Grow North holds regional forestry discussion

Grow North, the regional economic development corporation, held a State of the Region Forestry Discussion in Antigo, at the North Central Technical College, on Friday, May 1st.

DNR Secretary Cathy Stepp was on hand to give a talk on the long-eared bat issue, as well as the Good Neighbor Authority.

Don Peterson was the second speaker, and he gave an update on a stewardship grant and on the Hardwood Products Strategy Grant. A question and answer session followed the speakers, and a tour of the Kretz Lumber Co. sawmill and the Kretz demonstration forest followed this session.

Secretary Stepp spoke first on the problems that could happen with the long-eared bat. Because of the bat's affliction with white nose syndrome, a fungus that found its way here from Europe, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is proposing keeping a quarter-mile no-cut radius around a tree that the bat is using for a roost. This can have a serious effect on the logging industry, not only in Wisconsin, but in another 38 states as well. Stepp and others are working on solutions that will protect bats and loggers

The proposed ATV trail project is waiting for approval to work on the right of ways from the Department of Transportation. There are culverts that need to be replaced and the work can not be started until the Department of Transportation issues permits to start the work.

Lake Metonga Association has partnered with the Sokaogon Chippewa Community, and with the approval of the Wisconsin DNR, to harvest bullheads, which have had a negative impact on the larger game fish population in Lake Metonga.

Mike Preul will use the tribe's electro-shocking boat for this harvest and bullheads will be placed in holding pens until distributed on Friday, May 15.

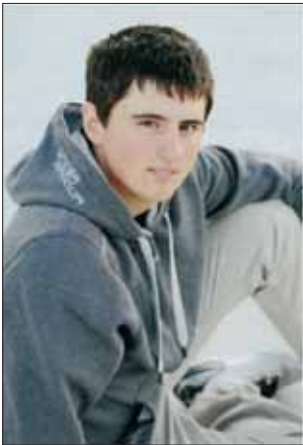

Wisconsin Public Service requests new electric and natural gas rates for 2016

Green Bay, WI – Wisconsin Public Service Corporation (WPS), a subsidiary of Integrys Energy Group, Inc. (NYSE: TEG) today filed a request for new utility rates in 2016 with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSCW). The proposal calls for increases in electric rates of 9.4% and 7.5% in natural gas distribution rates. For natural gas, when calculated including the pass-through natural gas prices, the effect is a 2.5% increase in a typical residential customer monthly bill of \$1.54. For electric, the monthly increase for the typical residential customer would be \$7.62 monthly.

The company's overall electric rates remained relatively stable during the period 2008-2015 and overall natural gas distribution rates had decreased over the same period (see charts).

Primary reasons for the requested increase in electric rates are:

- **Construction costs of the ReACT Emissions Control Project at the Weston 3 Plant near Wausau.
- **Transmission costs.
- **Costs to convert overhead electric lines to underground increasing electric reliability in areas prone to wind and storm damage.
- **Upgrades to the units 1 & 2 at the Fox Energy Center near Wrightstown, WI.
- **Costs to improve customer service processes.

Inflation.

"We have a number of infrastructure improvements taking place," said Pat Campshure, WPS Rate Case Consultant. "That is typical following several years of very stable electric rates when improvements weren't needed to provide safe and reliable electric service to our customers."

Campshure noted that despite the rate increase request for 2016, overall electric rates will have risen at about the same rate as inflation since 2008.

Primary reasons for the requested increase in natural gas rates are:

- **The elimination of "decoupling" refund of \$8 million last year.
- **Increased non-fuel operating and maintenance costs.

In recent years, WPS had been able to delay anticipated increases due to lower fuel costs. The request for 2016 is potentially the first substantial increase in electric rates in eight years. As always, rate cases are an iterative process during which WPS and PSCW evaluate the most current data later this year to arrive at final rates sometime near the end of 2015. It is likely the final rates will be lower than the initial request.

