Sokaogon Housing Authority Nationally Recognized

The Sokaogon Chippewa Community Housing Authority was recognized in March as the recipient of the 2017 Community First Award by the Federal Home Loan Bank of Chicago. The award acknowledges the outstanding achievements of bank partners in local communities.

In addition, the Sokaogon Chippewa Housing Authority was also featured in an article spotlighting Native American Housing in the January/February edition of Affordable Housing Finance Magazine.

The story highlights the achievements made by the Housing Authority, and their success in tackling the complex project to alleviate the housing crisis the community faced. The article quotes Elizabeth Glynn, CEO of Travois, a Kansas City, Mo., based consulting firm focused on promoting housing and economic development for American Indian and native Alaskan and Hawaiian communities.

Travois worked with the Housing Authority on the project to convert the abandoned motel to affordable apartments. "It's a great example of how Tribes have used their resources in an innovative way," Glynn said. "It was a major renovation."

Lottery personal property tax credit still available

The Forest County Treasurer's Office is dedicating the week of May 8th to help all Real Property Owners who were eligible, receive the lottery credit on their 2016 tax bill. To qualify for the lottery and gaming credit an owner must be a Wisconsin resident, the owner of the dwelling, and use the dwelling as their primary residence as of the certification date January 1, 2016. If temporarily absent typically for a period no longer than six months (hospital, vacation, incarcerated, etc.) it is the home to which the owner returns.

Principal dwelling means any dwelling used by the owner of the dwelling as his/her primary residence. The lottery and gaming credit cannot be claimed on business property, rental units, vacant land, garages, or other property that is not the primary residence of the owner. Sec.79.10 (1) (dm), (9) (bm), Wis., Stats.





Sæni Hotline Scam Submitted by Kathy O'Melia

The U.S Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Office of Inspector General (OIG) recently announced that its hotline telephone number is being used by scammers to obtain personal information. The scammers represent themselves as hotline employees and alter the appearance of the caller ID to make it look like the call is coming from the hotline number. After obtaining personally-identifying 699-6704. information, the scammers can then steal money from bank accounts or for other fraudulent purposes.

What you need to know

The HHS OIG hotline never makes outgoing calls.

If you receive a phone call from 1-800-HHS-TIPS (1-800-447-8477), do not answer the call.

Never give personally-identifying information like your social security number, date of birth, credit card or bank account numbers, drivers' license number, or mother's maiden name to anyone over the phone.

It is still safe to call in to the hotline number to report fraud.

If you believe you have been a victim of these scammers, you should report your case to the HHS OIG 715-674-3532 (home) or 715-336-2218 (site). Meal served at Hotline 1-800-HHS-TIPS (1-800-447-8477) or spoof@oig.hhs.gov. You can also file a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission at 1-877-FTC-HELP (1-877-382-4357). Be sure to include the date and time you received the scam call.



To the Editor:

Governor Walker's 2017-2019 budget ends the Forestry Mill Tax (FMT) and instead funds forestry efforts with \$181 million it generates from General Purpose Revenue (GPR). Senate #12 Tom Tiffanv is in favor of this proposal. Why? His stance is in direct conflict with his constituents and a myriad of conservation and forestry groups. Perhaps he needs a refresher course in Wisconsin history. Since, as Tiffany displayed at the Joint Finance Committee Hearing (Marinette; April 21), he has a very short attention span, here's the quick version.

By 1924, unregulated and unscrupulous logging practices had ravaged the Northwoods and defiled its pristine waterways. It was so bad that most of northern Wisconsin resembled a moonscape. Times were tough, but Wisconsin legislators had vision. They levied a Forestry Mill Tax to raise money for repairing the devastation and putting the forests on a permanently sustainable path. FDR's Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) and Works Progress Administration (WPA) hurried the process along. Today, we are recouping a huge dividend on a very modest investment, thanks to FMT which has provided a century of stable funding for our forest resources.

Wisconsin's forests weren't created under a twoyear budget cycle, but this change could easily begin their death spiral, just as halting gas tax indexing led to rapid deterioration of our roads. Jeff Mursau (Assembly District #36) favors keeping the tax; even urban legislators like Lena Taylor support it.

Why Tom Tiffany is out cheerleading against the tax is baffling. Call him (608-266-2509) and ask him WHY?




