"The Homefront Radio Hour" is a staged radio broadcast. The conceit is that the audience is a "fly on the wall" in a big radio studio on August 16, 1943. The show features episodes of a soap opera, a mystery, and a family comedy. Audience members can either watch the show or close their eyes and pretend they are listening to the radio in the summer of '43.

"We picked the 1940's because of the key role radio played in that decade, with Americans not yet obsessed with television. Also, there was overwhelming love and support for our servicemen and women during World War II. We wanted to create a show that conveyed the same sincere gratitude for our vets and active service members while still just being lighthearted and fun," says director Nick Lowery. Mrs. Mary Ellen Keller serves as both costumer and musical director.

A Stranger Visits Argonne

The North Crandon Depot



I'd heard of Argonne many times before I ever actually visited in this fall of 2016. It is the town where, during the years 1923 to 1941, my father-in-law, George Meyer, grew up, and he told many a stirring tale of his early childhood here. I had, however, always assumed it was spelled Argon, like the gas, and not Argonne, like the forest. The hamlet once known as Van Zile had changed to North Crandon, and now finally, after a contest in 1921, had become Argonne, in recognition of one of the bloodiest battles of World War I. So I was quite surprised

Crandon International Raceway has new agreement with TORC Off-Road Championship Series



Capping off a record-breaking season with an eye squarely focused on the future, Crandon International Off-Road Raceway today announced a newly signed agreement with MSI and its TORC: The Off-Road Championship Series. The four-year partnership between the legendary Crandon "Big House" and the growing off-road short course series will ensure two scheduled TORC race weekends each season beginning in 2017 and extending through 2020.

Maintaining a well-established schedule that has become annual tradition, Crandon International will open its custom steel gates to welcome TORC PRO and Sportsman class racers in late June for the spring Brush Run and again in the fall for the massive Labor Day weekend Crandon Off-Road World Championships that now include the non-denominational "World Cup Sunday." The agreement also solidifies TORC's participation in Crandon's highly anticipated 50th anniversary celebration in 2019.

Crandon's purpose-built, 400-acre complex is the finest off-road short course facility in the world and has hosted the largest crowds in the sport since 1970. This legacy has recently grown thanks to a record attendance of 49,600 fans that enjoyed the track's 2016 Labor Day races including the new Crandon World Cup, part of the Red Bull Signature Series. Located two hours northwest of Green Bay, WI and just one mile outside the tiny town of Crandon (population 1,386), for the past 47 years the "Big House" has provided three generations of enthusiasts with high-intensity, dirt-throwing action and legendary performances by the sport's best drivers.



Nicolet College Visit Night, Transfer Fair November 10

Anyone thinking about attending Nicolet can learn more about the college as well as bachelor's degree completion options during College Visit Night and the Transfer Fair Thursday, November 10, on the Nicolet Campus.

Both events will run from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. in the Red Oak Center. Those attending will be able to meet with a Career Coach to map out a plan for college, complete the admissions process, and find out about financial aid and scholarships to help pay for college.

Nicolet staff and students will also be on hand to answer any questions and lead tours of the college's labs and classrooms.

"This is a great way for anyone to see what the college has to offer and experience the campus to see if Nicolet is right for them," said Nicolet Director of Enrollment Erika Warning.

For those with their eyes set on a bachelor's degree, representatives from nine colleges and universities will be on hand at the College Transfer Fair to discuss transfer options and the pathway to earning a four-year degree.

Sen. Tammy Baldwin and Reps. Gwen Moore, Ron Kind and Mark Pocan Urge U.S Department of Justice to Assist in Overseeing Wisconsin's Elections

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Today, Senator Tammy Baldwin along with Representatives Gwen Moore, Ron Kind and Mark Pocan, sent a letter to the U.S. Department of Justice requesting assistance in overseeing Wisconsin's monitoring of the election, including providing poll-monitoring services in the state. The request was spurred by Wisconsin's contentious and discriminatory Voter ID Law and a political environment that has become increasingly intimidating for voters.

"The state's 2011 voter identification law, one of the strictest in the country, has been repeatedly challenged in federal court due to its discriminatory effects on vulnerable populations' voting rights. Due to the law's contentious nature and poor implementation, coupled with a political environment that is becoming increasingly intimidating, we are requesting the Department of Justice's assistance in overseeing the state's monitoring of the election, including by providing poll-monitoring services in Wisconsin," wrote the

lawmakers. "We have continued to see how Wisconsin's voter ID law puts the franchise of many Wisconsinites, particularly people of color, in real jeopardy. Over the last month, press reports have revealed that on numerous occasions, Wisconsin Department of Motor Vehicle employees provided erroneous and incomplete information to potential voters who are unable to obtain IDs due to a lack of required documentation (like a birth certificate), despite their eligibility for alternative credentials."