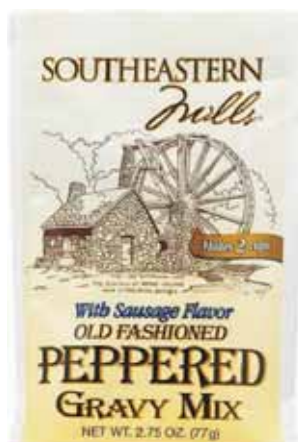

She also spoke of the Good Neighbor policy, a way to get timber to market from the national forests in Wisconsin.

Don Peterson runs a forestry consulting business and the Sustainable Resources Institute. He is based in Crystal Falls, Michigan. Peterson spoke of the Good Neighbor policy that is a program whereby the state would run timber sales for the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (CNNF). On the ground forestry could be contracted by the state with county forestry offices.

Peterson also gave a progress report on the first sale on the CNNF using a stewardship agreement. He was happy to report that the first tree hit the ground recently on a 224 acre timber sale on national forest lands. There are more stewardship sales in multiple counties in the planning stages. Stewardship has had success in getting timber to market in the U.P. on the Ottawa National Forest, and there has been considerable effort to get this mechanism in place in Wisconsin. The project is funded by Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC), and as it produces revenue from timber sales, should be self-perpetuating.


Peterson also talked about the Hardwood Products Industrial Strategy. This is WEDC funded, and is an effort to better market northern hardwoods. This would include finding market niches for value added to products that is located closer to the stump, and not many miles away. The valued added or manufacturing element would help create jobs in the Northwoods. The group will analyze foreign and domestic markets, build industry participation and go to targeted industrial events, trade shows, where markets may be found. This is designed to help Forest, Florence, Oconto, Oneida, Vilas and Marinette Counties.


The tour of the Kretz mill and the forest located behind the mill was designed to give those in attendance a chance to see how a modern sawmill works and to give all a short course in forestry.

The Kretz forest has been a useful tool for Kretz Lumber to educate owner of timberlands on good management practices, and the site also worked well to show Secretary Stepp and others how a forest grows and can benefit from cutting. It was good information and taught well by Kretz Forester Al Koepfel.

The proposed amendments to the 15 year comprehensive land use plan are to allow for a future MRA park on county forest land. William Connors asked Corporate Council Paul Payant if the proposed amendments were legally written and if it would be alright to present to the public at a public informational hearing. Payant replied that he will be double checking the plan and that he will make sure there is nothing illegal about how the proposed amendments are written before anything would be presented to the public. Craig Williams suggested that the people who will attend the public informational meeting should be able to offer suggestions for the proposed amendments.

Dave Ziolkowski suggested that the committee review and finalize the proposed amendments tonight.

William Connors and Don LeMaster were concerned about making the proposed amendments specific to the Wisconsin Off Road Vehicle Park. Paul Payant advised that the committee should not make the amendments specific to WORVPI.


Connors asked, "What if someone comes to the county and wants to put a park in? It is not fair to say that WORVPI has the first chance." Williams agreed that taking an entity out of the 15 year plan was a good idea, but he was concerned the amendments would be too vague. Paul Payant agreed that the committee should take WORVPI out of the amendments specifically and have the amendments read that Forest County is proposing to have a park. He also noted that we would have to clean up the amendments so that WORVPI's ideas were not in the proposed amendments.

The committee agreed that having a generic plan to amend the 15 year plan was the best plan of action. The committee also agreed that reviewing and finalizing the proposed amendments that night was the best option. The committee went page by page and deleted anything associated with WORVPI or any other entity.

Dave Ziolkowski was to rewrite the proposed amendments and Paul Payant will then review it to make sure that the writing of the amendments were legal. The proposed amendments will be available for the public soon. The public informational meeting is set for Tuesday, June 2nd, at the Forest County Courthouse at 6:00 p.m.
