U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin helps grow Wisconsin's timber economy

WASHINGTON, D.C. – U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin today applauded an announcement from the United States Forest Service (USFS) that the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest is expected to meet and exceed its 2016 timber sale goal of selling at least 100 million board feet (MMBF) of timber this fiscal year. The last time the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest sold more than 100 MMBF of timber was in 2001.

This is an important step forward for Wisconsin's timber economy. This announcement comes as a result of management tools passed as part of the 2014 Farm Bill, which Senator Baldwin supported. The Farm Bill authorized the use of Good Neighbor Authority, which allows the Forest Service to enter into agreements with states to have them perform forest, rangeland and watershed restoration services on National Forest System lands. The bill also permanently authorized Stewardship Contracting, which allows the Forest Service to partner with stakeholder groups to accomplish forest management and wildlife habitat restoration projects.

"The announcement from the Forest Service confirms what I have seen on the ground – policies passed

Blue green algae found in Pine Lake

By the Forest County Health Dept.

Blue Green Algae has been identified in Pine Lake located in Hiles. Some blue-green algae can produce toxins, and since we cannot determine if a bloom is producing toxins just by looking at it, we want people to be wary of any high concentration of blue-green algae in water. If the algae are producing toxins, you could become ill if you swallow water or inhale water droplets. Small children and pets should always be kept away from water in these conditions, since they are more likely to accidentally swallow water. At lower densities, you still want to avoid swallowing water as other pathogens may be present, especially in the days following heavy rainstorms. For very young children and dogs that are likely to swallow water, you will want to err on the side of caution and choose the clearest water possible for them to swim in. It's always a good practice to wash off right after swimming to remove algae and bacteria from the skin.

If you use common-sense precautions, you can safely enjoy recreation on Wisconsin's lakes and rivers:

Choose locations without noticeably green water for swimming, because wind can concentrate blue-green algal blooms into near-shore areas. Do not swim in water that looks like "pea soup", green or blue paint, or that has a scum layer or puffy blobs floating on the surface.

Do not boat, water ski, etc. over water that looks like "pea soup", green or blue paint, or that has a scum layer or puffy blobs floating on the surface (people can be exposed through inhalation).

Do not let children play with scum layers, even from shore.

Always offer fresh, clean water for pets to drink. Do not let pets swim in, or drink, waters experiencing bluegreen algae blooms or noticeably green water.

People who need an ID to vote should get it now

With just over two months until the November 8th election, voters are encouraged not to delay in obtaining the necessary identification. Most voters already have a photo ID to vote, like a driver license or state ID card. However, people who do not have photo ID for voting can get one for free at the DMV.

DMV has developed an online application to guide ID applicants through the application process. This free online service allows them to complete and submit an application online, as well as receive a checklist of all documentation required when visiting a DMV service center. https://app.wi.gov/DLGuides/

For people who do not have all documents required to obtain a Wisconsin ID card, a petition process is available.http://wisconsindot.gov/Pages/dmv/licensedrvs/how-to-apply/petition-process.aspx

People who make use of this process are eligible to receive temporary identification card receipts that serve as a valid ID for voting. The receipts will be sent to customers within six business days of application. For those who apply during an election week, DMV will issue a photo ID receipt by overnight mail on the day that a person makes an application. However, there is no reason to wait until the last minute! People are encouraged to take time during the next two months to apply for their free ID for voting.

Wisconsin Master Gardener Volunteer available through fall months

All Nicolet Nursing graduates in class of 2016 pass national licensing exam

The graduates have indicated to Blemke they plan to seek work in the Northwoods or continue their educations to earn bachelor's and even possibly master's degrees.

Nicolet's Nursing program is well-noted for its academic rigor. "At Nicolet the focus is on preparing students as best as we possibly can for their chosen career field," Blemke explained. "A big part of this is holding them to high standards. The most recent class of Nursing graduates did a great job at meeting the challenge.'

The national exam, administered by the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing, also serves as a report card of sorts on Nicolet's Nursing faculty and the program as a whole. "It's always good to know that we are properly preparing students for careers in nursing," she added. "If a program had a low pass rate, changes would need to be made. But we know that's not the case here at Nicolet."

Always take a shower after coming into contact with any surface water (whether or not a bluegreen algae bloom appears to be present; surface waters may contain other species of potentially harmful bacteria and viruses).

Pets should be washed off immediately after swimming, before they groom.

