


### **Crandon International Announces** record \$46,000 cash purse for Amsoil Cup winner at 46th Annual World Championship



CRANDON, WISC. - For nearly five decades, the Labor Day off-road racing tradition at Crandon International Off-Road Raceway in Wisconsin has represented the sport's "Indianapolis 500." It's falls on a major summer weekend. It's a true Midwest tradition. There are huge crowds. It's a true and organic piece of motorsports Americana.

Perhaps most importantly to the world-class field of entries expected to take the green flag for the all-ornothing 6th Annual Amsoil Challenge Cup race is the \$56,500 in cash and other \$3,000 in products awaiting the winners of Crandon's weekend finale. As is tradition, this prize package represents the largest payday in shortcourse off-road racing, with the winner taking home \$46,000 in cash alone. The big race will see TORC's (The Off Road Championship) PRO 2WD and PRO 4x4 classes let loose on the track at the same time after receiving staggered starts.

Last year, the track set a single-day attendance record with 20,000 guests watching Sunday's action. Up to 45,000 race fans are expected to soak in the "Crandon Experience" over the entire Labor Day weekend.

Gates will open Wednesday, September 2nd for campers excited to get to Crandon's grassy camp and prepare for an action-packed racing by day and the event's highly-popular concerts and colorful parties by night. The weekend officially kicks-off on Friday, September 4th at 9:30 a.m. with the Pit Crew Competition and 46th Anniversary World Championship Labor Day Parade in downtown Crandon. # Tomatoes help to prevent Osteoporosis

**Osteoporosis** Lycopene, a carotenoid in tomatoes, has been shown to protect against some types of cancer, including prostate malignancies. Recent research shows it may also aid bone formation and prevent bone deterioration. Cooked tomatoes contain more available lycopene than raw ones. To gain this Bone-Protecting Effect: Eat 10 milligrams of lycopene daily. That's equivalent of one 12-ounce glass of tomato juice, one 12-ounce can of tomato sauce or one medium to large tomato.

Cook tomatoes for more lycopene. In one study, tomatoes cooked for 2,15 & 30 minutes contained 54%, 171% and 164% more of the antioxidant lycopene than did uncooked tomatoes. However, vitamin C levels fell 10%, 15% and 29% respectively. But that's not as important, because unlike lycopene, you can get vitamin C from many sources other than tomatoes.

# Sunlight for good health?

The sun helps us make vitamin D, the sunshine vitamin, which is essential for healthy teeth and bones, heart health and better immunity. Recent studies show vitamin D may help reduce risk for certain cancers.

Very little sun exposure is needed to stimulate production of vitamin D: 10-15 minutes twice a week to the face, arms, legs or back without sunscreen is usually enough. Infants and sunsensitive folks, however, need to stay out of direct sunlight.

After your sun time is up, apply a sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or more to prevent sun damage. Accumulation of sun exposure over years can accelerate visible skin aging and lead to skin cancer.

The best source of vitamin D is food: milk, soymilk, orange juice, and some ready-to-eat cereals. Vitamin D supplements are an option to discuss with your provider.

## Wisconsin ruffed grouse survey indicates stable population

MADISON - Ruffed grouse enthusiasts should expect bird encounters similar to last year, according to the recently completed roadside ruffed grouse survey. For complete survey results, search the Department of Natural Resources website, dnr.wi.gov, and search keywords "wildlife reports."

"While we did see some continued regional declines, our roadside survey index to track ruffed grouse populations is essentially unchanged from 2014," said Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources wildlife survey coordinator Brian Dhuey. "Ruffed grouse populations are known to rise and fall over a nine to 11 year cycle, and the last peak in Wisconsin's cycle occurred in 2011. Survey results suggest that we have reached the low point in the population cycle and we should start to see increases in the next few years as the grouse population moves toward the next peak."

Roadside surveys to monitor the number of breeding grouse have been conducted by staff from the department, U.S. Forest Service, tribal employees, and numerous grouse enthusiasts and volunteers since 1964. Surveys begin 30 minutes before sunrise and consist of 10 stops at assigned points. Surveyors listen for four minutes for the distinctive thumping sounds made by drumming male grouse. Surveyors monitored 88 routes this year.

While the number of drums heard per stop statewide in 2015 was similar to last year, there were some notable differences among regions. While one of the primary regions for grouse in the state, the northern region, showed a 13 percent drop in the number of drums heard per stop, the primary region in central Wisconsin showed a 38 percent increase.

Weather conditions influence drumming activity by male grouse, and most observers felt weather conditions were conducive to accurate surveys this spring. Surveyors rated the overall survey conditions as "excellent" on 65 percent of transects runs, compared to 56 percent in 2014. Surveyors rated 2015 conditions as "fair," the lowest available weather condition rating, five percent of the time in 2015, compared to 7 percent in 2014. According to DNR Upland Wildlife Ecologist Scott Walter, maturation of southern Wisconsin's forest community in recent decades and the resulting loss of dense, brushy areas that grouse need for cover has resulted in lower numbers of grouse in the region in recent decades. Results from the 2015 survey show that grouse populations in both the southwest and southeast region remain well below historic levels.

