Weeds 'N' Walleyes-raising money for the health of Lake Metonga

Weeds 'n' Walleyes are two of Lake Metonga's on going challenges. While walleye numbers continue to grow, approaching good-old-days numbers for some lucky fishermen, Eurasian water milfoil (EWM) is becoming a real nuisance. If your spending anytime, on or in the water this summer, you know first hand the problems with fouled propellers, plugged jet ski intakes, weed bound tillers on a sailboat or dangerous swimming

The extent of the EWM matting was very predictable from our past experience. We knew the year after the weevils froze out that the EWM footprint doubled. We learned that the year after a failed method of treatment application, the EWM acreage doubled.

For the years 2014 and 2015 the Lake Metonga Association was permitted to treat only the acres adjacent to the city and county beach and boat launch areas. This limited treatment program allowed the untreated EWM beds to double in 2014 and re-double in 2015.

Thats the bad news. The good news is that the Wisconsin DNR will provide a 65/35 funding grant for a major treatment in 2016.

The Lake Metonga Association is pulling out all the stops to meet their share of the 2016 treatment costs. Bake sales and car washes won't be enough to get the job done this time. The Association has raffles and boards at Kentuck Days, Art in the Square, a state-wide "Sportsman Raffle", numerous boards for fire-pits and antique Chris-Craft, rides at you favorite bars and restaurants and the BIG ONE! our Weeds 'N' Walleye Banquet Auction at Mole Lake on October 10th, 2015.

The local businesses have really stepped up in supporting our fund raising efforts. These sponsors get beat-up every day by countless groups and organizations needing donations. Little Rice Flowage meet leaves mixed feelings

A meeting between the DNR and concerned citizens was held last Wednesday evening, July 27, at the Crandon School auditorium.

About 80 people attended the meeting to air their complaints, advice, and to listen to the information provided by the DNR on the topic of Little Rice Flowage. located west of Crandon. The flowage is part of the Wolf River that flows out of Pine Lake near Hiles. It has been a treasured fishing area and duck hunting spot for countless people through the decades.

The meeting was opened by Chuck McCullough, DNR Area Wildlife Supervisor, Antigo. McCullough handed the podium over to Jason Cotter, who is a DNR Wildlife Biologist and the manager of Little Rice.

Cotter covered some of the history of the flowage, and said that the Town of Crandon originally owned the dam on the flowage, that dated back to 1936 and 1937 and piled up 1219 acres of water. The dam was operated by Town of Crandon from 1938 until 1952, when the structure was sold to the DNR. The DNR offered the dam to Forest County in 1983 for \$1.00, but the county

Cotter also talked about periodic drawdowns to the flowage in 1989, 1990, and 1994. Without getting into a very technical explanation, the dam is currently at a 94foot benchmark. The current dam is a remodel from 2014, when \$171,00 was spent on the structure.

School District of Wabeno School Lunch Program

The School District of Wabeno Area today announced its policy for children unable to pay the full price of meals served under the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program or mile for split-session students served under the Special Milk Program. Each school office and central office has a copy of the policy, which may be reviewed by any interested party.

The following household size and income criteria will be used for determining eligibility. Children from families whose annual income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free and reduced price meals or free milk if a split-session student does not have access to the school lunch or breakfast service.

Application forms are being sent to all homes with a notice to parents or guardians. To apply for free or reduced price meals or free milk, households must fill out the application and return it to the school (unless notified at the start of the school year that children are eligible through certification). Additional copies are available at the office in each school. The information provided on the application will be used for the prupose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by agency or other program officials. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

To obtain free or reduced price meals or free milk for children in a household where one or more household members receive FoodShare, FDPIR, or Wisconsin Works (W-2) cash benefits, list the household member and the FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2 case number, list the names of all school children, sign the application and return it to the school office.

For the school officials to determine eligibility for free or reduced price meals or free milk of households not receiving FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2 cash benefits, the household must provide the following information requested on the application: names of all household members and the adult signing the application form must also list the last four digits of his or her Social Security Number or mark the "I do not have a Social Security Number" box. Also, the income received by each household member must be provided by amount and source (wages, welfare, child support, etc.).

