symptoms of heat exhaustion and heat stroke

-Heat exhaustion: heavy sweating, paleness, tiredness, headache, weakness, dizziness.

nausea, vomiting, fainting - Heat stroke: extremely high body temperature (above 103 degrees), red, hot, and dry

skin, (no sweating), rapid, strong pulse, throbbing headache, dizziness, nausea, confusion, unconsciousness *The signs of heat stroke could indicate a life-threatening emergency and should be






A discussion was held regarding the cost of the dumpster. It was decided to request new bids to see if a lower cost could be obtained.


Pack 'Em Inn Biker Rally & Poker Run receives tourism grant