"Ruffed grouse are closely linked to young forests" said Walter. "While grouse enthusiasts often focus on numbers in a single year, the long-term health of grouse is dependent upon the availability of the dense young forest cover they require. In Wisconsin, we are working to provide the habitat needed to benefit ruffed grouse and many other wildlife species through proactive approaches to forest management that will maximize the health and diversity of forest communities."

Dan Dessecker, Director of Conservation Policy for the Ruffed Grouse Society, reminds hunters of the importance of weather in grouse population dynamics.

"While cold temperatures and deep snow are generally hard on resident wildlife populations, ruffed grouse often thrive in such winters," noted Dessecker. "This past winter saw crusted snow conditions across much of Wisconsin, and this can limit a grouse's ability to burrow into the snow where it is protected from cold temperatures and predators. On the other hand, temperatures this winter were relatively mild until late February and early March when we experienced temperatures well below zero. Snow depths don't really hamper grouse from feeding in the winter because they eat primarily buds from aspen and other trees at this time

According to Dessecker, weather conditions, especially during the brood rearing period in late May and early June, also play an important role in the fall ruffed grouse numbers. Newly-hatched grouse chicks are very sensitive to chilling, and warm, dry conditions can provide for high survival during the first few weeks of life.

"Grouse hunters are used to the cyclic nature of ruffed grouse populations, and they know that grouse can still be found in the best cover during low periods," continued Dessecker. "Hunters might have to work a bit harder to flush birds, but sunny October days with your dog in the north woods are tough to beat, and Wisconsin still has some of the best grouse hunting in the country."

### Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over' campaign runs from August 21 to September 7

Law enforcement agencies across the state will be out in force to combat drunken driving during the "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" campaign from Friday, August 21 to September 7.

"Enforcement and educational efforts to prevent drunken driving, like the Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over campaign, have helped reduce deaths from alcoholrelated crashes by approximately 51 percent and injuries by 55 percent over the last 10 years in Wisconsin," says David Pabst, director of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Bureau of Transportation Safety. To get drunken drivers off the road before they kill themselves or innocent victims, 23 impaired driving task forces have been created in Wisconsin that allow multiple agencies to coordinate and combine their resources for high-visibility enforcement efforts. Overtime for task force officers is covered by federal funding administered by the WisDOT Bureau of Transportation Safety.

Impaired driving task forces typically notify the in advance of their enforcement initiatives a deterrent to drunken driving. Roadside signage and vests on officers let the public know that intensified drunken driving enforcement is underway, according to Pabst.

"Law enforcement officers are well trained in identifying the signs of impaired driving, and they know where and when to look for drunken drivers," Pabst says. "If drivers make the irresponsible and reckless decision to get behind the wheel while impaired, officers are ready to stop, test and arrest them. Last year, there were more than 24,000 convictions for operating while intoxicated in Wisconsin. However, our goal is to get people to drive sober, not to make more arrests."

To help prevent drunken driving, WisDOT offers a free Drive Sober mobile app, which includes a find-a-ride feature that uses a smart phone's GPS to locate alternative transportation, a blood alcohol estimator, designated driver selector, and interactive games that help determine whether drivers should give up their car keys. It was launched two years ago and more than 62,000 people are current users of the app, which can be downloaded for free by visiting: www.zeroinwisc



Application forms may be sent to all homes with a notice to parents or guardians. To apply for free or reduced price meals or free milk, households must fill out the application and return it to the school (unless notified at the start of the school year that children are eligible through direct certification). Additional copies are available at the office in each school. The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by agency or other program officials. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

To obtain free or reduced price meals or free milk for children in a household where one or more household members receive FoodShare, FDPIR, or Wisconsin Works (W-2) cash benefits, list the household member and the FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2 case number, list the names of all school children, sign the application, and return it to the school office.

For the school officials to determine eligibility for free or reduced price meals or free milk of households not receiving FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2 cash benefits, the household must provide the following information requested on the application: names of all household members and the adult signing the application form must also list the last four digits of his or her Social Security Number or mark the "I do not have a Social Security Number" box. Also, the income received by each household member must be provided by amount and source (wages, welfare, child support, etc.).

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal and free milk policy, the high school secretary will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he/she may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. If the parent/guardian wishes to make a formal appeal, he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to Kay Connors, School Board Clerk, 5216 Forest Ave., Ste. A. Laona WI 54541 or call 715-674-3801 Ext. 2.

If a hearing is needed to appeal the decision, the policy contains an outline of the hearing procedure.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size changes, the family should contact the school. Such changes may make the household eligible for reduced price meals or free milk if the household income falls at or below the levels shown above, and they may reapply at that time

Children formally placed in foster care are also eligible for free meal benefits. Foster children may be certified as eligible without a household application. Households with foster children and non-foster children may choose to include the foster child as a household member, as well as any personal income available to the foster child, on the same application that includes their non-foster children.

The information provided by the household on the application is confidential.