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal and free milk policy Jennifer Vogler, District Administrator, will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he/she may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. If the parent/guardian wishes to make a formal appeal, he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to: Janet Opiela, Board President, PO Box 460, Wabeno, WI 54566 or PH 715-473-2592.

If a hearing is needed to appeal the decision, the policy contains an outline of the hearing procedure.

Two confirmed cougar sightings in Langlade County

RHINELANDER, Wis. -- Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources biologists have confirmed two cougar sightings in Langlade County in northern Wisconsin.
On July 27, the department received a trail camera photo from a Langlade County landowner of a cougar taken July

On Aug. 3, a second Langlade County landowner submitted a trail camera photo of a cougar - this photo was also taken July 9.

After site evaluations, DNR staff confirmed the location of each photo. These photos were taken roughly six miles apart at a 20-hour interval.

Genetic evidence suggests cougars known to have entered Wisconsin are male cougars dispersing from a breeding population in the Western United States. There is currently no evidence that cougars are breeding in Wisconsin.

Cougars are a protected species in Wisconsin and hunting is not allowed. Cougars are not considered a threat to public safety, and in the unlikely event that a person is confronted by a cougar, face the animal and spread your arms and open your coat or jacket to appear larger. If a cougar approaches, make noise and throw rocks or sticks.

Individuals who observe cougars in Wisconsin are urged to report their findings using the Rare Mammal Observation form. For more information, visit dnr.wi.gov and search keyword "cougar."







Eagle specialty license plate now available for ordering celebrates bald eagles' comeback and lays foundation for next success

MADISON - Thanks to dedicated conservation efforts, bald eagles are soaring high once again over Wisconsin. Now, motorists can celebrate this accomplishment with a striking, one-of-a-kind license plate featuring an image of an eagle landing on the waters of the Mississippi River.



The drawdown that upsets local residents occurred in the winter of 2012, and appears to have killed almost every fish in the fishin' hole. This appears to be part of the rub on flowage management. Locals look at Little Rice as a place to duck hunt and to catch nice bluegills, crappies, northerns and bass. They also like to hunt ducks on this body of water.

The DNR, however, views the flowage as a wildlife area, and not an area to manage for a fishery. Locals, of course, have always had both uses, and they want to continue that usage.

In the course of this often animated conversation, the difference between a lake and a flowage was covered. A flowage, unlike a lake, is a body of water that covers, in many instances, private land that the landowner allowed to be flooded. A natural lake, of course, wasn't added after people owned the bottom.

The DNR stated that their goal is to enhance the wild rice for migratory birds, and that is something that many citizens don't approve of. Their argument is that as wild rice dies in the fall and falls to the bottom, it uses oxygen needed by fish as it decays. Most of those in attendance were in favor of raising the water level in the flowage by a foot or so, but this can change the levels that the wild rice needs. It can also flood more land that is low lying, and that can upset landowners who already have some of their land under water.

It was explained that to bring water levels up, 100% of the landowners have to agree with the increased water level or submit to a court action. This doesn't mean that the water level can't be increased, but it does mean that it can be a long and drawn out process.

McCullough explained that the first step has been taken with the petition that is being circulated. He also said that there are laws that have to be followed, and the DNR will have to apply for changes to bring the level above 94 feet, which is the allowed maximum level currently. He also stated that this process requires patience, and environmental analysis and a public notice and hearing before their is a disposition of levels.

While many attendees didn't like what they heard, it would appear that the process is the only choice, and there will be no quick fix.

There was much conversation about past days on the flowage, the size and quantity of the fish, and I expect a lot of unsatisfied fishermen, but it is a start.

How much exercise is enough?

Most Americans are not getting enough physical activity to maintain muscle strength, joint flexibility and weight control. In addition, lack of exercise can contribute to high blood pressure, osteoporosis, heart disease, diabetes and other chronic conditions.

In January, the USDA released new dietary guidelines that include recommendations for exercise. The report recommends a minimum of 30 minutes a day for health protection. It suggests moderate-intensity physical activity, such as walking, cycling or gardening.

For people who need to lose or control weight, the report suggests more exercise, 60-90 minutes on most days of the week. First see your healthcare provider if you are unaccustomed to this amount of activity.





ACCESS TO PUBLIC RECORDS

STUDENT RECORDS