In addition, they asked the U.S. Department of Justice for resources and assistance in Wisconsin, writing, "We ask the Department to provide any resources or assistance it can in order to help our state navigate these unsettling circumstances. For example, the Department has historically provided poll monitors on Election Day to help ensure that all eligible voters will be permitted to register and exercise their fundamental right to participate in our democracy. We therefore urge the Department of Justice to utilize any available election monitoring resources to ensure voters in Wisconsin are able to safely access the polls."

to discover the error under which I had been laboring all this while, as we crossed the disused railroad tracks and drove into town to trace my wife's ancestral roots.

Other discoveries were also unexpected. George, who had gone on to have a distinguished career as a dentist down in Oshkosh, spoke mostly of his humble origins. He'd describe how his dad Joe worked for the Soo Line, turning the trains around. He emphasized a family background of limited means and scarce luxuries. These were stories of hardship, of working long hours for a few dollars, but always narrated with humor and his delight in happy family times, good school friends, and close community support.

Now, however, the trains neither pass through nor turn around; trucks have replaced the railroad for hauling pulpwood; George's high school is a vacant lot, and today's kids are bussed to Crandon. In some ways it seems tough times have once again returned to Argonne. Yet the houses look comfortable, Main Street Ed's café is warm and bustling, and Ed Schultz has rescued the antique railroad boxcar-turned sleeper. People greeted me cheerfully on the street as I walked around taking the photos that took my fancy: the elegant old bank building now abandoned, or the ice cream truck on a corner lot, closed for the season but with any luck ready for next summer. What I wondered most, however, was what it was really like growing up there as a boy—both then and now?

Fortunately, I was lucky enough to be able to quiz two male residents, both in their late sixties. Quite independently they each explained that theirs was a

magical childhood. They spent all their time outdoors. In the winter there were good slopes for tobogganing on home-made sleds. There was hunting in the fall and fishing all year round—forget the walleye season. There was nothing like the thrill of a trout on the line. The creeks, streams, and lakes that once supplied wild rice to the Native Americans, now permitted swimming, canoeing, exploring, and bird watching—including the bald eagles that swooped down to check on the boys' fishing success.

Theirs was a joyous, carefree time, and I could feel it. Though slightly older than these two men, I also know what it was like to spend all one's free boyhood time outdoors, having grown up in South Africa. There, despite the pain and injustice of apartheid, white boys like me and my friends could go anywhere, without fear, phones, text-messages or any other means whereby our parents could keep track of us. Like the boys in Argonne past, we learned to be sensible—sometimes the hard way—but also to observe, to judge risk, to respect nature, and to be self-sufficient. But now, as one of my informants said, somewhat tongue in cheek, if the power went off for any length of time in Forest County, half the population would starve to death.

Today, breathing the fresh air, marveling at the fall colors, enjoying the beauty of the ponds and lakes all around, and thinking of the magnificent wild life, birds, and fish, it became clear to me that this was, and still is, a magical place of natural beauty. Sure, you can go and get an instant rush at the artificial Wilderness in the Dells, and play The Long Dark or The Forest on your Xbox. Or you can hike and explore the real wilderness of the Nicolet Forest, think of the Argonne Forest, and give thanks for living free.

Chasing your ancestors

Awhile back, Dave Lyons stopped in the Pioneer office and dropped some paper work on my desk. Dave had been doing some genealogical research on his roots. We were both distressed to find out that we shared some common ancestors, and that we are 4th cousins.

It appears that my great grandmother was a Bricco who married Joseph Monte, gave birth to my grandfather Vincent Monte, who raised my father, Richard Monte.

Dave's research revealed that my great great grandfather was Solomon Paul Bricco who was the father of my great grandmother Mary Jane Bricco Monte. The connection we have is that Solomon's sister Lizzie is



Dave's great great grandmother. She married Franklin Lyons, who is Dave's great great grandfather. This makes us 4th cousins.

Two weeks ago there was a gathering at the Laona Cemetery. Back in 1906, Franklin Lyons died and was buried in that cemetery. It must have truly been a family tragedy, because his granddaughter, Olive Marie, also passed away; Olive in April and Franklin in November of 1906. Franklin was living with his son, Oliver Lyons, and Oliver was the father of the little girl, Olive Marie.

During Dave's investigation of his heritage, he discovered this, and realized there was no stone to commemorate their final resting place. He had made many family contacts through his research, and had met Dan and Deb Olson, from Wausau, and Donna and Steve Rondorf from Waterloo, Iowa. Dan is the great grandson of Franklin and Donna is the great great granddaughter.

There was likely a wooden grave marker back in 1906, but it was long gone, so Dave and other relatives decided that they would all chip in and buy a proper marker that will last a few hundred years. People chipped in, and now Franklin and his granddaughter Olive Marie are properly marked.

Franklin Lyons was born in Quebec, Canada in 1827. Like many French people at that time, they immigrated to the U.S., and many settled at Bear Creek, Wisconsin.

Franklin was in the army during the Civil War, and they found out that he was paid to take the place of somebody with the means to escape the draft. It was allowed at that time to pay \$300 to somebody else to take your place if duty called.

The records are sketchy, but it appears that Franklin was lucky enough to work at Camp Randall during the Civil War, and did not leave Wisconsin.