Always avoid swallowing untreated surface water - it may contain pathogens other than blue-green algae which could make you ill.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services has provided the following guidelines concerning fish consumption:

Algal toxins have not been shown to accumulate to acutely toxic levels in the fillet.

Clean fish thoroughly and discard the viscera and guts, where toxins may accumulate.

Wash hands after handling fish caught during an algal bloom.

News from the Townsend Flowage Protection District



By Kathleen Marsh

The first annual meeting of the Townsend Flowage Protection District was held at the Townsend Town Hall on July 9. This meeting completed the transition from the all-volunteer Townsend Flowage Association (TFA) to a new Rich's wife Theresa: "Come summer I hated to hear Board of Commissioners tasked with protecting and the telephone ring because it almost always meant there preserving the waters of the Townsend Flowage.

The change was the result of several years of work by leaders of the TFA who sought a more equitable and enduring means of insuring a healthy future for the Townsend Flowage. The three newly elected commissioners are Steve Bruskiewicz, Chuck DeMoulin, and Sherman Laundrie. Wayne Deja was appointed by the Town of Townsend and John Zimdars by Oconto County. The

commission's recording secretary is Mary Lee VanVondren.

whose volunteer efforts will continue with the new governing body, was recognized by out-going TFA President Dan Coopman and the members present. A founding member of TFA, Rich has been head of the equipment maintenance crew since 1991. It was in that year Rich and his buddy Sherm Laundrie drove to Siren, Wisconsin, where the Association took ownership of two used weed harvesters and a shore conveyor, both of which are still in use.

Rich: "Our first year we spent countless hours just to get the cutters in the water. I have experience working on big equipment, and we fixed what needed fixing. I can still recall that feeling of satisfaction as we hauled away tons of aquatic vegetation to the Town disposal site using an old dump truck with questionable brakes. Little did I know, but that was just the beginning. Year after year we've had to repeat the process.'

Over the ensuing years, Rich and his crew of volunteers have spent thousands of hours fixing the equipment and harvesting vegetation that would otherwise choke off fishing/boating lanes. They also built a second shore conveyer to expedite cutting on both the northern and

Rich concurred that the amount of time and effort involved in the fight to keep the lake navigable hasn't changed that much in 25 years. "The problem has always

grants, and an annual Corn Roast fundraiser. In 2013, with harvester. Unfortunately, our Lake Ness Monster has been plagued with problems and has been in dry dock for repairs more than it has been out harvesting weeds.

That same year, TFA leaders realized change was required to preserve and protect the waterway. Dues-paying members numbered less than half of the property owners on the Flowage. The list of weed-cutting volunteers was declining, the cost of aquatic harvesting was escalating, and the fight against invasive species like Eurasian milfoil was getting more and more expensive. Severe cuts to DNR programs by the Walker administration dictated that a new course had to be taken.

A committee was formed and documents drafted to create a lake protection district. Approval from the County was obtained with a special assessment to be levied starting with tax bills sent out in December 2016. Each landowner will now pay approximately \$60 per parcel to fund necessary lake maintenance.

Both Representatives Rob Swearingen (R-Rhinelander) and Jessie Rodriguez (R-Franklin) served as chair for legislative study committees for both rural and urban school districts respectively. Representative Mary Czaja (R-Irma) served on both legislative study committees and Representative Jeff Mursau (R-Crivitz) served with Rep. Swearingen to focus on the needs of our rural school districts

"A theme that was loud and clear during our meeting is that we are all in this business for kids. Rural and urban districts actually do have a lot in common. It is vital that we all work together to make public education better," said Mike Richie, District Administrator at Northland Pines School District.

In addition to meeting with local school administrators, Representative Czaja invited representatives from UW-Stevens Point (UWSP). In attendance from UW-Stevens Point was Lisa Theo, Director of Student Creative Activity and Research and UWSP students who have agreed to research specific questions and topics that arise from future collaborative conversations.

Initial topics of discussion focused on the similar challenges in teacher recruitment and retention, student transition from high school to post-secondary preparedness, limitations in mental health resources and the implications of the current school funding formula on both rural and urban schools. Future discussions will focus on finding long-term solutions to the challenges before all Wisconsin schools in preparing students for future success.

"Opportunities for the future success of all students are before us - our collective goal as educators, policymakers and citizens should be to promote initiatives that best educate students statewide. Today's students will be the leaders, caretakers and service providers of tomorrow," said Ben Niehaus, District Administrator for the School District of Florence County.

