Freeze the Gain Forest County

Are you looking for a way to maintain your weight during the hustle and bustle of the upcoming holiday season? Registration for the Forest County Freeze the Gain Challenge and a confidential weigh-in by a health care provider will be held on Wednesday, November 19th at 5:30 p.m. in the lower level of the Crandon Public Library. Participants who weigh-in and weigh-out on Wednesday, January 7th gaining no more than two pounds of their starting weight, will receive a completion award and will be entered into a drawing to win a Fit Bit, a physical fitness tracking device.

"The Haunting of Hedren House" is an original work based on a story created by the WHS cast and adapted into a script by Nick Ireland. The horror story in the play tells the tale of fourteen-year-old Lydia Hedren. Lydia is befriended by Janet Hedren, a distant teenage relative who has been a ghost since the 1870's. When Lydia's older sister and her cheerleading squad begin mistreating Lydia, Janet exacts murderous revenge. The comedy in the play revolves around the ludicrous behavior of the airheaded girls on the cheerleading squad and the often less-than-dignifying ends they meet. "This show is fun and silly, but also a little dark and twisted," says director Nick Lowery. "Our Spring Musical this year will be very much geared toward younger kids, but this show is designed a bit more for older kids and grown-ups."

In a tribute to horror movies, all the female characters are named after either lead actresses or lead female characters in horror or ghost movies. Teagen Bodoh and Kaitlyn Ashbeck play Lydia and Janet Hedren respectively. Abigail Ashbeck plays Lydia's sister, Blair. The cheer squad consists of Jasmine Hanson as cheer captain, Tippi; Olivia Kralovetz as Mina; Kelci Godin as Sissy; Kassidy Ashbeck as Elsa; and Ellie Donaldson as Jamie Lee. Director Nick Lowery appears briefly as Uncle Ethan. Kurt Pence is stage manager, and has helped lead crews from Mr. Pat Lowery's tech-ed classes in building the set. Ian McKenna, Noah Exferd, James Mervyn and Aidan Lowery are the lighting and booth crew.

Milk in glass bottle available again at Schaefer's IGA

Milk in a glass bottle? What a novel idea! Well, no it isn't a new idea. All milk came in glass bottles at one time, until paper cartons and, eventually, plastic bottles. At Schaefer's IGA, you can now get your milk in a glass bottle, and many customers are now opting for Lamer's brand milk at the dairy case.

In the photo above, Jay Schaefer, left, and Jerry Cronce pose for a photo with a bottle of milk. Jerry, Jay found out, was a milkman way back when he was a boy. In fact, the Cronce family milked cows and bottled milk for sale in the Crandon area in the 1930's into the 1940's. Jerry remembered running the milk to the houses when he was nine years-old, while brother Eddie drove the truck. Eddie was about fourteen years-old, but as Jerry said, having a driver's license back then wasn't that important.

Jerry said that they milked cows from two farms, his grandmother's farm and his father's farm. The milk wasn't pasteurized. The business was called Spring Hill Dairy, and was up the hill off of the first corner on Highway 55 as you leave Crandon heading south.

Milk in glass Cont. from pg. 1

The conversation turned to the days when all milk was in glass bottles, and when you drank milk, it was from a local dairy and local farmers. This has certainly changed. The question arose as to how many, if any, dairy farmers are still operating in Forest County?

Crandon had a creamery that didn't survive the 1950's. My memories of milk go back to the Argonne Dairy, which closed in about 1964. A little after 6:00 a.m., the door opened and the rattle of glass bottles in a metal carrier woke you up. Joe the Milkman was in the kitchen, opened the refrigerator and checked out your needs. Whatever you were out of or close to it, was replaced. The freezer door was opened to see if the Huebner's French vanilla ice cream was getting low. George Huebner, who later moved to Crandon, was making this ice cream in, I think, Embarrass, Wisconsin, and Marv Guth, owner of Argonne Dairy, sold it from his milk trucks. The milkman came every other day, and the Argonne Dairy delivered milk to towns as far away as Minocqua, Eagle River, Lakewood, and even in Land O' Lakes.

In Laona, Alderton Dairy was producing milk for the locals. In an interview with Felix Alderton, he said that during the depression they had no market for their milk until the Civilian Conservation Corps came to the area. They bought a small dairy out downstate, moved the equipment to a building on the Alderton farm and put in bids to supply milk for the many camps in this area. Felix said they pasteurized their milk. He said at first, they weren't sure if it was properly pasteurized or not, but eventually learned, and the milk was hauled to the camps in pint bottles, checks came in, and everyone breathed a little easier.

Jay Schaefer says there are customers who swear that the milk in glass bottles tastes better. He said you should be the judge of that. The glass-bottled milk is available in Crandon and in the Country Store in Pearson. There is a \$1.50 deposit on the bottles that is refunded when they are brought back to the store, and they are redeemable in either store. The cost is slightly more than milk in plastic containers.



The Scoop on Energy Drinks

Getting revved up on energy drinks day after day may have health consequences. The primary concern is that such beverages are high in caffeine and other stimulants designed to boost mental or physical performance.

The caffeine amount ranges from 80 to 175 milligrams (mg) per 8-ounce serving; some containers have multiple servings. The maximum amount the FDA considers safe in cola-style beverages is 71 mg per 12 ounces. For comparison, an average 8-ounce cup of coffee has 130 mg, a 16-ounce latte averages 240 mg, and a 12-ounce cola averages 37 mg.

When choosing your drink, check labels for the caffeine amount. However, not all drinks list caffeine content as the FDA does not require it on product labels, so you may not have a clear understanding of what's in the drink or its impact. Also keep in mind that:

- Energy drinks are often used as mixer with alcohol, especially by young people. The stimulants in energy drinks can mask intoxication, reducing one's awareness of their effects.
- Their stimulating effects can boost heart rate and blood pressure, contribute to dehydration and, like other stimulants, prevent sleep.
- They are linked to at least 34 deaths and numerous hospitalizations.
- They should not be used while exercising; the combination of fluid loss from sweating and the diuretic effect of caffeine can lead to severe hydration.

Watch your sensitivity to these drinks, educate your children about the risks and don't over consume them.