Subsequent meetings will be hosted at both Northwood's schools and urban school districts.

- · Implement a clearinghouse for technical education curricula

The task force learned about the many barriers to student participation in technical education and training, which ranged from transportation to shortage of qualified instructors.

Crandon Post Office offers tips on being a responsible dog owner

Crandon WI — A dog might be a man's best friend, but is it a letter carrier's? With summer still in season, the warm weather invites situations when a dog can be potentially dangerous, and in recent weeks, local letter carriers have been bitten by dogs.

"That's why we need to deliver an important message about dog bite prevention," said Crandon Postmaster Jacquelyn Aszman. "Several of our letter carriers know first-hand about the prevention and the pain of animal attacks, and we want to help educate the community — especially parents and pet owners."

More than 4.5 million people are bitten annually by dogs. Last year, nearly 5,000 letter carriers were bitten by dogs across the country. At the Crandon Post Office and it's neighboring post offices, there have been two dog incidents within the last year. These numbers pale in comparison to the more than 2 million children who received dog bite injuries in a single year.

The American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) and the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) report that small children, the elderly, and letter carriers, in that order, are the most frequent victims of dog bites. Children are the majority of victims and are 900 times more likely to be bitten than letter carriers.

"Dog attacks are the most commonly reported childhood public health problem in the United States," adds Aszman. "Dog bite victims account for up to 5 percent of emergency room visits."

The following tips will help people avoid being bitten by a dog and offer advice on how to be a responsible dog owner.

How to Avoid Being Bitten

- Don't run past a dog. The dog's natural instinct is to chase and catch you. If a dog threatens you, don't scream. Avoid eye contact. Try to remain motionless until the dog leaves, and then back away slowly until the dog is out of sight.
- Don't approach a strange dog, especially one that's tethered or confined.
- While letter carriers are discouraged from petting animals, people who choose to pet dogs should always let a dog see and sniff them before petting the animal.
- If you believe a dog is about to attack you, try to place something between yourself and the dog, such as a backpack or a bicycle.

How to Be a Responsible Dog Owner

- Obedience training can teach dogs proper behavior and help owners control their dog in any
- When the letter carrier comes to your home, keep your dog inside, away from the door, in another room, or on a leash.
- Dogs can be protective of their territory and may interpret the actions of letter carriers as a threat.
- Please take precautions when accepting mail in the presence of your pet.
- Spay or neuter your dog. Neutered dogs are less likely to bite. Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) statistics reflect that dogs that have not been spayed or neutered are up to three times more likely to be involved in a biting incident than neutered or spayed dogs.
- Dogs that haven't been properly socialized, receive little attention or handling, or are left tied up for long periods of time frequently turn into biters.

in the Farm Bill are improving forest management and helping the Forest Service deliver on its management goals," said Senator Baldwin. "Our Wisconsin timber economy is facing a number of challenges and thanks to the hard work of the Forest Service, Wisconsin DNR, and many stakeholders, we are making more progress on them. That is why I was proud to champion the use of Good Neighbor Authority and Stewardship Contracting here in Wisconsin."

"Through partnerships and the use of tools such as Good Neighbor Authority and Stewardship authorized by Congress, Senator Baldwin has been fully engaged and communicating with all forest users. Taking every opportunity to safeguard forest health while ensuring the economic well-being of Wisconsin's rural communities has been a priority for Senator Baldwin," said Bill Hennigan, President of the Great Lakes Timber Professionals Association. "It's good for ecology, it's good for our social well-being and its good for the economy."

Baldwin, a long-time supporter of Wisconsin's timber economy, toured an active logging site in Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest last week to highlight the importance of Good Neighbor Authority for Wisconsin's timber economy.

As a strong supporter of Wisconsin's timber economy, Senator Baldwin championed the use of Good Neighbor Authority in Wisconsin, which was established by an agreement signed by the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest and the Wisconsin DNR in 2015. After hearing frustration from the forest products industry, Baldwin invited the head of the U.S. Forest Service, Chief Tom Tidwell, to visit Wisconsin in the fall of 2014. During that visit, forest products industry stakeholders shared their hope that the new Farm Bill tools could be put to use in Wisconsin. One year later, the Forest Service and the State of Wisconsin entered into a Good Neighbor Authority agreement. Since the Chief's visit, the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest has also entered into additional Stewardship Contracts with stakeholder groups.


